1 AN ACT Relating to fire districts' options for issuing warrants;
2 and amending RCW 52.16.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 52.16.050 and 1998 c 5 s 1 are each amended to read as
5 follows:

6 (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) and (3) of this section,
7 the county treasurer (~~shall~~) may pay out money received for the
8 account of the district on warrants issued by the county auditor
9 against the proper funds of the district. The warrants shall be issued
10 on vouchers approved and signed by a majority of the district board and
11 by the district secretary.

12 (2) The board of fire commissioners of a district that had an
13 annual operating budget of five million or more dollars in each of the
14 preceding three years may by resolution adopt a policy to issue its own
15 warrants for payment of claims or other obligations of the fire
16 district. The board of fire commissioners, after auditing all payrolls
17 and bills, may authorize the issuing of one general certificate to the
18 county treasurer, to be signed by the chair of the board of fire
19 commissioners, authorizing the county treasurer to pay all the warrants

1 specified by date, number, name, and amount, and the accounting funds
2 on which the warrants shall be drawn; thereupon the district secretary
3 may issue the warrants specified in the general certificate.

4 (3) The board of fire commissioners of a district that had an
5 annual operating budget of under five million dollars in each of the
6 preceding three years may upon agreement between the county treasurer
7 and the fire district commission, with approval of the fire district
8 commission by resolution, adopt a policy to issue its own warrants for
9 payment of claims or other obligations of the fire district. The board
10 of fire commissioners, after auditing all payrolls and bills, may
11 authorize the issuing of one general certificate to the county
12 treasurer, to be signed by the chair of the board of fire
13 commissioners, authorizing the county treasurer to pay all the warrants
14 specified by date, number, name, and amount, and the accounting funds
15 on which the warrants shall be drawn. The district secretary may then
16 issue the warrants specified in the general certificate.

17 (4) The county treasurer may also pay general obligation bonds and
18 the accrued interest thereon in accordance with their terms from the
19 general obligation bond fund when interest or principal payments become
20 due. The county treasurer shall report in writing monthly to the
21 secretary of the district the amount of money held by the county in
22 each fund and the amounts of receipts and disbursements for each fund
23 during the preceding month.

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
