- 1 AN ACT Relating to establishing small personalized schools; adding
- 2 a new section to chapter 28A.505 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- MEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that a large and growing body of research supports the premise that all students learn more, perform better, and exhibit more responsible and respectful behavior in schools where they are known personally and as individuals by the adults in the school. In light of this research, school districts are encouraged to create small personalized learning environments using available resources from the student achievement fund, the purpose of which is to improve public education and to
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.505
- 14 RCW to read as follows:

achieve higher academic standards.

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- 15 (1) School districts may, consistent with RCW 28A.505.210, spend
- 16 moneys received from the student achievement fund created in RCW
- 17 43.135.045 to establish small personalized schools that have the effect
- 18 of reducing class size and improving student achievement.

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- 1 (2) For the purposes of this section, "small personalized school" 2 means a school with each of the following characteristics:
- 3 (a) That enrolls no more than two hundred seventy-five students if 4 it is an elementary school, or no more than four hundred forty students 5 if it is a middle, junior high, or high school with three or four grade 6 levels;
- 7 (b) Where, to the extent possible, every teacher at the school 8 works with every student assigned to the teacher's classroom for a 9 minimum of two consecutive years;
- 10 (c) That develops and implements a plan for high levels of parental 11 involvement in which parents are directly engaged in supporting their 12 child's learning and in which parents play a significant role in school 13 governance;
- (d) That develops a governance plan that involves an administrator, teachers, parents and other community members, and, if it is a secondary school, the students;
- 17 (e) That develops a philosophy and mission that focuses on the 18 personalization of learning and academic and personal success for each 19 student; and
- 20 (f) That embodies its philosophy and mission in its daily 21 operations and activities.

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
