By House Committee on State Government (originally sponsored by Representatives Haigh, Armstrong, Morris, Hatfield, Linville, Ruderman and Rockefeller; by request of Governor Locke)

1 AN ACT Relating to the elimination of boards and commissions;
2 amending RCW 79A.25.220, 79A.05.385, 79A.05.400, 79A.05.410,
3 79A.25.800, and 79A.25.820; creating new sections; repealing RCW
4 41.05.150, 43.175.010, 43.175.020, 43.175.901, 79A.05.420, and
5 79A.25.810; providing an effective date; providing a contingent
6 expiration date; and declaring an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

PART 1

HEALTH CARE POLICY TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 101.** RCW 41.05.150 (Health care policy
11 technical advisory committee) and 1988 c 107 s 14 are each repealed.

PART 2

GOVERNOR'S SMALL BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 201.** The following acts or parts of acts are
15 each repealed:

- 1 (1) RCW 43.175.010 (Governor's small business improvement council--
2 Established--Membership--Travel expenses--Staff support and
3 administrative assistance) and 1987 c 348 s 6, 1985 c 466 s 62, & 1984
4 c 282 s 7;
5 (2) RCW 43.175.020 (Duties) and 1998 c 245 s 53, 1987 c 348 s 7,
6 1985 c 466 s 63, & 1984 c 282 s 8; and
7 (3) RCW 43.175.901 (Severability--1984 c 282) and 1984 c 282 s 17.

9 **REBUILDING FAMILIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 301.** By July 1, 2003, the secretary of the
11 department of corrections shall abolish the rebuilding families
12 advisory committee.

13 **PART 4**

14 **INDEPENDENT LIVING ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 401.** By July 1, 2003, the director of the
16 department of services for the blind shall abolish the independent
17 living advisory committee.

18 **PART 5**

19 **OCEAN SPOT SHRIMP EMERGING FISHERY ADVISORY BOARD**

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 501.** By July 1, 2003, the director of the
21 department of fish and wildlife shall abolish the ocean spot shrimp
22 emerging fishery advisory board.

23 **PART 6**

24 **FIREARMS RANGE ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

25 **Sec. 601.** RCW 79A.25.220 and 1993 sp.s. c 2 s 71 are each amended
26 to read as follows:

27 (1) ~~((A ten member firearms range advisory committee is hereby~~
28 ~~created to provide advice and counsel to the interagency committee for~~
29 ~~outdoor recreation. The members shall be appointed by the director of~~

1 ~~the interagency committee for outdoor recreation from the following~~
2 ~~groups:~~

- 3 ~~(a) Law enforcement;~~
- 4 ~~(b) Washington military department;~~
- 5 ~~(c) Black powder shooting sports;~~
- 6 ~~(d) Rifle shooting sports;~~
- 7 ~~(e) Pistol shooting sports;~~
- 8 ~~(f) Shotgun shooting sports;~~
- 9 ~~(g) Archery shooting sports;~~
- 10 ~~(h) Hunter education;~~

- 12 ~~(j) General public.~~

13 ~~(2) The firearms range advisory committee members shall serve two-~~
14 ~~year terms with five new members being selected each year beginning~~
15 ~~with the third year of the committee's existence. The firearms range~~
16 ~~advisory committee members shall not receive compensation from the~~
17 ~~firearms range account. However, travel and per diem costs shall be~~
18 ~~paid consistent with regulations for state employees.~~

19 ~~(3) The interagency committee for outdoor recreation shall provide~~
20 ~~administrative, operational, and logistical support for the firearms~~
21 ~~range advisory committee.)) Expenses directly incurred for supporting~~
22 ~~((this)) the grant program in RCW 79A.25.210 may be charged by the~~
23 ~~interagency committee for outdoor recreation against the firearms range~~
24 ~~account. Expenses shall not exceed ten percent of the yearly income~~
25 ~~for the range account.~~

26 ~~((4)) (2) For the grant program in RCW 79A.25.210, the~~
27 ~~interagency committee for outdoor recreation shall ~~((in cooperation~~~~
28 ~~with the firearms range advisory committee)):~~

- 29 ~~(a) Develop an application process;~~
- 30 ~~(b) Develop an audit and accountability program;~~
- 31 ~~(c) Screen, prioritize, and approve grant applications; and~~
- 32 ~~(d) Monitor compliance by grant recipients.~~

33 ~~((5)) (3) The department of natural resources, the department of~~
34 ~~fish and wildlife, and the Washington military department are~~
35 ~~encouraged to provide land, facilitate land exchanges, and support the~~
36 ~~development of shooting range facilities.~~

1 PART 7

2 WATER TRAIL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

3 Sec. 701. RCW 79A.05.385 and 1993 c 182 s 2 are each amended to
4 read as follows:

5 In addition to its other powers, duties, and functions, the
6 commission may:

7 (1) Plan, construct, and maintain suitable facilities for water
8 trail activities on lands administered or acquired by the commission or
9 as authorized on lands administered by tribes or other public agencies
10 or private landowners by agreement.

11 (2) Provide and issue, upon payment of the proper fee, with the
12 assistance of those authorized agents as may be necessary for the
13 convenience of the public, water trail permits to utilize designated
14 water trail facilities. The commission may(~~(, after consultation with~~
15 ~~the water trail advisory committee,)~~) adopt rules authorizing
16 reciprocity of water trail permits provided by another state or
17 Canadian province, but only to the extent that a similar exemption or
18 provision for water trail permits is issued by that state or province.

19 (3) Compile, publish, distribute, and charge a fee for maps or
20 other forms of public information indicating areas and facilities
21 suitable for water trail activities.

22 (4) Contract with a public agency, private entity, or person for
23 the actual conduct of these duties.

24 (5) Work with individuals or organizations who wish to volunteer
25 their time to support the water trail recreation program.

26 Sec. 702. RCW 79A.05.400 and 1993 c 182 s 5 are each amended to
27 read as follows:

28 A person may not participate as a user of the water trail
29 recreation program without first obtaining a water trail permit. A
30 person must renew this permit on an annual basis in order to continue
31 to participate as a user of the program. The fee for the issuance of
32 the statewide water trail permit for each year shall be determined by
33 the commission (~~(after consultation with the water trail advisory~~
34 ~~committee)). All statewide water trail permits shall expire on the
35 last day of December of the year for which the permit is issued.~~

4 **Sec. 802.** RCW 79A.25.820 and 2000 c 11 s 81 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 Subject to available resources, the interagency committee for
7 outdoor recreation(~~(, in consultation with the community outdoor~~
8 ~~athletic fields advisory council)) may:~~) may:

9 (1) Prepare and update a strategic plan for the development,
10 maintenance, and improvement of community outdoor athletic fields in
11 the state. In the preparation of such plan, the interagency committee
12 for outdoor recreation may use available data from federal, state, and
13 local agencies having community outdoor athletic responsibilities, user
14 groups, private sector interests, and the general public. The plan may
15 include, but is not limited to:

- 16 (a) An inventory of current community outdoor athletic fields;
- 17 (b) A forecast of demand for these fields;
- 18 (c) An identification and analysis of actual and potential funding
19 sources; and
- 20 (d) Other information the interagency committee for outdoor
21 recreation deems appropriate to carry out the purposes of RCW
22 79A.25.800 through 79A.25.830;

23 (2) Determine the eligibility requirements for cities, counties,
24 and qualified nonprofit organizations to access funding from the youth
25 athletic facility (~~grant~~) account created in RCW 43.99N.060(4);

26 (3) Encourage and provide opportunities for interagency and
27 regional coordination and cooperative efforts between public agencies
28 and between public entities and nonprofit organizations involved in the
29 maintenance, development, and improvement of community outdoor athletic
30 fields; and

31 (4) Create and maintain data, studies, research, and other
32 information relating to community outdoor athletic fields in the state,
33 and to encourage the exchange of this information.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 803.** RCW 79A.25.810 (Community outdoor athletic
35 fields advisory council) and 2001 c 245 s 1 & 1998 c 264 s 2 are each
36 repealed.
