- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the protection
- 5 of children and the prevention of sexual exploitation constitutes
- 6 an important state objective. It is the intent of the legislature
- 7 that libraries prevent the sexual exploitation of any person and
- 8 protect children from on-line material that is patently offensive
- 9 with respect to what is suitable for minors and pornographic.

- 11 RCW to read as follows:
- 12 (1) Libraries organized under this chapter must:

- 2 (b) Enforce the operation of the technology protection measure 3 during any use of the computers.
  - (2) As used in this section:

- 5 (a) "Technology protection measure" means a specific software 6 or service, that is installed and operated to eliminate or reduce 7 the ability of the computer to access internet sites displaying 8 pornographic pictures or any other obscene material as defined by 9 law.
- 10 (b) "Policy of internet safety" means a condition of use policy
  11 or an acceptable use policy that includes restrictions on images
  12 accessed via the internet that are obscene, child pornography, or
  13 harmful to minors.
- 14 (3) An administrator, supervisor, or person authorized by the 15 library may disable the technology protection measure concerned to 16 enable access for bona fide research or other lawful purposes.
