- AN ACT Relating to equalizing salary allocations for certificated 1 2 instructional staff; and amending RCW 28A.150.410.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.150.410 and 2002 c 353 s 1 are each amended to 4 5 read as follows:
 - (1) The legislature shall establish for each school year in the appropriations act a statewide salary allocation schedule, allocation purposes only, to be used to distribute funds for basic education certificated instructional staff salaries under **RCW** 28A.150.260.
- (2) Salary allocations for state-funded basic education 11 certificated instructional staff shall be calculated by the 12 13 superintendent of public instruction by determining the district's average salary for certificated instructional staff, using the 14 15 statewide salary allocation schedule and related documents, conditions, 16 and limitations established by the omnibus appropriations act. Beginning September 1, 2005, and thereafter, the salary allocation for 17
- certificated instructional staff shall be determined using the same 18
- salary allocation schedule and derived base salary for all districts. 19

- (3) Beginning January 1, 1992, no more than ninety college quarter-hour credits received by any employee after the baccalaureate degree may be used to determine compensation allocations under the state salary allocation schedule and LEAP documents referenced in the omnibus appropriations act, or any replacement schedules and documents, unless:
 - (a) The employee has a masters degree; or

(b) The credits were used in generating state salary allocations before January 1, 1992.
