SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2853

- 1 AN ACT Relating to emergencies involving critical infrastructure
- 2 arising from terrorist acts; adding new sections to chapter 38.52 RCW;
- 3 creating a new section; and providing an expiration date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** After the tragic events of September 11,
- 6 2001, the legislature recognizes that the state's and the region's
- 7 security, economic prosperity, and social well-being depend on the
- 8 reliable functioning of increasingly complex infrastructures. The
- 9 legislature further recognizes that it is the government's
- 10 responsibility to participate in and facilitate the development of a
- 11 regional approach to protecting this state's and the region's critical
- 12 infrastructures. Because of mutual dependence and the increasing
- 13 interconnectedness of infrastructures for energy systems, water
- 14 systems, transportation systems, and communications systems, these
- 15 infrastructures may be vulnerable in ways not yet recognized. Many of
- 16 these facilities are privately owned and operated. In developing a
- 17 coordinated regional approach to protecting critical infrastructures,
- 18 it is important to include a broad set of viewpoints and expertise from
- 19 both the public and private sector.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 38.52 RCW to read as follows:
- 3 (1) The military department shall develop a plan for the 4 identification, assessment, and prioritization of protection for
- 5 infrastructure that is critical to state and regional economic
- 6 stability and security. This plan shall be developed by the military
- 7 department with participation as needed from the emergency management
- 8 council and its subcommittees and from the department of community,
- 9 trade, and economic development, department of information systems,
- 10 Washington state patrol, department of transportation, utilities and
- 11 transportation commission, department of health, department of ecology,
- 12 and any other agencies the military department deems necessary for plan
- 13 development.
- 14 (2) In developing the plan required by this section, the military
- 15 department shall study, evaluate, and make recommendations on methods
- 16 to:
- 17 (a) Identify the appropriate types of infrastructure to be
- 18 considered critical to state and regional economic stability and
- 19 security;
- 20 (b) Identify the types of information needed and the public and
- 21 private sector sources of information essential to identifying
- 22 infrastructures critical to economic stability and security;
- 23 (c) Assess the vulnerability of the various critical
- 24 infrastructures identified; and
- 25 (d) Prioritize those infrastructures most in need of protection.
- 26 (3) The council shall submit the plan required by this section to
- 27 the governor and the appropriate committees of the legislature no later
- 28 than December 1, 2002.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 38.52 RCW
- 30 to read as follows:
- 31 Within its existing resources and to the extent practicable, the
- 32 military department and other state agencies identified in section 2(1)
- 33 of this act shall participate in any efforts by public or private
- 34 sector interests to develop regional plans for management and
- 35 restoration of critical functions. Participation may require
- 36 coordination with other states, federal agencies, and neighboring
- 37 nations.
