1 On page 3, beginning on line 8, strike all of section 3 and insert
2 the following:

3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 36.28A
4 RCW to read as follows:

5 (1) The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs in
6 consultation with the Washington state emergency management office, the
7 information services board, the Washington state fire chiefs'
8 association, and the Washington state patrol shall convene a committee
9 to establish guidelines related to the statewide first responder
10 building mapping information system. The committee shall have the
11 following responsibilities:

12 (a) Develop the type of information to be included in the statewide
13 first responder building mapping information system. The information
14 shall include, but is not limited to: Floor plans, fire protection
15 information, evacuation plans, utility information, known hazards, and
16 text and digital images showing emergency personnel contact
17 information;

18 (b) Develop building mapping software standards that must be
19 utilized by all entities participating in the statewide first responder
20 building mapping information system;

21 (c) Determine the order in which buildings shall be mapped when
22 funding is received;

23 (d) Develop guidelines on how the information shall be made
24 available to first responders. These guidelines shall include detailed
25 procedures and security systems to ensure that the information is only
26 made available to first responders;

27 (e) Recommend training guidelines regarding using the statewide
28 first responder building mapping information system to the criminal
29 justice training commission and the Washington state patrol fire
30 protection bureau.

1 (2)(a) Nothing in this section supersedes the authority of the
2 information services board under chapter 43.105 RCW.

3 (b) Nothing in this section supersedes the authority of state
4 agencies and local governments to control and maintain access to
5 information within their independent systems."
