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## SENATE BILL 6547

- 1 AN ACT Relating to traffic safety education for persons under the
- 2 age of eighteen; and amending RCW 46.20.100, 46.20.055, and 46.20.070.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.100 and 1999 c 274 s 14 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) **Application**. The application of a person under the age of eighteen years for a driver's license or a motorcycle endorsement must 8 be signed by a parent or guardian with custody of the minor. If the 9 person under the age of eighteen has no father, mother, or guardian, 10 then the application must be signed by the minor's employer.
- 11 (2) **Traffic safety education requirement**. For a person under the 12 age of eighteen years to obtain a driver's license he or she must meet 13 the traffic safety education requirements of this subsection.
- (a) To meet the traffic safety education requirement for a driver's license the applicant must satisfactorily complete a traffic safety education course as defined in RCW 28A.220.020 for a course offered by a school district or as defined by the department of licensing for a
- 17 <u>a school district</u>, or as defined by the department of licensing for a
- 18 course offered by a driver training school licensed under chapter 46.82
- 19  $\underline{\text{RCW}}$ . The course  $\underline{\text{offered by a school district}}$  must meet the standards

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- 1 established by the office of the state superintendent of public
- 2 instruction. The course offered by a driver training school must meet
- 3 the standards established by the department of licensing. The traffic
- 4 safety education course may be provided by:
- 5 (i) A recognized secondary school; or
- 6 (ii) A ((commercial driving enterprise)) driver training school
- 7 <u>licensed under chapter 46.82 RCW</u> that is annually approved by the
- 8 ((office of the superintendent of public instruction)) department of
- 9 <u>licensing</u>.
- 10 (b) To meet the traffic safety education requirement for a
- 11 motorcycle endorsement, the applicant must successfully complete a
- 12 motorcycle safety education course that meets the standards established
- 13 by the department of licensing.
- 14 (c) The department may waive the traffic safety education
- 15 requirement for a driver's license if the applicant demonstrates to the
- 16 department's satisfaction that:
- 17 (i) He or she was unable to take or complete a traffic safety
- 18 education course;
- 19 (ii) A need exists for the applicant to operate a motor vehicle;
- 20 and
- 21 (iii) He or she has the ability to operate a motor vehicle in such
- 22 a manner as not to jeopardize the safety of persons or property.
- 23 The department may adopt rules to implement this subsection (2)(c) in
- 24 concert with the supervisor of the traffic safety education section of
- 25 the office of the superintendent of public instruction.
- 26 (d) The department may waive the traffic safety education
- 27 requirement if the applicant was licensed to drive a motor vehicle or
- 28 motorcycle outside this state and provides proof that he or she has had
- 29 education equivalent to that required under this subsection.
- 30 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.20.055 and 1999 c 274 s 13 are each amended to read
- 31 as follows:
- 32 (1) **Driver's instruction permit**. The department may issue a
- 33 driver's instruction permit with a photograph to an applicant who has
- 34 successfully passed all parts of the examination other than the driving
- 35 test, provided the information required by RCW 46.20.091, paid a five-
- 36 dollar fee, and meets the following requirements:
- 37 (a) Is at least fifteen and one-half years of age; or
- 38 (b) Is at least fifteen years of age and:

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- 1 (i) Has submitted a proper application; and
- 2 (ii) Is enrolled in a traffic safety education program <u>offered</u>,
  3 approved, and accredited by the superintendent of public instruction <u>or</u>
  4 <u>offered by a driving training school that meets standards adopted by</u>
  5 <u>the department of licensing</u>, that includes practice driving.
- 6 (2) Nonphoto permit fee. An applicant who meets the requirements 7 of subsection (1) of this section other than payment of the five-dollar 8 fee may obtain a driver's instruction permit without a photograph by 9 paying a fee of four dollars.
- 10 (3) Waiver of written examination for instruction permit. The 11 department may waive the written examination, if, at the time of 12 application, an applicant is enrolled in:
- 13 (a) A traffic safety education course as defined by RCW 14 28A.220.020(2); or
- 15 (b) A course of instruction offered by a licensed driver training 16 school as defined by RCW 46.82.280(1).
- The department may require proof of registration in such a course as it deems necessary.
- 19 (4) **Effect of instruction permit**. A person holding a driver's 20 instruction permit may drive a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, 21 upon the public highways if:
  - (a) The person has immediate possession of the permit; and

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- 23 (b) An approved instructor, or a licensed driver with at least five years of driving experience, occupies the seat beside the driver.
- 25 (5) **Term of instruction permit**. A driver's instruction permit is 26 valid for one year from the date of issue.
- 27 (a) The department may issue one additional one-year permit.
- (b) The department may issue a third driver's permit if it finds after an investigation that the permittee is diligently seeking to improve driving proficiency.
- 31 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.20.070 and 1999 c 6 s 13 are each amended to read 32 as follows:
- 33 (1) Agricultural driving permit authorized. The director may issue 34 a juvenile agricultural driving permit to a person under the age of 35 eighteen years if:
- 36 (a) The application is signed by the applicant and the applicant's 37 father, mother, or legal guardian;

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- 1 (b) The applicant has passed the driving examination required by 2 RCW 46.20.120;
- 3 (c) The department has investigated the applicant's need for the 4 permit and determined that the need justifies issuance;
- 5 (d) The department has determined the applicant is capable of 6 operating a motor vehicle without endangering himself or herself or 7 other persons and property; and
  - (e) The applicant has paid a fee of three dollars.
- 9 The permit must contain a photograph of the person.

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- 10 (2) **Effect of agricultural driving permit**. (a) The permit 11 authorizes the holder to:
- (i) Drive a motor vehicle on the public highways of this state in connection with farm work. The holder may drive only within a restricted farming locality described on the permit; and
- (ii) Participate in the classroom portion of a traffic safety education course authorized under RCW 28A.220.030 or the classroom portion of a traffic safety education course offered by a driver training school that meets standards adopted by the department of licensing, offered in the community where the holder resides.
- 20 (b) The director may transfer the permit from one farming locality 21 to another. A transfer is not a renewal of the permit.
- 22 (3) Term and renewal of agricultural driving permit. An 23 agricultural driving permit expires one year from the date of issue.
- (a) A person under the age of eighteen who holds a permit may renew the permit by paying a three-dollar fee.
- (b) An agricultural driving permit is invalidated when a permittee attains age eighteen. In order to drive a motor vehicle on a highway he or she must obtain a motor vehicle driver's license under this chapter.
- 30 (4) Suspension, revocation, or cancellation. The director has sole 31 discretion to suspend, revoke, or cancel a juvenile agricultural 32 driving permit if:
- 33 (a) The permittee has been found to have committed an offense that 34 requires mandatory suspension or revocation of a driver's license; or
- 35 (b) The director is satisfied that the permittee has violated the 36 permit's restrictions.

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
