- 1 AN ACT Relating to the use of a mobile telephone while operating a
- 2 motor vehicle; adding a new section to chapter 46.61 RCW; creating a
- 3 new section; prescribing penalties; and providing an effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The use of mobile telephones by motorists
- 6 has increased in recent years. While mobile telephones have assisted
- 7 with quick reporting of road emergencies, their use has also
- 8 contributed to accidents and other mishaps on Washington state
- 9 roadways. When motorists hold a mobile telephone in one hand and drive
- 10 with the other, their chances of becoming involved in a traffic mishap
- 11 increase. It is the legislature's intent to phase out the use of hand-
- 12 held mobile telephones by motorists while operating a vehicle.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.61 RCW
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, any
- 16 person operating a moving motor vehicle while holding a mobile
- 17 telephone to his or her ear is guilty of a traffic infraction and
- 18 subject to a thirty-five dollar fine.

- 1 (2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to a person 2 operating:
- 3 (a) An authorized emergency vehicle;
- 4 (b) A moving motor vehicle using a mobile telephone in hands-free 5 mode;
- 6 (c) A moving motor vehicle who uses a hand-held mobile telephone 7 to:
- 8 (i) Report illegal activity;

the operator of a motor vehicle.

- 9 (ii) Summon medical or other emergency help;
- 10 (iii) Prevent injury to a person or property.
- 11 (3) For purposes of this section, "hands-free mode" means the use 12 of a wireless telephone with a speaker phone, headset, or earpiece.
- (4) The state preempts the field of regulating the use of mobile telephones in motor vehicles, and this section supersedes any local laws, ordinances, orders, rules, or regulations enacted by a political subdivision or municipality to regulate the use of mobile telephones by
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act takes effect January 1, 2004.
