1 AN ACT Relating to motor vehicle fuel tax revenues attributable to  
2 certain counties to be spent within those counties; adding new sections  
3 to chapter 82.36 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 46.68 RCW; and  
4 providing an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 82.36 RCW  
7 to read as follows:

8 (1) The department of revenue shall determine the number of gallons  
9 of motor vehicle fuel and special fuel sold within each county that has  
10 a population greater than five hundred thousand.

11 (2) Businesses engaged in the retail sale of motor vehicle fuel, or  
12 special fuel as defined in RCW 82.38.020, located within counties  
13 subject to subsection (1) of this section, shall report the number of  
14 gallons sold each month to the department of revenue.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 82.36 RCW  
16 to read as follows:

17 Each quarter of the calendar year, the department of revenue shall

1 report the number of gallons of motor vehicle fuel and special fuel  
2 sold within the counties meeting the requirements of section 1(1) of  
3 this act to the department of transportation.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 46.68 RCW  
5 to read as follows:

6 The department of transportation shall expend motor vehicle fund  
7 revenues attributed to counties under sections 1 and 2 of this act  
8 within the boundaries of those counties.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** This act expires June 30, 2007.
