

2SSB 6489 - S AMD TO S AMD (S-4829.1/04) 700

1 On page 23, after line 23 of the amendment, insert the following:

2 "Sec. 10. RCW 28B.10.029 and 1998 c 344 s 5 and 1998 c 111 s 2 are  
3 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

4 (1) An institution of higher education may exercise independently  
5 those powers otherwise granted to the director of general  
6 administration in chapter 43.19 RCW in connection with the purchase and  
7 disposition of all material, supplies, services, and equipment needed  
8 for the support, maintenance, and use of the respective institution of  
9 higher education. Property disposition policies followed by  
10 institutions of higher education shall be consistent with policies  
11 followed by the department of general administration. Purchasing  
12 policies and procedures followed by institutions of higher education  
13 shall be in compliance with chapters 39.19, 39.29, and 43.03 RCW, and  
14 RCW 43.19.1901, 43.19.1906, 43.19.1911, 43.19.1917, 43.19.1937,  
15 43.19.534, 43.19.685, 43.19.700 through 43.19.704, and 43.19.560  
16 through 43.19.637. The community and technical colleges shall comply  
17 with RCW 43.19.450. Except for the University of Washington,  
18 institutions of higher education shall comply with RCW ((~~43.19.1935,~~  
19 ~~43.19.19363, and 43.19.19368~~)) 43.41.310, 43.41.290, and 43.41.350. If  
20 an institution of higher education can satisfactorily demonstrate to  
21 the director of the office of financial management that the cost of  
22 compliance is greater than the value of benefits from any of the  
23 following statutes, then it shall be exempt from them: RCW 43.19.685;  
24 43.19.534; and 43.19.637. Any institution of higher education that  
25 chooses to exercise independent purchasing authority for a commodity or  
26 group of commodities shall notify the director of general  
27 administration. Thereafter the director of general administration  
28 shall not be required to provide those services for that institution  
29 for the duration of the general administration contract term for that  
30 commodity or group of commodities.

1       (2) The council of presidents and the state board for community and  
2 technical colleges shall convene its correctional industries business  
3 development advisory committee, and work collaboratively with  
4 correctional industries, to:

5       (a) Reaffirm purchasing criteria and ensure that quality, service,  
6 and timely delivery result in the best value for expenditure of state  
7 dollars;

8       (b) Update the approved list of correctional industries products  
9 from which higher education shall purchase; and

10       (c) Develop recommendations on ways to continue to build  
11 correctional industries' business with institutions of higher  
12 education.

13       (3) Higher education and correctional industries shall develop a  
14 plan to build higher education business with correctional industries to  
15 increase higher education purchases of correctional industries  
16 products, based upon the criteria established in subsection (2) of this  
17 section. The plan shall include the correctional industries'  
18 production and sales goals for higher education and an approved list of  
19 products from which higher education institutions shall purchase, based  
20 on the criteria established in subsection (2) of this section. Higher  
21 education and correctional industries shall report to the legislature  
22 regarding the plan and its implementation no later than January 30,  
23 2005.

24       (4) Institutions of higher education shall set as a target to  
25 contract, beginning not later than June 30, 2006, to purchase one  
26 percent of the total goods and services required by the institutions  
27 each year produced or provided in whole or in part from class II inmate  
28 work programs operated by the department of corrections. Institutions  
29 of higher education shall set as a target to contract, beginning not  
30 later than June 30, 2008, to purchase two percent of the total goods  
31 and services required by the institutions each year produced or  
32 provided in whole or in part from class II inmate work programs  
33 operated by the department of corrections.

34       (5) An institution of higher education may exercise independently  
35 those powers otherwise granted to the public printer in chapter 43.78  
36 RCW in connection with the production or purchase of any printing and  
37 binding needed by the respective institution of higher education.

1 Purchasing policies and procedures followed by institutions of higher  
2 education shall be in compliance with chapter 39.19 RCW. Any  
3 institution of higher education that chooses to exercise independent  
4 printing production or purchasing authority shall notify the public  
5 printer. Thereafter the public printer shall not be required to  
6 provide those services for that institution."

7 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any  
8 internal references accordingly.
