1 WHEREAS, It is of paramount importance to establish cutoff dates
2 for the consideration of legislation during the 2001 Regular Session of
3 the Fifty-Seventh Legislature;

4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the State of
5 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That the following
6 cutoff dates apply to all bills, memorials, and joint resolutions with
7 the exception of budgets, matters necessary to implement budgets,
8 initiatives to the legislature, and alternatives to initiatives to the
9 legislature;

10 (1) Tuesday, February 27, 2001, the fifty-first day, will be the
11 final day to read in House Bill committee reports in the House of
12 Representatives with the exception of reports from House fiscal
13 committees; and, Wednesday, February 28, 2001, the fifty-second day,
14 will be the final day to read in Senate Bill committee reports in the
15 Senate with the exception of reports from the Senate Ways and Means and
16 Senate Transportation committees;

17 (2) Monday, March 5, 2001, the fifty-seventh day, will be the final
18 day to read in Senate Ways and Means, Senate Transportation, and House
19 of Representatives fiscal committee reports in the house of origin;

20 (3) Wednesday, March 14, 2001, the sixty-sixth day, at 5:00 p.m.,
21 will be the final time to consider bills in their house of origin;

1 (4) Friday, March 30, 2001, the eighty-second day, will be the
2 final day to read in committee reports on bills from the opposite house
3 with the exception of reports from the Senate Ways and Means, Senate
4 Transportation, and House of Representatives fiscal committees;

5 (5) Monday, April 2, 2001, the eighty-fifth day, will be the final
6 day to read in Senate Ways and Means, Senate Transportation, and House
7 of Representatives fiscal committee reports on bills from the opposite
8 house; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That after 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 13,
10 2001, the ninety-sixth day, neither house may consider any bills,
11 memorials, or joint resolutions except initiatives to the legislature
12 and alternatives to such initiatives, messages pertaining to
13 amendments, matters of differences between the two houses, and matters
14 incident to the interim and to the closing of the business of the 2001
15 Regular Session of the Legislature.
