- AN ACT Relating to certification of electricians; and amending RCW
- 2 19.28.006, 19.28.041, 19.28.051, 19.28.061, 19.28.161, 19.28.191,
- 3 19.28.201, 19.28.211, and 19.28.241.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.28.006 and 2001 c 211 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 The definitions in this section apply throughout this subchapter.
- 8 (1) "Administrator" means a person designated by an electrical
- 9 contractor to supervise electrical work and electricians in accordance
- 10 with the rules adopted under this chapter.
- 11 (2) "Board" means the electrical board under RCW 19.28.311.
- 12 (3) "Chapter" or "subchapter" means the subchapter, if no chapter
- 13 number is referenced.
- 14 (4) "Department" means the department of labor and industries.
- 15 (5) "Director" means the director of the department or the 16 director's designee.
- 17 (6) "Electrical construction trade" includes but is not limited to
- 18 installing or maintaining electrical wires and equipment that are used
- 19 for light, heat, or power and installing and maintaining remote

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- 1 control, signaling, power limited, or communication circuits or 2 systems.
- 3 (7) "Electrical contractor" means a person, firm, partnership, 4 corporation, or other entity that offers to undertake, undertakes, 5 submits a bid for, or does the work of installing or maintaining wires 6 or equipment that convey electrical current.
- 7 (8) "Equipment" means any equipment or apparatus that directly 8 uses, conducts, or is operated by electricity but does not mean plug-in 9 ((household)) appliances or equipment as determined by the department 10 by rule.
- 11 (9) "Industrial control panel" means a factory-wired or user-wired 12 assembly of industrial control equipment such as motor controllers, 13 switches, relays, power supplies, computers, cathode ray tubes, 14 transducers, and auxiliary devices. The panel may include disconnect 15 means and motor branch circuit protective devices.
- 16 (10) "Journeyman electrician" means a person who has been issued a 17 journeyman electrician certificate of competency by the department.
- 18 (11) <u>"Master electrician" means either a master journeyman</u> 19 <u>electrician or master specialty electrician.</u>
- 20 (12) "Master journeyman electrician" means a person who has been 21 issued a master journeyman electrician certificate of competency by the 22 department and who may be designated by an electrical contractor to 23 supervise electrical work and electricians in accordance with rules 24 adopted under this chapter.
- 25 (13) "Master specialty electrician" means a person who has been 26 issued a specialty electrician certificate of competency by the 27 department and who may be designated by an electrical contractor to 28 supervise electrical work and electricians in accordance with rules 29 adopted under this chapter.
- 30 (14) "Specialty electrician" means a person who has been issued a 31 specialty electrician certificate of competency by the department.
- 32 **Sec. 2.** RCW 19.28.041 and 2001 c 211 s 3 are each amended to read 33 as follows:
- (1) It is unlawful for any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity to engage in, conduct, or carry on the business of installing or maintaining wires or equipment to convey electric current, or installing or maintaining equipment to be operated by electric current as it pertains to the electrical industry, without

- 1 having an unrevoked, unsuspended, and unexpired electrical contractor
- 2 license, issued by the department in accordance with this chapter. All
- 3 electrical contractor licenses expire twenty-four calendar months
- 4 following the day of their issue. The department may issue an
- 5 electrical contractors license for a period of less than twenty-four
- 6 months only for the purpose of equalizing the number of electrical
- 7 contractor licenses that expire each month. Application for an
- 8 electrical contractor license shall be made in writing to the
- 9 department, accompanied by the required fee. The application shall
- 10 state:
- 11 (a) The name and address of the applicant; in case of firms or
- 12 partnerships, the names of the individuals composing the firm or
- 13 partnership; in case of corporations, the names of the managing
- 14 officials thereof;
- 15 (b) The location of the place of business of the applicant and the
- 16 name under which the business is conducted;
- 17 (c) Employer social security number;
- 18 (d) Evidence of workers' compensation coverage for the applicant's
- 19 employees working in Washington, as follows:
- 20 (i) The applicant's industrial insurance account number issued by
- 21 the department;
- 22 (ii) The applicant's self-insurer number issued by the department;
- 23 or
- 24 (iii) For applicants domiciled in a state or province of Canada
- 25 subject to an agreement entered into under RCW 51.12.120(7), as
- 26 permitted by the agreement, filing a certificate of coverage issued by
- 27 the agency that administers the workers' compensation law in the
- 28 applicant's state or province of domicile certifying that the applicant
- 29 has secured the payment of compensation under the other state's or
- 30 province's workers' compensation law;
- 31 (e) Employment security department number;
- 32 (f) State excise tax registration number;
- 33 (g) Unified business identifier (UBI) account number may be
- 34 substituted for the information required by (d) of this subsection if
- 35 the applicant will not employ employees in Washington, and by (e) and
- 36 (f) of this subsection; and
- 37 (h) Whether a general or specialty electrical contractor license is
- 38 sought and, if the latter, the type of specialty. Electrical
- 39 contractor specialties include, but are not limited to: Residential,

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((domestic appliances,)) pump and irrigation, limited energy system, 1 signs, nonresidential maintenance, and a combination specialty. 2 general electrical contractor license shall grant to the holder the 3 4 right to engage in, conduct, or carry on the business of installing or maintaining wires or equipment to carry electric current, and 5 installing or maintaining equipment, or installing or maintaining 6 7 material to fasten or insulate such wires or equipment to be operated 8 by electric current, in the state of Washington. A specialty 9 electrical contractor license shall grant to the holder a limited right to engage in, conduct, or carry on the business of installing or 10 maintaining wires or equipment to carry electrical current, and 11 installing or maintaining equipment; or installing or maintaining 12 material to fasten or insulate such wires or equipment to be operated 13 by electric current in the state of Washington as expressly allowed by 14 15 the license.

- (2) The department may verify the workers' compensation coverage information provided by the applicant under subsection (1)(d) of this section, including but not limited to information regarding the coverage of an individual employee of the applicant. If coverage is provided under the laws of another state, the department may notify the other state that the applicant is employing employees in Washington.
- 22 (3) The application for ((a)) an electrical contractor license shall be accompanied by a bond in the sum of four thousand dollars with 23 24 the state of Washington named as obligee in the bond, with good and 25 sufficient surety, to be approved by the department. The bond shall at 26 all times be kept in full force and effect, and any cancellation or 27 revocation thereof, or withdrawal of the surety therefrom, suspends the license issued to the principal until a new bond has been filed and 28 29 approved as provided in this section. Upon approval of a bond, the 30 department shall on the next business day deposit the fee accompanying 31 the application in the electrical license fund and shall file the bond in the office. The department shall upon request furnish to any 32 person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity a certified 33 34 copy of the bond upon the payment of a fee that the department shall 35 set by rule. The fee shall cover but not exceed the cost of furnishing the certified copy. The bond shall be conditioned that in any 36 37 installation or maintenance of wires or equipment to convey electrical current, and equipment to be operated by electrical current, the 38 39 principal will comply with the provisions of this chapter and with any

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electrical ordinance, building code, or regulation of a city or town 1 adopted pursuant to RCW 19.28.010(3) that is in effect at the time of 2 entering into a contract. The bond shall be conditioned further that 3 4 the principal will pay for all labor, including employee benefits, and 5 material furnished or used upon the work, taxes and contributions to the state of Washington, and all damages that may be sustained by any 6 7 person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity due to a 8 failure of the principal to make the installation or maintenance in 9 accordance with this chapter or any applicable ordinance, building code, or regulation of a city or town adopted pursuant to RCW 10 19.28.010(3). In lieu of the surety bond required by this section the 11 license applicant may file with the department a cash deposit or other 12 13 negotiable security acceptable to the department. If the license applicant has filed a cash deposit, the department shall deposit the 14 15 funds in a special trust savings account in a commercial bank, mutual 16 savings bank, or savings and loan association and shall pay annually to 17 the depositor the interest derived from the account.

(4) The department shall issue general or specialty electrical contractor licenses to applicants meeting all of the requirements of this chapter. The provisions of this chapter relating to the licensing of any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity including the requirement of a bond with the state of Washington named as obligee therein and the collection of a fee therefor, are exclusive, and no political subdivision of the state of Washington may require or issue any licenses or bonds or charge any fee for the same or a similar purpose. No person, firm, partnership, corporation, or other entity holding more than one specialty contractor license under this chapter may be required to pay an annual fee for more than one such license or to post more than one four thousand dollar bond, equivalent cash deposit, or other negotiable security.

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(5) To obtain a general or specialty electrical contractor license 31 the applicant must designate an individual who currently possesses 32 ((an)) a valid master journeyman electrician's certificate of 33 34 competency, valid master specialty electrician's certificate of competency in the specialty for which application has been made, valid 35 administrator's certificate as a general electrical contractor 36 37 administrator or as a specialty electrical contractor administrator in 38 the specialty for which application has been made.

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(6) Administrator certificate specialties include but are not 1 limited to: Residential, ((domestic, appliance,)) pump and irrigation, 2 3 limited energy system, signs, nonresidential maintenance, 4 combination specialty. To obtain an administrator's certificate an individual must pass an examination as set forth in RCW 19.28.051 5 unless the applicant was a licensed electrical contractor at any time 6 7 during 1974. Applicants who were electrical contractors licensed by 8 the state of Washington at any time during 1974 are entitled to receive 9 a general electrical contractor administrator's certificate without 10 examination if the applicants apply prior to January 1, 1984. board of electrical examiners shall certify to the department the names 11 12 of all persons who are entitled to either a general or specialty electrical contractor administrator's certificate. 13

14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 19.28.051 and 2001 c 211 s 4 are each amended to read 15 as follows:

16 It shall be the purpose and function of the board to establish, in addition to a general electrical contractors' license, such 17 18 classifications of specialty electrical contractors' licenses as it 19 deems appropriate with regard to individual sections pertaining to state adopted codes in this chapter. In addition, it shall be the 20 purpose and function of the board to establish and administer written 21 examinations for general electrical administrators' certificates and 22 23 various specialty electrical administrators' certificates. Examinations shall be designed to reasonably ((insure)) ensure that 24 25 general and specialty electrical administrators' certificate holders are competent to engage in and supervise the work covered by this 26 statute and their respective licenses. The examinations shall include 27 questions from the following categories to assure proper safety and 28 29 protection for the general public: (1) Safety, (2) state electrical code, and (3) electrical theory. The department with the consent of 30 the board shall be permitted to enter into a contract with a 31 32 professional testing agency to develop, administer, and score these 33 examinations. A person may take the administrator's examination as many times as necessary without limit. The fee for the examination may 34 be set by the department in its contract with the professional testing 35 36 agency. The department may direct that the applicant pay the fee to the professional testing agency. The fee shall cover but not exceed 37 the costs of preparing and administering the examination. It shall be 38

- 1 the further purpose and function of this board to advise the director
- 2 as to the need of additional electrical inspectors and compliance

- 7 **Sec. 4.** RCW 19.28.061 and 1996 c 241 s 3 are each amended to read 8 as follows:
- 9 (1) Each applicant for an electrical contractor's license, other
- 10 than an individual, shall designate a supervisory employee or member of
- 11 the firm to take the required <u>master electrician's or</u> administrator's
- 12 examination. Effective July 1, 1987, a supervisory employee designated
- 13 as the <u>electrical contractor's master electrician or</u> administrator
- 14 shall be a full-time supervisory employee. This person shall be
- 15 designated as <u>master electrician or</u> administrator under the license.
- 16 No person may <u>concurrently</u> qualify as <u>master electrician or</u>
- 17 administrator for more than one contractor. If the relationship of the
- 18 <u>master electrician or</u> administrator with the electrical contractor is
- 19 terminated, the contractor's license is void within ninety days unless
- 20 another <u>master electrician or</u> administrator is qualified by the board.
- 21 However, if the <u>master electrician or</u> administrator dies <u>or is</u>
- 22 otherwise incapacitated, the contractor's license is void within one
- 23 hundred eighty days unless another <u>master electrician or</u> administrator
- 24 is qualified by the board. ((A certificate issued under this section
- 25 is valid for two years from the nearest birthdate of the administrator,
- 26 unless revoked or suspended, and further is nontransferable.)) The
- 27 contractor must notify the department in writing within ten days if the
- 28 <u>master electrician's or administrator's relationship with the</u>
- 29 contractor terminates due to the master electrician's or
- 30 administrator's death or incapacitation.
- 31 (2) The department must issue an administrator's certificate to all
- 32 applicants who have passed the examination provided in RCW 19.28.051
- 33 and this section, and who have complied with the rules adopted under
- 34 this chapter. The administrator's certificate must bear the date of
- 35 <u>issuance</u>, <u>expires</u> on the holder's birthday, and is nontransferable.
- 36 The certificate must be renewed every three years, upon application, on
- 37 <u>or before the holder's birthday.</u>

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- 1 (a) If the certificate holder demonstrates to the department that
  2 he or she has satisfactorily completed an annual eight-hour continuing
  3 education course, the certificate may be renewed by appropriate
  4 application without examination unless the certificate has been
  5 revoked, suspended, or not renewed within ninety days after the
  6 expiration date.
- 7 (b) The contents and requirements for satisfactory completion of 8 the continuing education course must be determined by the director and 9 approved by the board.
  - (c) The department must accept proof of a certificate holder's satisfactory completion of a continuing education course offered in another state as meeting the requirements for maintaining a current Washington state certificate if the department is satisfied the course is comparable in nature to that required in Washington state for maintaining a current certificate.
  - (3) A fee must be assessed for each administrator's certificate and for each renewal. An individual holding more than one administrator's certificate under this chapter is not required to pay fees for more than one certificate. If the certificate is not renewed before the expiration date, the individual must pay twice the usual fee. The department must set the fees by rule for issuance and renewal of a certificate. The fees must cover, but not exceed, the costs of issuing the certificates and of administering and enforcing the electrician certification requirements of this chapter.
  - (4) The department may deny an application for an administrator's certificate for up to two years if the applicant's previous administrator's certificate has been revoked for a serious violation and all appeals concerning the revocation have been exhausted. For the purposes of this section only, a serious violation is a violation that presents imminent danger to the public. ((The certificate may be renewed for a two-year period without examination by appropriate application unless the certificate has been revoked, suspended, or not renewed within ninety days after the expiration date. If the certificate is not renewed before the expiration date, the individual shall pay twice the usual fee. An individual holding more than one administrator's certificate under this chapter shall not be required to pay annual fees for more than one certificate. A person may take the administrator's test as many times as necessary without limit.
  - (2))) (5) The designated master electrician or administrator shall:

- 1 (a) Be a member of the firm or a supervisory employee and shall be 2 available during working hours to carry out the duties of an 3 administrator under this section;
- 4 (b) Ensure that all electrical work complies with the electrical 5 installation laws and rules of the state;
  - (c) Ensure that the proper electrical safety procedures are used;
- 7 (d) Ensure that all electrical labels, permits, and licenses 8 required to perform electrical work are used;

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- 9 (e) See that corrective notices issued by an inspecting authority 10 are complied with; and
- (f) Notify the department in writing within ten days if the <u>master</u> leader electrician or administrator terminates the relationship with the electrical contractor.
- 14  $((\frac{3}{3}))$  (6) The department shall not by rule change the 15 administrator's duties under subsection  $(\frac{3}{3})$  of this section.
- 16 **Sec. 5.** RCW 19.28.161 and 1997 c 309 s 1 are each amended to read 17 as follows:
- 18 (1) No person may engage in the electrical construction trade without having a ((<del>current</del>)) <u>valid</u> master journeyman electrician 19 certificate of competency, journeyman electrician certificate of 20 competency, master specialty electrician certificate of competency, or 21 22 a current specialty electrician certificate of competency issued by the 23 department in accordance with this chapter. Electrician certificate of 24 competency specialties include, but are not limited to: Residential, 25 ((domestic appliances,)) pump and irrigation, limited energy system, signs, and nonresidential maintenance. 26
- 27 (2) A person who is indentured in an apprenticeship program approved under chapter 49.04 RCW for the electrical construction trade 28 29 or who is learning the electrical construction trade may work in the 30 electrical construction trade if supervised by a certified <u>master</u> journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty 31 electrician in that electrician's specialty, or a certified specialty 32 electrician in that electrician's specialty. All apprentices and 33 individuals learning the electrical construction trade shall obtain an 34 electrical training certificate from the department. The certificate 35 36 shall authorize the holder to learn the electrical construction trade 37 while under the direct supervision of a master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty electrician working in that 38

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electrician's specialty, or a specialty electrician working in ((his or 1 her)) that electrician's specialty. The holder of the electrical 2 training certificate shall renew the certificate ((annually)) 3 4 biennially. At the time of renewal, the holder shall provide the department with an accurate list of the holder's employers in the 5 electrical construction industry for the previous year and the number 6 7 of hours worked for each employer. ((An annual)) A biennial fee shall 8 be charged for the issuance or renewal of the certificate. 9 department shall set the fee by rule. The fee shall cover but not administering and 10 exceed the cost of enforcing the supervision requirements this 11 certification and of Apprentices and individuals learning the electrical construction trade 12 13 shall have their electrical training certificates in their possession at all times that they are performing electrical work. They shall show 14 15 their certificates to an authorized representative of the department at 16 the representative's request.

- (3) Any person who has been issued an electrical training certificate under this chapter may work if that person is under supervision. Supervision shall consist of a person being on the same job site and under the control of either a certified master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, or ((an appropriate)) a specialty electrician ((who has an applicable certificate of competency issued under this chapter. Either a journeyman electrician or an appropriate specialty electrician shall be on the same job site as the noncertified individual for a minimum of seventy-five percent of each working day unless otherwise provided in this chapter)) working in that electrician's specialty.
- 29 (4) The ratio of noncertified individuals to certified <u>master</u>
  30 <u>journeymen electricians</u>, journeymen <u>electricians</u>, <u>master specialty</u>
  31 <u>electricians</u>, or specialty electricians ((<del>working</del>)) on ((<del>a</del>)) <u>any one</u>
  32 job site ((<del>shall be</del>)) <u>is as follows</u>:
  - (a) When working as a specialty electrician, not more than two noncertified individuals ((working on any one job site)) for every certified master specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, master journeyman electrician, or journeyman electrician ((working as a specialty electrician)), except that the ratio requirements are one certified master specialty electrician working in

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that electrician's specialty, certified specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, certified master journeyman electrician, or certified journeyman electrician working as a specialty electrician to no more than four students enrolled in and working as part of an electrical construction program at public community or technical colleges, or not-for-profit nationally accredited trade or technical schools licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW. In meeting the ratio requirements for students enrolled in an electrical construction program at a trade school, a trade school may receive input and advice from the electrical board; and 

(b) When working as a journeyman electrician, not more than one noncertified individual ((working on any one job site)) for every certified master journeyman electrician or certified journeyman electrician, except that the ratio requirements shall be one certified master journeyman electrician or certified journeyman electrician to no more than four students enrolled in and working as part of an electrical construction program at public community or technical colleges, or not-for-profit nationally accredited trade or technical schools licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW. In meeting the ratio requirements for students enrolled in an electrical construction program at a trade school, a trade school may receive input and advice from the electrical board.

An individual who has a current training certificate and who has successfully completed or is currently enrolled in an approved apprenticeship program or in an electrical construction program at public community or technical colleges, or not-for-profit nationally accredited technical or trade schools licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW, may work without direct on-site supervision during the last six months of meeting the practical experience requirements of this chapter.

(5) For the residential (as specified in WAC 296-46A-930(2)(a)), pump and irrigation (as specified in WAC 296-46A-930(2)(b)(i)), sign (as specified in WAC 296-46A-930(2)(c)), limited energy (as specified in WAC 296-46A-930(2)(e)(i)), or nonresidential maintenance (as specified in WAC 296-46A-930(2)(f)(i)) specialties, either a master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, or an appropriate

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- 1 specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty must be
- 2 on the same job site as the noncertified individual for a minimum of
- 3 seventy-five percent of each working day. Other specialties must meet
- 4 the requirements specified in RCW 19.28.191(1)(f)(ii). When the ratio
- 5 of certified electricians to noncertified individuals on a job site is
- 6 one certified electrician to three or four noncertified individuals the
- 7 <u>certified electrician must:</u>
- 8 (a) Directly supervise and instruct the noncertified individuals
- 9 and the certified electrician may not directly make or engage in an
- 10 electrical installation; and
- 11 (b) Be on the same job site as the noncertified individual for a
- 12 minimum of one hundred percent of each working day.
- 13 (6) The electrical contractor shall accurately verify and attest to
- 14 the electrical trainee hours worked by electrical trainees on behalf of
- 15 the electrical contractor.
- 16 **Sec. 6.** RCW 19.28.191 and 1997 c 309 s 3 are each amended to read 17 as follows:
- 18 (1) Upon receipt of the application, the department shall review
- 19 the application and determine whether the applicant is eligible to take
- 20 an examination for the <u>master journeyman electrician</u>, journeyman
- 21 <u>electrician</u>, <u>master specialty electrician</u>, or specialty <u>electrician</u>
- 22 certificate of competency.
- 23 (a) Before July 1, 2005, an applicant who possesses a valid general
- 24 administrator's certificate and possesses a valid journeyman
- 25 <u>electrician certificate of competency in effect for the previous four</u>
- 26 years may apply for a master journeyman electrician certificate of
- 27 competency without examination.
- 28 (b) Before July 1, 2005, an applicant who possesses a valid
- 29 specialty administrator's certificate, in the specialty applied for,
- 30 and possesses a valid specialty electrician certificate of competency,
- 31 in the specialty applied for, for the previous two years may apply for
- 32 a master specialty electrician certificate of competency without
- 33 examination.
- 34 (c) To be eligible to take the examination for a master journeyman
- 35 electrician certificate of competency the applicant must have possessed
- 36 <u>a valid journeyman electrician certificate of competency for four</u>
- 37 years.

- 1 (d) To be eligible to take the examination for a master specialty
  2 electrician certificate of competency the applicant must have possessed
  3 a valid specialty electrician certificate of competency, in the
  4 specialty applied for, for two years.
- 5 <u>(e)</u> To be eligible to take the examination for a journeyman 6 certificate of competency the applicant must have:
- 7 (i) Worked in the electrical construction trade for a minimum of 8 ((four years)) eight thousand hours employed full time, of which ((two 9 years)) four thousand hours shall be in industrial or commercial 10 electrical installation under the supervision of a journeyman electrician and not more than a total of ((two years)) four thousand 11 hours in all specialties under the supervision of a journeyman 12 electrician or an appropriate specialty electrician. Specialty 13 14 electricians with less than a four thousand hour work experience requirement cannot credit the time required to obtain that specialty 15 towards qualifying to become a journeyman electrician; or 16
- 17 (ii) Successfully completed an apprenticeship program approved 18 under chapter 49.04 RCW for the electrical construction trade.
- 19 ((<del>(b)</del>)) <u>(f)</u> To be eligible to take the examination ((<del>to become</del>))
  20 <u>for</u> a specialty electrician <u>certificate of competency</u> the applicant
  21 ((<del>shall</del>)) <u>must</u> have:

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- (i) Worked in ((that specialty of the electrical construction trade, under the supervision of a journeyman electrician or an appropriate specialty electrician, for a minimum of two years employed full time)) the residential, pump and irrigation, sign, limited energy, or nonresidential maintenance specialties of the electrical construction trade under the supervision of a master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, or a specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty for a minimum of four thousand hours; or
- (ii) Worked in other than the designated specialties in (f)(i) of this subsection for a minimum of two thousand hours. A minimum of the initial ninety days, or longer if set by rule by the department, must be spent under one hundred percent supervision of a master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, or specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty. After the minimum full supervision period, a person may take the specialty examination. If

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the person passes the examination, the person may work unsupervised for
the balance of the two thousand hours required to attain certification;

(iii) Successfully completed an approved apprenticeship program under chapter 49.04 RCW for the applicant's specialty in the electrical construction trade.

((\(\frac{(c+)}\)) (g) Any applicant for a journeyman electrician certificate of competency who has successfully completed a two-year program in the electrical construction trade at public community or technical colleges, or not-for-profit nationally accredited technical or trade schools licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW may substitute up to two years of the technical or trade school program for two years of work experience under a master journeyman electrician or a journeyman electrician. The applicant shall obtain the additional two years of work experience required in industrial or commercial electrical installation prior to the beginning, or after the completion, of the technical school program. ((Any applicant who has received training in the electrical construction trade in the armed service of the United States may be eligible to take the examination for the certificate of competency.

(d)) (h) An applicant for a specialty electrician certificate of competency who, after January 1, 2000, has successfully completed a two-year program in the electrical construction trade at a public community or technical college, or a not-for-profit nationally accredited technical or trade school licensed by the work force training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW, may substitute up to one year of the technical or trade school program for one year of work experience under a master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, or specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty.

(i) The department must determine whether hours of training and experience in the military or school program are in the electrical construction trade and appropriate as a substitute for hours of work experience. The department must use the following criteria for evaluating the equivalence of classroom electrical training programs and work in the electrical construction trade:

38 <u>(i) A two-year electrical training program must consist of three</u>
39 thousand or more hours of student/instructor contact time.

- (ii) In a two-year electrical training program, a minimum of two thousand four hundred hours of student/instructor contact time must be technical electrical instruction directly related to the scope of work of the electrical specialty. Student/instructor contact time includes lecture, in-school lab, and may include off-site instructor-supervised electrical installation.
