1 AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making supplemental
2 appropriations and authorizing expenditures for capital improvements;
3 amending 2002 c 238 ss 109 and 202 (uncodified); amending 2001 2nd
4 sp.s. c 8 s 158 (uncodified); adding new sections to 2001 2nd sp.s. c
5 8 (uncodified); repealing 2002 c 238 s 204 (uncodified); making
6 appropriations; and declaring an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to 2001 2nd sp.s. c

 18 follows:

19 **FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL ADMINISTRATION**

20 Legislative Building: Rehabilitation (01-1-008)

21 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
 22 conditions and limitations:

23 (1) The appropriations in this section are subject to the
 24 conditions and limitations of sections 902 and 903 of this act.

25 (2) The department of general administration, in consultation with
 26 the legislature, the governor, and the state capitol committee, shall
 27 immediately begin planning and initiate an accelerated
 28 design/construction schedule for the renovation of the state
 29 legislative building as follows:

30 (a) No new permanent buildings shall be constructed, and the
 31 department shall follow standards for historic preservation;

32 (b) The goal shall be to reoccupy the building in time for the 2005
 33 legislative session;

34 (c) The department shall make temporary accommodations for the
 35 displacement of legislators and legislative staff in the John L.

1 O'Brien building, the Pritchard building, the Cherberg building, and
2 the Newhouse building, and may use modular space. Decisions on the use
3 of space for the Pritchard building will be made by legislative
4 leadership by July 1, 2001, to make it available for use by the
5 legislature by April 1, 2002;

6 (d) The department shall temporarily move the state library from
7 the Pritchard building by October 1, 2001, and, if needed, the
8 department shall lease storage facilities in Thurston county for books
9 and other library assets;

10 (e) The department shall make temporary accommodations for other
11 tenants of the state legislative building as follows:

12 (i) The office of the insurance commissioner shall be temporarily
13 moved to leased space in Thurston county;

14 (ii) The office of the governor shall be moved to the Insurance
15 building;

16 (iii) The primary office of the code reviser and the lieutenant
17 governor shall be moved to a location on the west capitol campus; and

18 (iv) The other tenants, including the office of the state
19 treasurer, the office of the state auditor, and the office of the
20 secretary of state shall be moved to leased space in Thurston county;

21 (f) The state legislative building shall be completely vacated by
22 the office of the governor, the office of the secretary of state, the
23 office of treasurer, and the office of the state auditor by November 1,
24 2001, and by the legislature fourteen days after the end of the 2002
25 legislative session to make it available for renovation by the
26 contractor; and

27 (g) State contracts for the legislative building renovation,
28 Nisqually earthquake repair, and future earthquake mitigation shall
29 conform to all rules, regulations, and requirements of the federal
30 emergency management agency.

31 (3) The state capitol committee, in conjunction with a legislative
32 building renovation oversight committee consisting of two members from
33 both the house of representatives and senate, each appointed by
34 legislative leadership, shall periodically advise the department
35 regarding the rehabilitation, the receipt and use of private funds, and
36 other issues that may arise.

37 (4) The department shall report on the progress of accelerated
38 planning, design, and relocations related to the renovation of the

1 state legislative building to the legislature and the governor by July
2 15, 2001, and November 15, 2001, and shall consult with the legislature
3 and governor on major decisions including placement of the cafeteria
4 and exiting stairs in the legislative building by August 31, 2001.

5 (5) In the event of any conflicts between the conditions and
6 limitations in this section and section 3, chapter 123, Laws of 2001,
7 the conditions and limitations of this section shall apply.

8 ~~((6) \$154,000 of the capitol historic district construction
9 account appropriation is provided solely for the department of general
10 administration to contract for fund raising services for the
11 solicitation of charitable gifts, grants, or donations specifically for
12 the purpose of preservation and restoration of the state legislative
13 building and related educational exhibits and programs. By June 30,
14 2004, the amount provided by this subsection shall be reinvested to the
15 capitol historic district construction account from the proceeds of the
16 gifts, grants, and donations.))~~

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 8.** This act is necessary for the immediate
10 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
11 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
12 immediately.

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
