- 1 AN ACT Relating to technology in schools; and amending RCW
- 2 28A.150.260.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.150.260 and 1997 c 13 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- The basic education allocation for each annual average full time equivalent student shall be determined in accordance with the following procedures:
- 9 (1) The governor shall and the superintendent of public instruction 10 may recommend to the legislature a formula based on a ratio of students 11 to staff for the distribution of a basic education allocation for each 12 annual average full time equivalent student enrolled in a common 13 school. The distribution formula shall have the primary objective of

- 14 equalizing educational opportunities and shall provide appropriate
- 15 recognition of the following costs among the various districts within
- 16 the state:
- 17 (a) Certificated instructional staff and their related costs;
- (b) Certificated administrative staff and their related costs;

- 1 (d) Nonsalary costs, including those costs associated with 2 administrative technology;
- 3 (e) Extraordinary costs of remote and necessary schools and small 4 high schools, including costs of additional certificated and classified 5 staff; ((and))
- 6 (f) The costs of educational technology as part of the 7 instructional program; and
- 8 (g) The attendance of students pursuant to RCW 28A.335.160 and 9 28A.225.250 who do not reside within the servicing school district.
- 10 (2)(a) This formula for distribution of basic education funds shall be reviewed biennially by the superintendent and governor. 11 recommended formula shall be subject to approval, amendment or 12 13 rejection by the legislature. The formula shall be for allocation purposes only with the exception of those funds distributed for 14 educational technology. The funding formula adopted by the legislature 15 shall not mandate the nature or type of educational technology 16 purchased by school districts, but the funds shall be used solely for 17 this purpose. While the legislature intends that the allocations for 18 19 additional instructional staff be used to increase the ratio of such 20 staff to students, nothing in this section shall require districts to reduce the number of administrative staff below existing levels. 21
 - (b) The formula adopted by the legislature shall reflect the following ratios at a minimum: (i) Forty-nine certificated instructional staff to one thousand annual average full time equivalent students enrolled in grades kindergarten through three; (ii) forty-six certificated instructional staff to one thousand annual average full time equivalent students in grades four through twelve; (iii) four certificated administrative staff to one thousand annual average full time equivalent students in grades kindergarten through twelve; and (iv) sixteen and sixty-seven one-hundredths classified personnel to one thousand annual average full time equivalent students enrolled in grades kindergarten through twelve.
 - (c) In the event the legislature rejects the distribution formula recommended by the governor, without adopting a new distribution formula, the distribution formula for the previous school year shall remain in effect: PROVIDED, That the distribution formula developed pursuant to this section shall be for state apportionment and equalization purposes only and shall not be construed as mandating specific operational functions of local school districts other than

those program requirements identified in RCW 28A.150.220 1 28A.150.100. The enrollment of any district shall be the annual 2 average number of full time equivalent students and part time students 3 4 as provided in RCW 28A.150.350, enrolled on the first school day of each month and shall exclude full time equivalent students with 5 disabilities recognized for the purposes of allocation of state funds 6 for programs under RCW 28A.155.010 through 28A.155.100. The definition 7 8 of full time equivalent student shall be determined by rules of the 9 superintendent of public instruction: PROVIDED, That the definition 10 shall be included as part of the superintendent's biennial budget PROVIDED, FURTHER, That any revision of the present 11 request: definition shall not take effect until approved by the house 12 appropriations committee and the senate ways and means committee: 13 14 PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the office of financial management shall make 15 a monthly review of the superintendent's reported full time equivalent students in the common schools in conjunction with RCW 43.62.050. 16

(3)(a) Certificated instructional staff shall include those persons employed by a school district who are nonsupervisory employees within the meaning of RCW 41.59.020(8): PROVIDED, That in exceptional cases, people of unusual competence but without certification may teach students so long as a certificated person exercises general supervision: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the hiring of such classified people shall not occur during a labor dispute and such classified people shall not be hired to replace certificated employees during a labor dispute.

(b) Certificated administrative staff shall include all those persons who are chief executive officers, chief administrative officers, confidential employees, supervisors, principals, or assistant principals within the meaning of RCW 41.59.020(4).
