- 1 AN ACT Relating to authorizing retirement incentive programs;
- 2 amending RCW 41.32.480, 41.32.765, 41.32.875, 41.35.420, 41.35.680,
- 3 41.40.180, 41.40.630, 41.40.820, and 43.43.250; adding a new chapter to
- I Title 41 RCW; and providing an expiration date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 7 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this
- 8 chapter.
- 9 (1) "Employer" means the state of Washington, counties, cities,
- 10 towns, or any other political subdivision, whose employees are members
- 11 of a retirement system under RCW 41.50.030 (1) (a) through (d) and (4).
- 12 (2) "Early retirement" means the authorization under this chapter
- 13 of temporary retirement eligibility for the retirement systems under
- 14 RCW 41.50.030 (1) (a) through (d) and (4).
- 15 (3) "Eligible position" means a position that conforms to the
- 16 requirements for membership in a retirement system under RCW 41.50.030
- 17 (1) (a) through (d) and (4).

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- 1 (4) "Normal retirement" means that retirement, based on service or 2 service and age, of a member of a retirement system when the full 3 retirement allowance is provided.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. An employer may temporarily utilize a retirement incentive program as provided in section 3(1) of this act if it has encountered or will be encountering one or more of the following emergent and compelling conditions:
- 8 (1) A significant reduction in force due to either (a) budgetary or 9 other fiscal adjustments or (b) significant personnel restructuring;
- 10 (2) The closure of one or more of its facilities; and
- 11 (3) The privatization of one or more of its agencies or services it provides.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) An employer may offer, adhering to all laws or regulations of the state or federal government:
- 15 (a) Retirement, with a reduction in the retirement allowance of 16 three percent per year for each year of difference between the 17 employee's age and the full retirement age for the employee's plan, to 18 those targeted employees who are within five years of normal 19 retirement;
- 20 (b) Retirement, with full actuarial reduction of the retirement 21 allowance, to other targeted employees who are not within five years of 22 normal retirement; and
- (c) Other incentives the agency or political subdivision declares appropriate, including incentives to those already eligible to retire on normal retirement.
 - (2) The employer providing early retirement as a part of a retirement incentive program under subsection (1)(a) or (b) of this section is required to pay the full actuarial present value of any increase in the cost to the respective retirement system or systems resulting from persons taking the early retirement. This payment may be made during a five-year period beginning on the date of retirement. Interest shall be charged on payments made by the employer after the date of the employees' retirement at a rate determined by the director.
- 34 (3) An employee who accepts an employer's offer to retire under 35 this section shall have their retirement allowance suspended 36 immediately upon reemployment with that employer, and the retired 37 employee's retirement allowance shall remain suspended until the

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- 1 retired employee remains absent from employment with that employer for 2 one full calendar month.
- 3 (4) An employee who accepts an employer's offer to retire under 4 this section who works more than eight hundred sixty-seven hours of 5 postretirement employment with any employer participating in any of the 6 Washington state retirement systems shall have their monthly retirement 7 allowance suspended until the retiree remains absent from employment 8 with an employer for one full calendar month.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Upon notification by a political subdivision, the director of retirement systems shall, within fifteen calendar days of receipt, inform the certified or requesting employer of the procedures and reporting necessary to carry out any retirement incentive program.
- 14 **Sec. 5.** RCW 41.32.480 and 1997 c 254 s 4 are each amended to read 15 as follows:
- (1) Any member who separates from service after having completed 16 17 thirty years of creditable service may retire upon the approval by the 18 department of an application for retirement filed on the prescribed form. Upon retirement the member shall receive a retirement allowance 19 consisting of an annuity which shall be the actuarial equivalent of his 20 21 or her accumulated contributions at his or her age of retirement and a 22 pension as provided in RCW 41.32.497. Effective July 1, 1967, anyone 23 then receiving a retirement allowance or a survivor retirement 24 allowance under this chapter, based on thirty-five years of creditable 25 service, and who has established more than thirty-five years of service 26 credit with the retirement system, shall thereafter receive a 27 retirement allowance based on the total years of service credit 28 established.
 - (2) Any member who has attained age sixty years, but who has completed less than thirty years of creditable service, upon separation from service, may retire upon the approval by the department of an application for retirement filed on the prescribed form. Upon retirement the member shall receive a retirement allowance consisting of an annuity which shall be the actuarial equivalent of his or her accumulated contributions at his or her age of retirement and a pension as provided in RCW 41.32.497.

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- (3) Any member who has attained age fifty-five years and who has 1 2 completed not less than twenty-five years of creditable service, upon separation from service, may retire upon the approval by the department 3 4 of an application for retirement filed on the prescribed form. retirement the member shall receive a retirement allowance which shall 5 be the actuarial equivalent of his or her accumulated contributions at 6 his or her age of retirement and a pension as provided in RCW 7 8 41.32.497. An individual who has retired pursuant to this subsection, 9 on or after July 1, 1969, shall not suffer an actuarial reduction in 10 his or her retirement allowance, except as the allowance may be 11 actuarially reduced pursuant to the options contained in RCW 41.32.530. The chapter 193, Laws of 1974 ex. sess. amendment to this section shall 12 13 be retroactive to July 1, 1969.
- (4) Subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be temporarily superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive program initiated under section 3 of this act.
- 17 **Sec. 6.** RCW 41.32.765 and 2000 c 247 s 902 are each amended to 18 read as follows:
- 19 (1) NORMAL RETIREMENT. Any member with at least five service 20 credit years of service who has attained at least age sixty-five shall 21 be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed 22 according to the provisions of RCW 41.32.760.
 - (2) EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at least twenty service credit years of service who has attained at least age fifty-five shall be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.32.760, except that a member retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement allowance actuarially reduced to reflect the difference in the number of years between age at retirement and the attainment of age sixty-five.
- (3) ALTERNATE EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at 31 least thirty service credit years and has attained age fifty-five shall 32 33 be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed 34 according to the provisions of RCW 41.32.760, except that a member retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement 35 allowance reduced by three percent per year to reflect the difference 36 in the number of years between age at retirement and the attainment of 37 38 age sixty-five.

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- 1 (4) Subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be temporarily
- 2 superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive
- 3 program initiated under section 3 of this act.
- 4 **Sec. 7.** RCW 41.32.875 and 2000 c 247 s 903 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) NORMAL RETIREMENT. Any member who is at least age sixty-five 7 and who has:
- 8 (a) Completed ten service credit years; or

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- 9 (b) Completed five service credit years, including twelve service 10 credit months after attaining age fifty-four; or
- 11 (c) Completed five service credit years by July 1, 1996, under plan 12 2 and who transferred to plan 3 under RCW 41.32.817;
- shall be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.32.840.
- 15 (2) EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has attained at least age 16 fifty-five and has completed at least ten years of service shall be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed 17 18 according to the provisions of RCW 41.32.840, except that a member retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement 19 allowance actuarially reduced to reflect the difference in the number 20 of years between age at retirement and the attainment of age sixty-21 22 five.
 - (3) ALTERNATE EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at least thirty service credit years and has attained age fifty-five shall be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.32.840, except that a member retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement allowance reduced by three percent per year to reflect the difference in the number of years between age at retirement and the attainment of age sixty-five.
- 31 <u>(4) Subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be temporarily</u>
 32 <u>superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive</u>
 33 <u>program initiated under section 3 of this act.</u>
- 34 **Sec. 8.** RCW 41.35.420 and 2000 c 247 s 905 are each amended to 35 read as follows:
- 36 (1) NORMAL RETIREMENT. Any member with at least five service 37 credit years who has attained at least age sixty-five shall be eligible

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- 1 to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to 2 the provisions of RCW 41.35.400.
- 3 (2) EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at least twenty 4 service credit years and has attained age fifty-five shall be eligible 5 to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to 6 the provisions of RCW 41.35.400, except that a member retiring pursuant 7 to this subsection shall have the retirement allowance actuarially 8 reduced to reflect the difference in the number of years between age at 9 retirement and the attainment of age sixty-five.
- 10 (3) ALTERNATE EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at least thirty service credit years and has attained age fifty-five shall 11 be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed 12 13 according to the provisions of RCW 41.35.400, except that a member retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement 14 15 allowance reduced by three percent per year to reflect the difference 16 in the number of years between age at retirement and the attainment of 17 age sixty-five.
- (4) Subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be temporarily superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive program initiated under section 3 of this act.
- 21 **Sec. 9.** RCW 41.35.680 and 2000 c 247 s 906 are each amended to 22 read as follows:
- 23 (1) NORMAL RETIREMENT. Any member who is at least age sixty-five 24 and who has:
- 25 (a) Completed ten service credit years; or
- 26 (b) Completed five service credit years, including twelve service 27 credit months after attaining age fifty-four; or
- (c) Completed five service credit years by September 1, 2000, under the public employees' retirement system plan 2 and who transferred to plan 3 under RCW 41.35.510;
- 31 shall be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance 32 computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.35.620.
- 33 (2) EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has attained at least age 34 fifty-five and has completed at least ten years of service shall be 35 eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed 36 according to the provisions of RCW 41.35.620, except that a member 37 retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement 38 allowance actuarially reduced to reflect the difference in the number

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- 1 of years between age at retirement and the attainment of age sixty-2 five.
- 3 (3) ALTERNATE EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at 4 least thirty service credit years and has attained age fifty-five shall 5 be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.35.620, except that a member 6 7 retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement allowance reduced by three percent per year to reflect the difference 8 9 in the number of years between age at retirement and the attainment of 10 age sixty-five.
- (4) Subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be temporarily superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive program initiated under section 3 of this act.
- 14 **Sec. 10.** RCW 41.40.180 and 1982 1st ex.s. c 52 s 21 are each 15 amended to read as follows:
- (1) Any member with five years of creditable service who has 16 attained age sixty and any original member who has attained age sixty 17 18 may retire on written application to the director, setting forth at what time the member desires to be retired: PROVIDED, That in the 19 national interest, during time of war engaged in by the United States, 20 the director may extend beyond age sixty, subject to the provisions of 21 22 subsection (2) of this section, the age at which any member may be 23 eligible to retire.
- (2) Any member who has completed thirty years of service may retire on written application to the director setting forth at what time the member desires to be retired, subject to war measures.
- 27 (3) Any member who has completed twenty-five years of service and 28 attained age fifty-five may retire on written application to the 29 director setting forth at what time the member desires to be retired, 30 subject to war measures.
- 31 (4) Any individual who is eligible to retire pursuant to 32 subsections (1) through (3) of this section shall be allowed to retire 33 while on any authorized leave of absence not in excess of one hundred 34 and twenty days.
- 35 <u>(5) Subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be temporarily</u>
 36 <u>superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive</u>
 37 <u>program initiated under section 3 of this act.</u>

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- 1 **Sec. 11.** RCW 41.40.630 and 2000 c 247 s 901 are each amended to 2 read as follows:
- 3 (1) NORMAL RETIREMENT. Any member with at least five service 4 credit years who has attained at least age sixty-five shall be eligible 5 to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to 6 the provisions of RCW 41.40.620.
- 7 (2) EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at least twenty 8 service credit years and has attained age fifty-five shall be eligible 9 to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to 10 the provisions of RCW 41.40.620, except that a member retiring pursuant 11 to this subsection shall have the retirement allowance actuarially 12 reduced to reflect the difference in the number of years between age at 13 retirement and the attainment of age sixty-five.
- (3) ALTERNATE EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at 14 15 least thirty service credit years and has attained age fifty-five shall 16 be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.40.620, except that a member 17 retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement 18 19 allowance reduced by three percent per year to reflect the difference 20 in the number of years between age at retirement and the attainment of 21 age sixty-five.
- 22 (4) Subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be temporarily 23 superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive 24 program initiated under section 3 of this act.
- 25 **Sec. 12.** RCW 41.40.820 and 2000 c 247 s 309 are each amended to 26 read as follows:
- 27 (1) NORMAL RETIREMENT. Any member who is at least age sixty-five 28 and who has:
 - (a) Completed ten service credit years; or

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- 30 (b) Completed five service credit years, including twelve service 31 credit months after attaining age fifty-four; or
- 32 (c) Completed five service credit years by the transfer payment 33 date specified in RCW 41.40.795, under the public employees' retirement 34 system plan 2 and who transferred to plan 3 under RCW 41.40.795;
- 35 shall be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance 36 computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.40.790.
- 37 (2) EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has attained at least age 38 fifty-five and has completed at least ten years of service shall be

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eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.40.790, except that a member retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement allowance actuarially reduced to reflect the difference in the number of years between age at retirement and the attainment of age sixty-

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- 7 (3) ALTERNATE EARLY RETIREMENT. Any member who has completed at 8 least thirty service credit years and has attained age fifty-five shall 9 be eligible to retire and to receive a retirement allowance computed according to the provisions of RCW 41.40.790, except that a member 10 retiring pursuant to this subsection shall have the retirement 11 allowance reduced by three percent per year to reflect the difference 12 13 in the number of years between age at retirement and the attainment of 14 age sixty-five.
- 15 <u>(4) Subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be temporarily</u> 16 <u>superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive</u> 17 <u>program initiated under section 3 of this act.</u>
- 18 **Sec. 13.** RCW 43.43.250 and 1982 1st ex.s. c 52 s 26 are each 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (1) Any member who has attained the age of sixty years shall be 21 retired on the first day of the calendar month next succeeding that in 22 which said member shall have attained the age of sixty: PROVIDED, That 23 the requirement to retire at age sixty shall not apply to a member 24 serving as chief of the Washington state patrol.
- 25 (2) Any member who has completed twenty-five years of credited 26 service or has attained the age of fifty-five may apply to retire as 27 provided in RCW 43.43.260, by completing and submitting an application 28 form to the department, setting forth at what time the member desires 29 to be retired.
- 30 (3) Subsections (1) and (2) of this section may be temporarily
 31 superseded by the provisions of a certified retirement incentive
 32 program initiated under section 3 of this act.
- 33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 14.** Sections 1 through 4 of this act constitute 34 a new chapter in Title 41 RCW.
