- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 7 early intervention services: (1) Produces immediate and long-term 8 improvements for children and families; and (2) avoids future public

The legislature finds that investment in effective prevention and

- 9 costs in education, child welfare, substance abuse, health, and mental
- 10 health treatment, law enforcement and the courts, and juvenile and
- 11 adult corrections. The legislature further finds that state agencies
- 12 receiving funds for prevention and early intervention services should

- 2 state-operated or contracted. The criteria must require that funded
- 3 programs, at a minimum: (a) Define clear, measurable outcomes; (b)
- 4 identify research that may be applicable; (c) identify anticipated
- 5 cost-effectiveness; (d) describe broad community involvement, support,
- 6 and partnerships; and (e) provide data related to program outcomes.
- 7 (2) The children's administration shall collect and analyze the 8 program data and make the data and the analysis available for public
- 9 review.
- 10 (3) For the purposes of this section, "prevention and early
- 11 intervention services and programs" shall include, but not be limited
- 12 to, the following or their successors:
- 13 (a) Alternate response system;
- 14 (b) Family reconciliation services;
- 15 (c) Family preservation services;
- 16 (d) Intensive family preservation services;
- (e) Continuum of care;
- 18 (f) Community public health and safety networks;
- 19 (g) Parent trust programs; and
- 20 (h) Public health nurse early intervention program.
- 21 (4) The children's administration shall incorporate the funding
- 22 criteria into contracts and operating procedures within existing

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW
- 25 to read as follows:
- Nothing in this act shall be construed to create:
- 27 (1) An entitlement to services;
- 28 (2) Judicial authority to order the provision of services to any
- 29 person or family if the services are unavailable or unsuitable, or the
- 30 child or family is not eligible for such services; or
- 31 (3) A private right of action or claim on the part of any
- 32 individual, entity, or agency.
- 33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW
- 34 to read as follows:
- 35 The legislature encourages other administrations within the

- 2 funding prevention and early intervention services to identify and
- 3 implement the funding criteria provided in section 2 of this act.
