- 1 AN ACT Relating to limiting publication of personal information of
- 2 law enforcement-related and court-related employees; and adding new
- 3 sections to chapter 4.24 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Any person or organization who, with the
- 6 intent to harm or intimidate, sells, trades, gives, publishes,
- 7 distributes, or otherwise releases the residential address, residential
- 8 telephone number, birthdate, or social security number of any law
- 9 enforcement-related, corrections officer-related, or court-related
- 10 employee or volunteer, or someone with a similar name, and categorizes
- 11 them as such, without the express written permission of the employee or
- 12 volunteer must disclose the full legal name, the full residential or
- 13 business street address, and the full residential or business telephone
- 14 number of the person or organization selling, trading, giving,
- 15 publishing, distributing, or otherwise releasing the information,
- 16 unless specifically exempted by law or court order.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) Whenever it appears that any person or
- 18 organization is engaged in or about to engage in any act that

- 1 constitutes or will constitute a violation of section 1 of this act,
- 2 the prosecuting attorney or any person harmed by an alleged violation
- 3 of section 1 of this act may initiate a civil proceeding in superior
- 4 court to enjoin such violation, and may petition the court to issue an
- 5 order for the discontinuance of the dissemination of information in
- 6 violation of section 1 of this act.
- 7 (2) An action under this section shall be brought in the county in
- 8 which the violation is alleged to have taken place, and shall be
- 9 commenced by the filing of a verified complaint, or shall be
- 10 accompanied by an affidavit.
- 11 (3) If it is shown to the satisfaction of the court, either by
- 12 verified complaint or affidavit, that a person or organization is
- 13 engaged in or about to engage in any act that constitutes a violation
- 14 of section 1 of this act, the court may issue a temporary restraining
- 15 order to abate and prevent the continuance or recurrence of the act.
- 16 (4) The court may issue a permanent injunction to restrain, abate,
- 17 or prevent the continuance or recurrence of the violation of section 1
- 18 of this act. The court may grant declaratory relief, mandatory orders,
- 19 or any other relief deemed necessary to accomplish the purposes of the
- 20 injunction. The court may retain jurisdiction of the case for the
- 21 purpose of enforcing its orders.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Any law enforcement-related, corrections
- 23 officer-related, or court-related employee or volunteer who suffers
- 24 damages as a result of a person or organization selling, trading,
- 25 giving, publishing, distributing, or otherwise releasing the
- 26 residential address, residential telephone number, birthdate, or social
- 27 security number of the employee or volunteer in violation of section 1
- 28 of this act may bring an action against the person or organization in
- 29 court for actual damages sustained, plus attorneys' fees and costs.
- 30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Sections 1 through 3 of this act are each
- 31 added to chapter 4.24 RCW.
