- 1 AN ACT Relating to the Washington telephone assistance program;
- 2 amending RCW 80.36.005, 80.36.410, and 80.36.470; and providing an

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 80.36.005 and 1993 c 249 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 ((As used in this chapter)) The definitions in this section apply
- 8 throughout RCW 80.36.410 through 80.36.475, unless the context
- 9 ((indicates)) clearly requires otherwise((-)).
- 10 (1) "Community agency" means local community agencies that
- 11 administer community service voice mail programs.
- 12 (2) "Community service voice mail" means a computerized voice mail
- 13 system that provides low-income recipients with: (a) An individually
- 14 <u>assigned telephone number; (b) the ability to record a personal</u>
- 15 greeting; and (c) a private security code to retrieve messages.
- 16 <u>(3)</u> "Department" means the department of social and health
- 17 services.
- 18 (4) "Service year" means the period between July 1st and June 30th.

- 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 80.36.410 and 1987 c 229 s 3 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 The legislature finds that universal telephone service is an 4 important policy goal of the state. The legislature further finds
- 5 that: (1) Recent changes in the telecommunications industry, such as
- 6 federal access charges, raise concerns about the ability of low-income
- 7 persons to continue to afford access to local exchange telephone
- 8 service; and (2) many low-income persons making the transition to
- 9 independence from receiving supportive services through community
- 10 agencies do not qualify for economic assistance from the department.
- 11 Therefore, the legislature finds that it is in the public interest to
- 12 take steps to mitigate the effects of these changes on low-income
- 13 persons.
- 14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 80.36.470 and 1990 c 170 s 6 are each amended to read 15 as follows:
- 16 <u>(1)</u> Adult recipients of department-administered programs for the
- 17 financially needy which provide continuing financial or medical
- 18 assistance, food stamps, or supportive services to persons in their own
- 19 homes are eligible for participation in the telephone assistance
- 20 program. The department shall notify the participants of their
- 21 eligibility.
- 22 (2) Participants in community service voice mail programs are
- 23 eligible for participation in the telephone assistance program after
- 24 completing use of community service voice mail services. Eligibility
- 25 shall be for a period including the remainder of the current service
- 26 year and the following service year. Community agencies shall notify
- 27 the department of participants eligible under this subsection.
