1            AN ACT Relating to the number of voters in a precinct; and amending  
2            RCW 29.04.040.

3            BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 29.04.040 and 1999 c 158 s 3 are each amended to read  
5            as follows:

6            (1) ~~((No paper ballot precinct may contain more than three hundred  
7            active registered voters.))~~ The county legislative authority may  
8            divide, alter, or combine precincts ~~((so that,))~~ whenever  
9            practicable ~~((, over populated precincts shall contain no more than two  
10            hundred fifty active registered voters in anticipation of future  
11            growth)).~~

12            ~~((2))~~ Precinct boundaries may be altered at any time as long as  
13            sufficient time exists prior to a given election for the necessary  
14            procedural steps to be honored. Except as permitted under subsection  
15            ~~((5))~~ (4) of this section, no precinct boundaries may be changed  
16            during the period starting on the thirtieth day prior to the first day  
17            for candidates to file for the primary election and ending with the day  
18            of the general election.

1        ~~((3) Precincts in which voting machines or electronic voting~~  
2 ~~devices are used may contain as many as nine hundred active registered~~  
3 ~~voters.))~~

4        (2) The number of poll-site ballot counting devices at each polling  
5 place is at the discretion of the auditor. The number of devices must  
6 be adequate to meet the expected voter turnout.

7        ~~((4))~~ (3) On petition of twenty-five or more voters resident more  
8 than ten miles from any polling site, the county legislative authority  
9 shall establish a separate voting precinct therefor.

10       ~~((5))~~ (4) The county auditor shall temporarily adjust precinct  
11 boundaries when a city or town annexes unincorporated territory to the  
12 city or town. The adjustment shall be made as soon as possible after  
13 the approval of the annexation. The temporary adjustment shall be  
14 limited to the minimum changes necessary to accommodate the addition of  
15 the territory to the city or town and shall remain in effect only until  
16 precinct boundary modifications reflecting the annexation are adopted  
17 by the county legislative authority.

18       The county legislative authority may establish by ordinance a  
19 limitation on the maximum number of active registered voters in each  
20 precinct within its jurisdiction. The limitation may be different for  
21 precincts based upon the method of voting used for such precincts ~~((and~~  
22 ~~the number may be less than the number established by law, but in no~~  
23 ~~case may the number exceed that authorized by law))~~.

24       The county legislative authority of each county in the state  
25 hereafter formed shall, at their first session, divide their respective  
26 counties into election precincts ~~((with two hundred fifty active~~  
27 ~~registered voters or less))~~ and establish the boundaries of the  
28 precincts. The county auditor shall thereupon designate the voting  
29 place for each such precinct.

30       ~~((6))~~ (5) In determining the number of active registered voters  
31 for the purposes of this section, persons who are ongoing absentee  
32 voters under RCW ~~((29.36.013))~~ 29.36.240 shall not be counted. Nothing  
33 in this subsection may be construed as altering the vote tallying  
34 requirements of RCW 29.62.090.

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
