
SECOND SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1725

1 AN ACT Relating to catch record cards; and amending RCW 77.32.430
2 77.32.256, and 77.32.050.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.32.430 and 1998 c 191 s 5 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 Catch record cards necessary for proper management of the state's
7 food fish and game fish species and shellfish resources shall be
8 administered under rules adopted by the commission and issued at no
9 charge for the initial catch record card and ten dollars for each
10 subsequent catch record card. A duplicate catch record costs ten
11 dollars and shall be available only to individuals holding a full
12 season license. Catch record cards issued in conjunction with a
13 temporary short-term license are not subject to the provisions of this
14 section. Charterboat operations issuing temporary short-term licenses
15 shall affix a charterboat stamp to each catch record card issued before
16 fishing commences. The funds received from the sale of catch record
17 cards must be deposited into the wildlife fund. The commission shall
18 implement this section within available resources.

1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.32.256 and 2002 c 222 s 1 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 The director shall by rule establish the conditions and fees for
4 issuance of duplicate licenses, rebates, permits, tags, and stamps
5 required by this chapter. The fee for duplicate licenses, rebates,
6 permits, tags, and stamps, except catch record cards, may not exceed
7 the actual cost to the department for issuing the duplicate.

8 **Sec. 3.** RCW 77.32.050 and 2000 c 107 s 266 are each amended to
9 read as follows:

10 All recreational licenses, permits, catch record cards, tags, and
11 stamps required by this title and raffle tickets authorized under
12 chapter 77.12 RCW shall be issued under the authority of the
13 commission. The commission shall adopt rules for the issuance of
14 recreational licenses, permits, catch record cards, tags, stamps, and
15 raffle tickets, and for the collection, payment, and handling of
16 license fees, terms and conditions to govern dealers, and dealers'
17 fees. A transaction fee on recreational (~~(licenses)~~) documents issued
18 through an automated licensing system may be set by the commission and
19 collected from licensees. The department may authorize all or part of
20 such fee to be paid directly to a contractor providing automated
21 licensing system services. Fees retained by dealers shall be uniform
22 throughout the state. The department shall authorize dealers to
23 collect and retain dealer fees of at least two dollars for purchase of
24 a standard hunting or fishing recreational license document, except
25 that the commission may set a lower dealer fee for issuance of tags or
26 when a licensee buys a license that involves a stamp or display card
27 format rather than a standard department licensing document form.

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
