SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1659

- AN ACT Relating to establishing a pilot project to provide community-based services through a public-private based partnership for persons with developmental disabilities; creating new sections; and
- 4 making appropriations.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds that:
- 7 (a) The United States department of health and human services,
- 8 which administers medicaid funding, has announced that one of its goals
- 9 is to integrate people with developmental disabilities into the social
- 10 mainstream, with equal opportunities and the chance to make choices.
- 11 (b) The health care financing administration is urging states to
- 12 develop plans that strengthen support systems and to actively involve
- 13 people with disabilities and their families in the design, development,
- 14 and implementation of these plans.
- 15 (c) The Washington state division of developmental disabilities
- 16 strategies for the future stakeholder work group, as directed by the
- 17 legislature under RCW 71A.12.180, developed recommendations for
- 18 restructuring the delivery system to create one that is based on an
- 19 individual choice and self-determination service delivery philosophy.

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- 1 (d) There are presently over five thousand persons in the state of 2 Washington with developmental disabilities who are in need of housing, 3 including residential placement services.
- 4 (e) Many families of developmentally disabled persons are in need of additional services in the areas of residential support, community relationships, peer development, job training, and other ancillary activities to improve the quality of life and service, and these needs cannot be met under current budgetary allocations. These families are not only asking for assistance, they are also asking to be an integral part of the planning process that affects their loved ones.
- 11 (2) It is the intent of the legislature to authorize the secretary 12 of social and health services to develop and coordinate a pilot project 13 to expand service options and support services to persons with 14 developmental disabilities and to serve as a model of private and 15 public funding coming together to offer individualized options to 16 individuals and families who desire to be partners in developing 17 supports.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The secretary of social and health services shall develop and coordinate a pilot project under which the department contracts with an agency provider to administer funds necessary for supports and services, including residential placement, for twenty eligible persons with developmental disabilities. The purpose of the pilot project is to:
- (a) Provide services for persons with developmental disabilities through a special public-private partnership that is based on the principles of self-directed/person-centered supports and that uses public and private dollars as the funding source;
- (b) In cooperation with providers, establish and develop services for persons with developmental disabilities through regionally administered programs;
- 31 (c) Augment the limited resources of the state to provide a 32 stable, secure, and more encompassing provision of services and 33 supports;
- 34 (d) Expand service options to people with developmental 35 disabilities; and
- (e) Demonstrate a person-centered, community-based, individuallybudgeted model for developing and delivering service and support.

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- (2)(a) The pilot project must be based on a service delivery model 1 that is designed and administered according to the needs of the 2 3 individuals. All individuals to be served must meet the criteria for 4 services established by the division of developmental disabilities and 5 must be assessed using a person-centered planning process. project shall provide services to eligible persons with developmental 6 7 The eligible persons shall be representative of the disabilities. 8 spectrum of service needs found amongst persons with developmental 9 disabilities. All persons who meet the division of developmental disabilities criteria for service must be considered regardless of 10 disability, age, race, religious affiliation, gender, socioeconomic 11 status, or marital status. 12
- 13 (b) Based on the person-centered assessment and service planning 14 process, each participant is to be provided the residential option 15 necessary to meet his or her individual needs.
- (c) Individuals participating in the pilot project shall receive only those services that they need and want. In accordance with each individual plan, participants shall choose providers to meet their individual service needs. Services to be provided include, but are not limited to, any or all of the following:
- 21 (i) Health and medical care;
- 22 (ii) Transportation;
- 23 (iii) Personal hygiene;
- 24 (iv) Meal planning and preparation;
- 25 (v) Housekeeping;
- 26 (vi) Budgeting and personal finance;
- 27 (vii) Home maintenance;
- 28 (viii) Supported employment supports;
- 29 (ix) Recreation and leisure planning;
- 30 (x) Community access and involvement;
- 31 (xi) Self-advocacy; and
- 32 (xii) Family support.
- 33 (3) The department of social and health services shall measure and 34 monitor the quality of service provided under the pilot project.
- 35 Quality of service must be in compliance with state and federal law.
- 36 (4) The department shall evaluate the pilot project and make an 37 initial report of its findings and conclusions to the legislature by 38 December 1, 2002, and a final report by December 1, 2003.

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NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) The sum of three hundred sixty thousand dollars from the state general fund and the sum of three hundred sixty-eight thousand dollars in federal funds, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, to the department of social and health services to establish a pilot project as provided in section 2 of this act in Region V.

(2) The sum of five hundred seventeen thousand dollars from the state general fund and the sum of five hundred twenty-five thousand dollars in federal funds, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, to the department of social and health services to establish a pilot project as provided in section 2 of this act in Region V.

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
