1 AN ACT Relating to a record check of the parks and recreation
2 commission's job applicants, volunteers, and independent contractors;
3 and amending RCW 79A.05.035.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 79A.05.035 and 1999 c 249 s 303 are each amended to
6 read as follows:

7 (1) The commission shall:

8 (a) Manage timber and land under its jurisdiction to maintain and
9 enhance aesthetic and recreational values;

10 (b) Apply modern conservation practices to maintain and enhance
11 aesthetic, recreational, and ecological resources; and

12 (c) Designate and preserve certain forest areas throughout the
13 state as natural forests or natural areas for interpretation, study,
14 and preservation purposes.

15 (2) Trees may be removed from state parks:

16 (a) When hazardous to persons, property, or facilities;

17 (b) As part of a park maintenance or development project, or
18 conservation practice;

19 (c) As part of a road or utility easement; or

1 (d) When damaged by a catastrophic forest event.

2 (3) Tree removal under subsection (2) of this section shall be done
3 by commission personnel, unless the personnel lack necessary expertise.
4 Except in emergencies and when feasible, significant trees shall be
5 removed only after they have been marked or appraised by a professional
6 forester. The removal of significant trees from a natural forest may
7 take place only after a public hearing has been held, except in
8 emergencies.

9 (4) When feasible, felled timber shall be left on the ground for
10 natural purposes or used for park purposes including, but not limited
11 to, building projects, trail mulching, and firewood. In natural forest
12 areas, first consideration shall be given to leaving timber on the
13 ground for natural purposes.

14 (5) The commission may issue permits to individuals under RCW
15 4.24.210 and 79A.05.090 for the removal of wood debris from state parks
16 for personal firewood use.

17 (6) Only timber that qualifies for cutting or removal under
18 subsection (2) of this section may be sold. Timber shall be sold only
19 when surplus to the needs of the park.

20 (7) Net revenue derived from timber sales shall be deposited in the
21 state parks renewal and stewardship account created in RCW 79A.05.215.

22 (8) The commission shall adopt rules that require a record check
23 and fingerprinting of job applicants, volunteers, and independent
24 contractors who will work with children or vulnerable adults, or who
25 will be responsible for collecting or disbursing cash or processing
26 credit card transactions, through the Washington state patrol criminal
27 identification system and through the federal bureau of investigation.
28 The commission may charge prospective job applicants, volunteers, and
29 independent contractors for the costs of conducting the record check
30 and fingerprinting. The commission shall require the destruction of
31 any fingerprints, copies of fingerprints, or their facsimiles after the
32 screening of the job applicant, volunteer, or independent contractor
33 has been completed. A permanent employee of the commission, employed
34 as of the effective date of this section, is exempt from the provisions
35 of this subsection.

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
