- 1 AN ACT Relating to abuse or neglect of children; and amending RCW
- 2 26.44.020 and 26.44.015.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 26.44.020 and 2000 c 162 s 19 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter 7 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 8 (1) "Court" means the superior court of the state of Washington, 9 juvenile department.
- 10 (2) "Law enforcement agency" means the police department, the 11 prosecuting attorney, the state patrol, the director of public safety, 12 or the office of the sheriff.
- (3) "Practitioner of the healing arts" or "practitioner" means a person licensed by this state to practice podiatric medicine and surgery, optometry, chiropractic, nursing, dentistry, osteopathic medicine and surgery, or medicine and surgery or to provide other health services. The term "practitioner" includes a duly accredited Christian Science practitioner: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That a person who

- 1 Christian Science practitioner will not be considered, for that reason 2 alone, a neglected person for the purposes of this chapter.
- 3 (4) "Institution" means a private or public hospital or any other 4 facility providing medical diagnosis, treatment or care.
- 5 (5) "Department" means the state department of social and health 6 services.
- 7 (6) "Child" or "children" means any person under the age of 8 eighteen years of age.
- 9 (7) "Professional school personnel" include, but are not limited 10 to, teachers, counselors, administrators, child care facility 11 personnel, and school nurses.
- 12 (8) "Social service counselor" means anyone engaged in a 13 professional capacity during the regular course of employment in 14 encouraging or promoting the health, welfare, support or education of 15 children, or providing social services to adults or families, including 16 mental health, drug and alcohol treatment, and domestic violence 17 programs, whether in an individual capacity, or as an employee or agent 18 of any public or private organization or institution.
- 19 (9) "Psychologist" means any person licensed to practice psychology 20 under chapter 18.83 RCW, whether acting in an individual capacity or as 21 an employee or agent of any public or private organization or 22 institution.
- (10) "Pharmacist" means any registered pharmacist under chapter 18.64 RCW, whether acting in an individual capacity or as an employee or agent of any public or private organization or institution.
- (11) "Clergy" means any regularly licensed or ordained minister, priest, or rabbi of any church or religious denomination, whether acting in an individual capacity or as an employee or agent of any public or private organization or institution.
- 30 (12) "Abuse or neglect" means the injury, sexual abuse, or sexual exploitation((, negligent treatment, or maltreatment)) of a child by 31 any person under circumstances which indicate that the child's health, 32 33 welfare, ((and)) <u>or</u> safety is harmed, excluding conduct permitted under RCW 9A.16.100 , or the negligent treatment or maltreatment of a child 34 35 by a person legally responsible for or providing care to the child under circumstances which indicate that the child's health, welfare, or 36 37 safety is harmed or is at substantial risk of harm. An abused child is a child who has been subjected to child abuse or neglect as defined in 38 39 this section.

- 1 (13) "Child protective services section" means the child protective 2 services section of the department.
- 3 (14) "Sexual exploitation" includes: (a) Allowing, permitting, or 4 encouraging a child to engage in prostitution by any person; or (b) 5 allowing, permitting, encouraging, or engaging in the obscene or 6 pornographic photographing, filming, or depicting of a child by any 7 person.
- 8 (15) "Negligent treatment or maltreatment" means an act or omission 9 that evidences a serious disregard of consequences of such magnitude as 10 to constitute a clear and present danger to the child's health, 11 welfare, ((and)) or safety. The fact that siblings share a bedroom is 12 not, in and of itself, negligent treatment or maltreatment.
- (16) "Child protective services" means those services provided by 13 14 the department designed to protect children from child abuse and 15 neglect and safeguard such children from future abuse and neglect, and 16 investigations of child abuse and neglect 17 Investigations may be conducted regardless of the location of the alleged abuse or neglect. Child protective services includes referral 18 19 to services to ameliorate conditions that endanger the welfare of children, the coordination of necessary programs and services relevant 20 to the prevention, intervention, and treatment of child abuse and 21 22 neglect, and services to children to ensure that each child has a permanent home. In determining whether protective services should be 23 24 provided, the department shall not decline to provide such services 25 solely because of the child's unwillingness or developmental inability 26 to describe the nature and severity of the abuse or neglect.
- (17) "Malice" or "maliciously" means an evil intent, wish, or design to vex, annoy, or injure another person. Such malice may be inferred from an act done in willful disregard of the rights of another, or an act wrongfully done without just cause or excuse, or an act or omission of duty betraying a willful disregard of social duty.
- 32 (18) "Sexually aggressive youth" means a child who is defined in 33 RCW 74.13.075(1)(b) as being a sexually aggressive youth.
- (19) "Unfounded" means available information indicates that, more likely than not, child abuse or neglect did not occur. No unfounded allegation of child abuse or neglect may be disclosed to a child-placing agency, private adoption agency, or any other provider licensed under chapter 74.15 RCW.

- 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 26.44.015 and 1999 c 176 s 28 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 (1) This chapter shall not be construed to authorize interference 4 with child-raising practices, including reasonable parental discipline, 5 which are not injurious to the child's health, welfare, and safety.
- 6 (2) Nothing in this chapter may be used to prohibit the reasonable 7 use of corporal punishment as a means of discipline.
- 8 (3) No parent or guardian may be deemed abusive or neglectful 9 solely by reason of the parent's or child's blindness, deafness, 10 developmental disability, or other handicap.
- (4) No parent or guardian may be deemed abusive or neglectful when the alleged abuse or neglect results primarily from the financial inability of the parent or guardian, and no services for relief have been offered to or rejected by the parent or guardian.
