4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that education is the fundamental building block of a democracy and that education must be extended to all Washington students in a way that encourages and supports higher achievement levels and lifelong learning. Education provides the state's citizens with the capacity, knowledge, and skills to foster a thriving economy and to provide the foundation for a harmonious society.

The legislature finds further that a comprehensive, coherent, integrated, and flexible approach to education from preschool through college is the best means to be responsive to Washington's needs. The legislature intends to develop a P-16 governance structure to improve student flow and raise student achievement through improved collaboration and coordination across education levels. Components of Washington's P-16 system should include early care and education programs, grades kindergarten through ten, and grades eleven through

- 1 sixteen, including career and technical education, and adult education.
- 2 The system should incorporate clear standards, aligned and rigorous
- 3 curricula, effective assessments, clear expectations, and widely shared
