## HOUSE BILL 1424

State of Washington 58th Legislature 2003 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to subsidies for health benefit premiums; amending
- 2 RCW 41.05.085; adding a new section to chapter 41.05 RCW; creating a
- 3 new section; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the current
- 6 practice of providing health care premium subsidies for retired or
- 7 disabled school and state employees does not provide the fairness or
- 8 certainty necessary for family financial planning. In addition, the
- 9 current system makes it difficult for the legislature to obtain the
- 10 accurate and timely information necessary for appropriating funds.
- 11 Therefore, it is the intent of the legislature to establish a method of
- 12 determining subsidy amounts based on actual costs that provides
- 13 predictability for budget purposes and fairness and certainty for
- 14 families.
- 15 Sec. 2. RCW 41.05.085 and 1994 c 153 s 8 are each amended to read
- 16 as follows:
- Beginning with the appropriations act for the ((1995-1997)) 2003-
- 18 2005 biennium, the legislature shall establish as part of both the

- 1 state employees' and the school and educational service district
- 2 employees' insurance benefit allocation the portion of the allocation
- 3 to be used to provide a subsidy, <u>determined under section 3 of this</u>
- 4 <u>act</u>, to reduce the health care insurance premiums charged to retired or
- 5 disabled school district and educational service district employees, or
- 6 retired state employees, who are eligible for parts A and B of
- 7 medicare. The amount of any premium reduction shall be established by
- 8 the board in the manner set forth under section 3 of this act, but
- 9 shall not result in a premium reduction of more than fifty percent.
- 10 The board may also determine the amount of any subsidy to be available
- 11 to spouses and dependents.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 41.05 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (1)(a) Beginning January 1, 2004, and each January 1st thereafter,
- 15 a subsidy shall be provided to disabled or retired employees under RCW
- 16 41.05.085 as set forth in (b) of this subsection.
- 17 (b) The subsidy provided each January 1st shall be based on the
- 18 average of the actual costs from the preceding two years.
- 19 (c) The subsidy calculated under (b) of this subsection for any
- 20 fiscal year may never be lower than the subsidy for the preceding
- 21 fiscal year.
- 22 (2) In a manner prescribed by the authority, by rule, school
- 23 districts and educational service districts shall remit to the
- 24 authority for deposit into the public employees' and retirees'
- 25 insurance account an amount determined by the authority, by rule, for
- 26 each part-time and full-time employee.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate
- 28 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 29 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 30 immediately.
