- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) All powers, duties, and functions of the state fish and wildlife commission are transferred to the legislative
- fish and wildlife committee. All references to the state fish and
- wildlife commission in the Revised Code of Washington shall be 8
- construed to mean the legislative fish and wildlife committee when 9
- 10 referring to the functions transferred in this section.
- (2)(a) All reports, documents, surveys, books, records, files, 11
- papers, or written material in the possession of the state fish and 12
- 13 wildlife commission pertaining to the powers, functions, and duties
- 14 transferred shall be delivered to the custody of the legislative fish
- 15 and wildlife committee. All cabinets, furniture, office equipment,
- motor vehicles, and other tangible property employed by the state fish 16
- 17 and wildlife commission in carrying out the powers, functions, and
- duties transferred shall be made available to the legislative fish and 18
- All funds, credits, or other assets held in 19 wildlife committee.

- (c) Whenever any question arises as to the transfer of any personnel, funds, books, documents, records, papers, files, equipment, or other tangible property used or held in the exercise of the powers and the performance of the duties and functions transferred, the director of financial management shall make a determination as to the proper allocation and certify the same to the state agencies concerned.
- (3) All rules and all pending business before the state fish and 14 15 wildlife commission pertaining to the powers, functions, and duties 16 transferred shall be continued and acted upon by the legislative fish and wildlife committee. All existing contracts and obligations shall 17 remain in full force and shall be performed by the legislative fish and 18 19 wildlife committee.
- (4) The transfer of the powers, duties, functions, and personnel of 20 the state fish and wildlife commission shall not affect the validity of 21 any act performed before the effective date of this section. 22
- (5) If apportionments of budgeted funds are required because of the transfers directed by this section, the director of financial management shall certify the apportionments to the agencies affected, the state auditor, and the state treasurer. Each of these shall make 26 the appropriate transfer and adjustments in funds and appropriation accounts and equipment records in accordance with the certification.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The legislative fish and wildlife committee 30 is created. The committee consists of six senators to be appointed by the president of the senate and six members of the house of 31 representatives to be appointed by the speaker of the house of 32 33 representatives. Not more than three members from the senate or the 34 house of representatives may be from the same political party. A list of appointees must be submitted before the close of each regular 35 36 legislative session during an odd-numbered year or any successive special session convened by the governor or the legislature prior to 37 the close of the regular session or a successive special session for 38

- 1 confirmation of senate members, by the senate, and house of
- 2 representative members, by the house of representatives. Vacancies
- 3 occurring must be filled by the appointing authority. All vacancies
- 4 must be filled from the same political party and from the same chamber
- 5 as the member whose seat was vacated. The committee must adopt rules
- 6 and procedures for its orderly operation.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The committee must:

- 8 (1) Adopt rules and establish direction for implementing 9 legislative policy for fish and wildlife species;
- 10 (2) Monitor the department's implementation of the goals, policies, 11 and objectives established by the committee;
- 12 (3) Classify wildlife and adopt rules governing the time, place, 13 manner, and methods used to harvest or enjoy fish and wildlife;
- 14 (4) Handle all general administrative and personnel duties related 15 to the committee;
- 16 (5) Determine the number of committee staff needed to fulfill the 17 duties of the committee;
- 18 (6) Establish policies for committee staff;
- 19 (7) Adopt an interim work plan and meeting schedule; and
- 20 (8) Approve all contracts signed on behalf of the committee.

Sec. 4. The fish and wildlife citizen advisory 21 NEW SECTION. 22 council is created, and is composed of nine members appointed by the 23 governor. Persons eligible for appointment as members of the fish and wildlife citizens advisory council must have general knowledge of the 24 habits and distribution of fish and wildlife and may not hold another 25 state, county, or municipal elective or appointive office. 26 27 governor must appoint the members of the fish and wildlife citizens 28 advisory council with the advice and consent of the senate. In making 29 these appointments, the governor must seek to maintain a balance reflecting all aspects of fish and wildlife, including representation 30 31 recommended by organized groups representing sportfishers, commercial 32 fishers, hunters, private landowners, and environmentalists. members of the fish and wildlife citizens advisory council must be 33 residents of that portion of the state lying east of the summit of the 34 35 Cascade mountains, and three members must be residents of that portion of the state lying west of the summit of the Cascade mountains. Three 36 37 additional members of the fish and wildlife citizens advisory council

- 1 are appointed at-large. No two members may be residents of the same
- 2 county. Members of the fish and wildlife citizens advisory council
- 3 serve four-year terms. Of the initial members appointed to the
- 4 council, three members serve two-year terms, three members serve three-
- 5 year terms, and three members serve four-year terms. Thereafter,
- 6 members of the council are appointed to four-year terms. Vacancies to
- 7 the fish and wildlife citizens advisory council must be filled by
- 8 appointment in the same manner as the original appointment for the
- 9 remainder of the unexpired term of the position being vacated. Members
- 10 must be reimbursed for travel expenses as provided in RCW 43.03.050 and
- 11 43.03.060.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** (1) The fish and wildlife citizen advisory
- 13 council is authorized and directed to ascertain, study, and analyze all
- 14 available facts and matters relating or pertaining to:
- 15 (a) Wildlife, fish, and shellfish in the state;
- 16 (b) Preservation, protection, and management of wildlife, food
- 17 fish, game fish, and shellfish in the waters of the state and offshore
- 18 water;
- 19 (c) Conserving the wildlife, food fish, game fish, and shellfish
- 20 resources in a manner that does not impair the resource;
- 21 (d) The department's mandate to maintain the economic well-being
- 22 and stability of the state's fishing industry;
- 23 (e) The department's actions to promote orderly fisheries in the
- 24 state, and to enhance and improve recreational and commercial fishing
- 25 in the state;
- 26 (f) The taking of wildlife, food fish, game fish, and shellfish in
- 27 the state as authorized by the committee;
- 28 (g) The committee's efforts to maximize the public recreational
- 29 game fishing and hunting opportunities of all citizens, including
- 30 juveniles, disabled persons, and senior citizens;
- 31 (h) The department's work with volunteer groups and individuals to
- 32 achieve the goals expressed in Title 77 RCW; and
- 33 (i) Bills assigned to the natural resources committees in the
- 34 senate and the house of representatives.
- 35 (2) The fish and wildlife citizens advisory council is authorized
- 36 to ascertain, study, and analyze all available facts and matters
- 37 relating or pertaining to sources of revenue, appropriations,
- 38 expenditures, and the financial condition of the state wildlife fund
