SECOND SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1328

- 1 AN ACT Relating to requiring registration of a school health aide;
- 2 amending RCW 18.130.040; adding a new chapter to Title 18 RCW; and
- 3 providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that there is a
- 6 diminishing supply of school nurses serving the health needs of
- 7 students in the state's school districts. The supply of nurses has not
- 8 increased in proportion to school enrollment. In addition, the
- 9 increasingly complex health needs of students can no longer be
- 10 adequately met by the delegation of nursing tasks to unlicensed and
- 11 untrained school personnel, such as teachers, teacher's assistants, and
- 12 secretarial staff, without compromising the health of students and
- 13 exposing school districts to legal liability. The delegation practices
- 14 in public school districts of complex nursing tasks are of questionable
- 15 legality and the opportunity for error has life-threatening
- 16 consequences. Removing health barriers to learning is essential to the
- 17 successful education of students, and should be addressed in the
- 18 state's public schools by recognizing established nursing practice
- 19 standards and the state's uniform professional accountability

- 1 processes. The legislature declares that the registration of school
- 2 health assistants is in the interest of public health and safety.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The definitions in this section apply 4 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 5 (1) "Commission" means the nursing care quality assurance 6 commission created in RCW 18.79.070.
 - (2) "Department" means the department of health.
- 8 (3) "School health assistant" means a person registered under this chapter who performs health care tasks overseen by a registered nurse 9 10 licensed under chapter 18.79 RCW for students in public school districts (K-12). Typical health care tasks would include visual and 11 12 auditory screening of pupils under RCW 28A.210.020, scoliosis screening under RCW 28A.210.180, administration of oral medication under RCW 13 and clean intermittent catheterization under 14 28A.210.260, RCW
- 15 28A.210.280.

- 16 (4) "Secretary" means the secretary of health.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) No certificated or classified school district employee may practice or represent himself or herself as a school health assistant by use of any title or description of services without being registered to practice by the department, unless otherwise exempted by this chapter.
- (2) Nursing tasks delegated to a school health assistant include those nursing procedures applicable to school districts provided under RCW 28A.210.020, 28A.210.180, 28A.210.260, and 28A.210.280.
- 25 (3) Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the scope 26 of nursing procedures applicable to school districts as provided by 27 law.
- (4) School health assistants may not be subject to any employer reprisal or disciplinary action by the secretary for refusing to accept the delegation of a nursing task based on patient safety issues, except in an emergent life-threatening situation.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit or restrict:
- 34 (1) The practice by an individual licensed, certified, or 35 registered under the laws of this state and performing services within 36 the authorized scope of practice;

- 1 (2) The practice by an individual employed by the government of the 2 United States while engaged in the performance of duties prescribed by 3 the laws of the United States; or
- 4 (3) The practice by a person who is a regular student in an 5 educational program approved by the secretary, and whose performance of 6 services is pursuant to a regular course of instruction or assignments 7 from an instructor and under the general supervision of the instructor.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** In addition to any other authority provided 9 by law, the secretary has the authority to:
- 10 (1) Adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW necessary to implement this 11 chapter;
- 12 (2) Establish all registration and renewal fees in accordance with 13 RCW 43.70.250;
- 14 (3) Establish forms and procedures necessary to administer this 15 chapter;
- (4) Register any applicants, and deny registration to applicants who do not meet the minimum qualifications, except that proceedings concerning the denial of registration based upon unprofessional conduct or impairment shall be governed by the uniform disciplinary act, chapter 18.130 RCW;
- 21 (5) Hire clerical, administrative, investigative, and other staff 22 as needed to implement this chapter; and
- 23 (6) Maintain the official department record of all applicants and 24 persons registered under this chapter.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. The secretary shall keep an official record of all proceedings. A part of the record shall consist of a register of all applicants for registration under this chapter and the results of each application.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. The secretary shall issue a registration to any applicant who completes an application that identifies the name and address of the applicant, the registration being requested, and information required by the secretary necessary to establish whether there are grounds for denial of a registration or issuance of a conditional registration under chapter 18.130 RCW.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** Applications for registration as a school
- 2 health assistant shall be submitted on forms provided by the secretary.
- 3 The secretary may require any information and documentation that
- 4 reasonably relates to the need to determine whether the applicant meets
- 5 the criteria for registration provided for in this chapter and chapter
- 6 18.130 RCW. Each applicant shall pay a fee determined by the secretary
- 7 under RCW 43.70.250. The fee shall accompany the application.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** The secretary shall establish by rule the
- 9 procedural requirements and fees for renewal of a registration.
- 10 Failure to renew shall invalidate the registration and all privileges
- 11 granted by the registration.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** The uniform disciplinary act, chapter
- 13 18.130 RCW, governs the issuance and denial of registrations,
- 14 unauthorized practice, and the discipline of persons registered under
- 15 this chapter. The secretary is the disciplining authority under this
- 16 chapter.
- 17 **Sec. 11.** RCW 18.130.040 and 2001 c 251 s 27 are each amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 (1) This chapter applies only to the secretary and the boards and
- 20 commissions having jurisdiction in relation to the professions licensed
- 21 under the chapters specified in this section. This chapter does not
- 22 apply to any business or profession not licensed under the chapters
- 23 specified in this section.
- 24 (2)(a) The secretary has authority under this chapter in relation
- 25 to the following professions:

- 28 (b) The boards and commissions having authority under this chapter

- 6 (viii) The board of pharmacy as established in chapter 18.64 RCW 7 governing licenses issued under chapters 18.64 and 18.64A RCW;
- 8 (ix) The medical quality assurance commission as established in 9 chapter 18.71 RCW governing licenses and registrations issued under 10 chapters 18.71 and 18.71A RCW;
- 11 (x) The board of physical therapy as established in chapter 18.74 12 RCW;
- 13 (xi) The board of occupational therapy practice as established in 14 chapter 18.59 RCW;
- 15 (xii) The nursing care quality assurance commission as established 16 in chapter 18.79 RCW governing licenses issued under that chapter;
- 17 (xiii) The examining board of psychology and its disciplinary 18 committee as established in chapter 18.83 RCW; and
- 19 (xiv) The veterinary board of governors as established in chapter 20 18.92 RCW.
- (3) In addition to the authority to discipline license holders, the 21 disciplining authority has the authority to grant or deny licenses 22 based on the conditions and criteria established in this chapter and 23 24 the chapters specified in subsection (2) of this section. This chapter 25 also governs any investigation, hearing, or proceeding relating to 26 denial of licensure or issuance of a license conditioned on the 27 applicant's compliance with an order entered pursuant to RCW 18.130.160 by the disciplining authority. 28
- (4) All disciplining authorities shall adopt procedures to ensure substantially consistent application of this chapter, the Uniform Disciplinary Act, among the disciplining authorities listed in subsection (2) of this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 12. This act takes effect July 1, 2004.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 13. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
