State of Washington 57th Legislature 2001 First Special Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to funding for traffic safety education; amending
- 2 RCW 46.20.055 and 46.68.041; and reenacting and amending RCW 46.20.120.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.055 and 1999 c 274 s 13 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- (1) Driver's instruction permit. The department may issue a 6 driver's instruction permit with a photograph to an applicant who has successfully passed all parts of the examination other than the driving 8 9 test, provided the information required by RCW 46.20.091, paid a 10 ((five-dollar)) thirty-dollar fee, and meets the following requirements: 11
- 12 (a) Is at least fifteen and one-half years of age; or
- 13 (b) Is at least fifteen years of age and:
- 14 (i) Has submitted a proper application; and
- 15 (ii) Is enrolled in a traffic safety education program approved and
- 16 accredited by the superintendent of public instruction that includes
- 17 practice driving.
- 18 (2) Nonphoto permit fee. An applicant who meets the requirements
- 19 of subsection (1) of this section other than payment of the ((five-

- 1 dollar)) thirty-dollar fee may obtain a driver's instruction permit
- 2 without a photograph by paying a fee of ((four)) twenty-nine dollars.
- 3 (3) Waiver of written examination for instruction permit. The

department may waive the written examination, if, at the time of

- 5 application, an applicant is enrolled in:
- 6 (a) A traffic safety education course as defined by RCW 7 28A.220.020(2); or
- 8 (b) A course of instruction offered by a licensed driver training 9 school as defined by RCW 46.82.280(1).
- 10 The department may require proof of registration in such a course 11 as it deems necessary.
- 12 (4) **Effect of instruction permit**. A person holding a driver's 13 instruction permit may drive a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle,
- 14 upon the public highways if:

- 15 (a) The person has immediate possession of the permit; and
- 16 (b) An approved instructor, or a licensed driver with at least five 17 years of driving experience, occupies the seat beside the driver.
- 18 (5) **Term of instruction permit**. A driver's instruction permit is 19 valid for one year from the date of issue.
- 20 (a) The department may issue one additional one-year permit.
- 21 (b) The department may issue a third driver's permit if it finds
- 22 after an investigation that the permittee is diligently seeking to
- 23 improve driving proficiency.
- 24 Sec. 2. RCW 46.20.120 and 1999 c 308 s 1 and 1999 c 199 s 3 are 25 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 26 An applicant for a new or renewed driver's license must
- 27 successfully pass a driver licensing examination to qualify for a
- 28 driver's license. The department shall give examinations at places and
- 29 times reasonably available to the people of this state.
- 30 (1) Waiver. The department may waive:
- 31 (a) All or any part of the examination of any person applying for
- 32 the renewal of a driver's license unless the department determines that
- 33 the applicant is not qualified to hold a driver's license under this
- 34 title; or
- 35 (b) The actual demonstration of the ability to operate a motor
- 36 vehicle if the applicant:
- 37 (i) Surrenders a valid driver's license issued by the person's
- 38 previous home state; and

1 (ii) Is otherwise qualified to be licensed.

- 2 (2) **Fee**. Each applicant for a new license must pay an examination 3 fee of ((seven)) twenty-four dollars.
- 4 (a) The examination fee is in addition to the fee charged for 5 issuance of the license.
 - (b) "New license" means a license issued to a driver:
 - (i) Who has not been previously licensed in this state; or
- 8 (ii) Whose last previous Washington license has been expired for 9 more than five years.
- 10 (3) A person whose license expired or will expire on or after 11 January 1, 1998, while he or she was or is living outside the state 12 may:
- (a) Apply to the department to extend the validity of his or her 13 14 license for no more than twelve months. If the person establishes to 15 the department's satisfaction that he or she is unable to return to Washington before the date his or her license expires, the department 16 17 shall extend the person's license. The department may grant consecutive extensions, but in no event may the cumulative total of 18 19 extensions exceed twelve months. An extension granted under this section does not change the expiration date of the license for purposes 20 of RCW 46.20.181. The department shall charge a fee of five dollars 21 for each license extension; 22
 - (b) Apply to the department to renew his or her license by mail. If the person establishes to the department's satisfaction that he or she is unable to return to Washington within twelve months of the date that his or her license expires, the department shall renew the person's license by mail. If a person qualifies for a mail-in renewal he or she is not required to pass an examination nor provide an updated photograph. He or she must, however, pay the fee required by RCW 46.20.181 plus an additional five-dollar mail-in renewal fee. A license renewed by mail that does not include a photograph of the licensee must be labeled "not valid for identification purposes."
- 33 (4) If a person's driver's license is extended or renewed under 34 subsection (3) of this section while he or she is outside the state, he 35 or she must submit to the examination required under this section 36 within sixty days of returning to this state. The department will not 37 assess a penalty or examination fee for the examination.

- 1 Sec. 3. RCW 46.68.041 and 1998 c 212 s 3 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- (1) ((Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section,)) The department shall forward all funds accruing under the provisions of chapter 46.20 RCW together with a proper identifying, detailed report to the state treasurer ((who shall deposit such moneys to the credit of the highway safety fund)).
- 8 (2) The treasurer shall deposit twenty-five dollars of each driver's instruction permit fee and seventeen dollars of each driver's license examination fee to the credit of the public safety and education account for use in traffic safety education in public schools.
- 13 (3) The treasurer shall deposit sixty-three percent of each fee 14 collected by the department under RCW 46.20.311 (1)(b)(ii), (2)(b)(ii), 15 and (3)(b) ((shall be deposited in)) to the credit of the impaired 16 driving safety account.
- 17 (4) The treasurer shall deposit the balance of the funds forwarded 18 under subsection (1) of this section to the credit of the highway 19 safety fund.
