
SENATE BILL 6462

1 AN ACT Relating to tests and permits for commercial driver's
2 licensing; and amending RCW 46.25.060.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.25.060 and 1989 c 178 s 8 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1)(a) No person may be issued a commercial driver's license unless
7 that person is a resident of this state and has passed a knowledge and
8 skills test for driving a commercial motor vehicle that complies with
9 minimum federal standards established by federal regulation enumerated
10 in 49 C.F.R. part 383, subparts G and H, and has satisfied all other
11 requirements of the CMVSA in addition to other requirements imposed by
12 state law or federal regulation. The tests must be prescribed and
13 conducted by the department. In addition to the fee charged for
14 issuance or renewal of any license, the applicant shall pay a fee of no
15 more than ten dollars for each classified knowledge examination,
16 classified endorsement knowledge examination, or any combination of
17 classified license and endorsement knowledge examinations. The
18 applicant shall pay a fee of no more than fifty dollars for each

1 classified skill examination or combination of classified skill
2 examinations conducted by the department.

3 (b) The department may authorize a person, including an agency of
4 this or another state, an employer, a private driver training facility,
5 or other private institution, or a department, agency, or
6 instrumentality of local government, to administer the skills test
7 specified by this section under the following conditions:

8 (i) The test is the same which would otherwise be administered by
9 the state;

10 (ii) The third party has entered into an agreement with the state
11 that complies with the requirements of 49 C.F.R. part 383.75; and

12 (iii) The director has adopted rules as to the third party testing
13 program and the development and justification for fees charged by any
14 third party.

15 (c) An entity authorized in (b) of this subsection to administer
16 the skills test is not allowed to administer the skills test to an
17 applicant who has paid that entity to provide commercial driver
18 training.

19 (2) The department may waive the skills test specified in this
20 section for a commercial driver's license applicant who meets the
21 requirements of 49 C.F.R. part 383.77.

22 (3) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver's
23 instruction permit may not be issued to a person while the person is
24 subject to a disqualification from driving a commercial motor vehicle,
25 or while the person's driver's license is suspended, revoked, or
26 canceled in any state, nor may a commercial driver's license be issued
27 to a person who has a commercial driver's license issued by any other
28 state unless the person first surrenders all such licenses, which must
29 be returned to the issuing state for cancellation.

30 (4)(a) A commercial driver's instruction permit may be issued to an
31 individual who holds a valid automobile or classified driver's license
32 and who has passed a general knowledge test for driving a commercial
33 motor vehicle that is prescribed and conducted by the department.

34 (b) A commercial driver's instruction permit may not be issued for
35 a period to exceed six months. Only one renewal or reissuance may be
36 granted within a two-year period. The holder of a commercial driver's
37 instruction permit may drive a commercial motor vehicle on a highway
38 only when accompanied by the holder of a commercial driver's license
39 valid for the type of vehicle driven who occupies a seat beside the

1 individual for the purpose of giving instruction in driving the
2 commercial motor vehicle. An application for a commercial driver's
3 instruction permit shall be accompanied by a fee of five dollars. The
4 department shall forthwith transmit the fees collected for commercial
5 driver's instruction permits to the state treasurer.

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
