1 AN ACT Relating to the authority to issue civil penalties by health
2 districts; amending RCW 70.05.060; and prescribing penalties.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.05.060 and 1991 c 3 s 308 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 Each local board of health shall have supervision over all matters
7 pertaining to the preservation of the life and health of the people
8 within its jurisdiction and shall:

9 (1) Enforce through the local health officer or the administrative
10 officer appointed under RCW 70.05.040, if any, the public health
11 statutes of the state and rules promulgated by the state board of
12 health and the secretary of health;

13 (2) Supervise the maintenance of all health and sanitary measures
14 for the protection of the public health within its jurisdiction;

15 (3) Enact such local rules and regulations as are necessary in
16 order to preserve, promote and improve the public health and provide
17 for the enforcement thereof, including, but not limited to, assessing
18 a civil penalty for violation of a public health statute, rule, or

1 regulation relating to environmental health, not to exceed one hundred
2 dollars per day;

3 (4) Provide for the control and prevention of any dangerous,
4 contagious or infectious disease within the jurisdiction of the local
5 health department;

6 (5) Provide for the prevention, control and abatement of nuisances
7 detrimental to the public health;

8 (6) Make such reports to the state board of health through the
9 local health officer or the administrative officer as the state board
10 of health may require; and

11 (7) Establish fee schedules for issuing or renewing licenses or
12 permits or for such other services as are authorized by the law and the
13 rules of the state board of health: PROVIDED, That such fees for
14 services shall not exceed the actual cost of providing any such
15 services.

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
