- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. The legislature finds that the 2000 NEW SECTION. 1. 5 presidential election demonstrated the importance of ensuring the highest possible level of technical skill and knowledge of federal and 6 state laws and administrative rules on the part of those conducting It further finds that, while the people who administer 8 elections in Washington have earned the confidence of the voters, even 9 small errors can affect the outcome of an election. It further finds 10 that experience in other states such as Florida has shown the 11 12 importance of well-trained, tested, and certified 13 administrators at all levels of the election process. The legislature 14 also finds that voting data on both a national and state level 15 establishes the need to update voting equipment to ensure that voters are not inadvertently disenfranchised because of faulty or obsolete 16 17 voting equipment or because those persons charged with operating and maintaining the voting equipment are not adequately trained or prepared 18 Additionally, the legislature takes note of the 19 for their duties.

United States Supreme Court decision in Bush v. Gore, in which the 1 court directed that standards be adopted to ensure that a standard and 2 uniform procedure is established for determining the validity of votes. 3 4 Therefore, the legislature directs that the certification and training program established in the office of the secretary of state under 5 chapter 29.60 RCW be expanded to ensure that the mandate of the United 6 7 States Supreme Court be implemented, that election administrators in 8 the state of Washington receive expanded training and technical assistance to enable them to better fulfill their 9 statutory obligations, that the testing and certification of those administrators 10 continue, and that periodic reviews of county election procedures, 11 policies, and practices take place as often as deemed necessary by the 12 13 secretary of state but not less than once every three years in order to ensure that the highest level of professionalism in the administration 14 15 of elections is maintained.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The sum of four hundred ninety thousand five hundred twenty-one dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, from the general fund to the secretary of state for the purposes of this act.

The sum of four hundred seventy-four thousand three hundred fiftysix dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, from the general fund to the secretary of state for the purposes of this act.
