- 1 AN ACT Relating to alterations of mobile homes; and creating new
- 2 sections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The labor, commerce, and financial
- 5 institutions committee of the senate shall conduct a study of the
- 6 problems of owners of mobile/manufactured homes in connection with
- 7 obtaining the necessary permits for repair, remodel, maintenance, and
- 8 alteration of their homes. The committee shall enlist the assistance
- 9 of mobile/manufactured homeowners, mobile/manufactured home mortgage
- 10 lenders, the department of labor and industries, and other state or
- 11 local government agencies as needed.
- 12 The study shall address the following issues:
- 13 (1) The fact that many mobile/manufactured homeowners have
- 14 performed alterations or repairs to their homes without obtaining the
- 15 required permits with the result that potential buyers may be unable to
- 16 obtain mortgage financing from the usual sources;
- 17 (2) The costs associated with obtaining required permits,
- 18 particularly on those occasions when an engineering analysis is
- 19 required;

- 1 (3) The possibility of reducing the number and type of repairs and 2 alterations that require a permit, consistent with public health and 3 safety considerations;
- 4 (4) The appropriateness of the current legal sanction for not obtaining a permit when required, which is that the home may not be sold;
- 7 (5) Any methods, procedures, or changes in the law that can assist 8 mobile/manufactured homeowners in the proper and economical maintenance 9 and improvement of their homes, and the protection of their equity.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The committee shall complete the study and develop any recommended legislation prior to the beginning of the 2002 legislative session.
