- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that numerous changes 3 4 to the sentencing reform act, chapter 9.94A RCW, as reported by the sentencing guidelines commission, have resulted in increases in the 5 6 length of local jail and state prison sentences and in the number of 7 local jail and state prison inmates. The intent of the sentencing 8 reform act, particularly provisions regarding protection of the public, reduction of the risk of reoffense, and making frugal use of state and 9 local government resources, would best be served, in many instances, by 10 11 and state corrections authorities sharing resources 12 jurisdiction over regional correctional facilities.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) Not later than December 31, 2003, the sentencing guidelines commission shall present to the legislature a plan for establishing pilot regional correctional facilities.
- 16 (2) The plan for establishing pilot regional correctional 17 facilities must include, but is not limited to, the following:
- 18 (a) A plan for increasing the space availability in local and 19 county jails for pretrial detainees;
- 20 (b) An efficient and effective plan for joint use of total confinement beds by local and state government;
- (c) A description of proposed shared and/or revised jurisdiction and operational responsibility, including the possibility of establishing a regional corrections authority;
- 25 (d) A summary of proposed changes to the criminal code reflecting 26 revised housing jurisdiction;
- 27 (e) A plan to account for the inmate population eligible for 28 placement in pilot regional correctional facilities which includes:

- 1 Pretrial detainees, inmates serving sentences of sixty days to twenty-
- 2 four months, and inmates serving terms of confinement totaling more
- 3 than one year.
- 4 (i) Other than pretrial detainees, only inmates serving sentences
- 5 of sixty days to twenty-four months are eligible for placement in
- 6 regional correctional facilities.
- 7 (ii) Regional correctional facilities must accept inmates serving 8 terms of confinement totaling more than one year;
- 9 (f) A review of treatment services and programs intended to meet 10 the needs of special populations including drug and substance abuse, 11 mental health, and special medical needs;
- 12 (g) An estimate of potential benefits to local and county jail 13 operators and to the state, which could be realized by implementation
- 14 of pilot programs;
- 15 (h) A proposed method for identifying pilot regional correctional
- 16 facility sites;
- 17 (i) A methodology for evaluating the costs benefit of operation of 18 pilot facilities; and
- 19 (j) Recommendations for sharing capacity, resources, and funding of
- the construction and operation cost of the facilities."
