1 AN ACT Relating to a review of the current role of branch campuses
2 in comparison with their original mission and an analysis of their
3 future role by the Washington state institute for public policy; and
4 creating a new section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** Branch campuses were first established in
7 1989, in response to the need to expand access to upper-division and
8 master's level degree programs for students living in major urban areas
9 of the state. Since the establishment of branch campuses no
10 comprehensive assessment has been made of the effectiveness of the
11 campuses in fulfilling their mission of instruction, scholarship, and
12 services, in addition to meeting enrollment and other legislatively
13 mandated goals. A review of branch campuses should be conducted to
14 determine if the original intent of branch campuses is being met. It
15 is also necessary to determine if the original goals are compatible
16 with current educational needs and whether the branch campus system has
17 the flexibility and capacity to respond adequately to future needs in
18 higher education.

1 The Washington state institute for public policy shall review and
2 evaluate the following: (1) The original mission for branch campuses;
3 (2) the extent to which branch campuses are meeting their original
4 mission; (3) the original mission of branch campuses in relation to
5 current needs in higher education; and (4) what policy or procedural
6 options could be implemented to allow branch campuses to respond more
7 effectively to demographic changes in student populations and other
8 dynamic market forces in higher education statewide, and the unique
9 educational needs in their respective communities.

10 The Washington state institute for public policy shall submit a
11 draft report to the appropriate legislative committees by September 1,
12 2002, with the final report to be submitted by December 12, 2002.
