- 1 AN ACT Relating to the qualifications of a legal newspaper; and
- 2 amending RCW 65.16.020.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 65.16.020 and 1961 c 279 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 The qualifications of a legal newspaper are that such newspaper
- 7 shall have been published regularly, at least once a week, in the
- 8 English language, as a newspaper of general circulation, in the city or
- 9 town where the same is published at the time of application for
- 10 approval, for at least six months prior to the date of such
- 11 application; shall be compiled either in whole or in part in an office
- 12 maintained at the place of publication; shall contain news of general
- 13 interest as contrasted with news of interest primarily to an
- 14 organization, group or class; and shall hold a ((second class mailing
- 15 permit)) periodical class or standard class mailing permit: PROVIDED,
- 16 That a newspaper holding a standard class mailing permit has printed
- 17 <u>legal notices of the federal government for a period of at least two</u>
- 18 years prior to application, is distributed by the United States postal
- 19 service to at least twenty percent of households within its primary

circulation area, and is published within fifteen miles of an 1 2 international border: PROVIDED, That in case of the consolidation of 3 two or more newspapers, such consolidated newspaper shall be considered 4 as qualified if either or any of the papers so consolidated would be a 5 qualified newspaper at the date of such legal publication, had not such consolidation taken place: PROVIDED, That this section shall not 6 7 disqualify as a legal newspaper any publication which, prior to June 8, 8 1961, was adjudged a legal newspaper, so long as it continues to meet 9 the requirements under which it qualified.
