- AN ACT Relating to a special snowmobile license plate; amending RCW 1
- 2 46.10.075, 46.16.313, 46.16.233, and 46.16.316; adding a new section to
- 3 chapter 46.04 RCW; and adding a new section to chapter 46.16 RCW.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 4
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW
- to read as follows: 6
- "Snowmobile license plate series" means a license plate design 7
- 8 displaying a colorful image across the entire background of the license
- plate, capturing the essence of snowmobiling in Washington state. 9
- 10 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 46.16 RCW
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 The department shall work with the Washington state snowmobile
- association, the Washington state patrol, and the Washington state 13
- 14 parks and recreation commission to create and design a special
- snowmobile license plate that may be used in lieu of regular or 15
- personalized license plates for motor vehicles required to display two 16
- motor vehicle license plates, excluding vehicles registered under 17

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- 1 chapter 46.87 RCW, upon terms and conditions established by the
- 2 department. The special plates will capture the essence of
- 3 snowmobiling in Washington state.

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- 4 Sec. 3. RCW 46.10.075 and 1991 sp.s. c 13 s 9 are each amended to read as follows:
  - (1) There is created a snowmobile account within the state treasury. Snowmobile registration fees, monetary civil penalties from snowmobile dealers, revenue generated from the sale of the special snowmobile license plates under RCW 46.16.313 (6) and (7), and snowmobile fuel tax moneys collected under this chapter and in excess of the amounts fixed for the administration of the registration and fuel tax provisions of this chapter shall be deposited in the snowmobile account and shall be appropriated only to the state parks and recreation commission for the administration and coordination of this chapter.
- 16 (2) Revenue generated from the sale of the special snowmobile license plates under RCW 46.16.313 (6) and (7) must be used to support 17 the acquisition of snowmobile snoparks, either through purchase or 18 long-term lease agreements. If there are no expenditures of this 19 20 revenue over a five-year period, the revenue may be expended for a different component of the snowmobile program, including but not 21 limited to capital equipment and safety programs, as determined and 22 recommended by the snowmobile advisory committee. 23
- 24 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.16.313 and 1997 c 291 s 8 are each amended to read 25 as follows:
- (1) The department may establish a fee of no more than forty 26 dollars for each type of special license plates issued under RCW 27 46.16.301(1) (a), (b), or (c), as existing before amendment by section 28 5, chapter 291, Laws of 1997, in an amount calculated to offset the 29 30 cost of production of the special license plates and the administration of this program. ((Until December 31, 1997, the fee shall not exceed 31 thirty five dollars, but effective with vehicle registrations due or to 32 33 become due on January 1, 1998, the department may adjust the fee to no 34 more than forty dollars.)) This fee is in addition to all other fees 35 required to register and license the vehicle for which the plates have

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been requested. All such additional special license plate fees collected by the department shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the motor vehicle fund.

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- (2) ((Until December 31, 1997, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application, registration, and renewal registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a collegiate license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890.
- (3) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on January 1, 1998,)) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a collegiate license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890.
- ((4) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 1, 1999,)) (3) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a collegiate license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be remitted to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report. The state treasurer shall credit the funds to the appropriate collegiate license plate fund as provided in RCW 28B.10.890.
- ((+5))) (4) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a special baseball stadium license plate shall pay an initial fee of

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forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds, minus the cost of plate production, shall be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund.

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(((6) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January 1, 1999,)) (5) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a special baseball stadium license plate shall pay a fee of thirty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The remaining proceeds shall be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund.

(6) Effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on January 1, 2004, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application and registration of a motor vehicle, the holder of a snowmobile license plate shall pay an initial fee of forty dollars. The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars of each fee collected under this subsection for administration and collection expenses incurred by it. The department shall remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state treasurer, who shall credit the remaining funds to the snowmobile account created in RCW 46.10.075.

(7) Effective with annual renewals due or to become due on January
1, 2005, in addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon
renewal of a motor vehicle registration, the holder of a snowmobile
license plate shall, upon application, pay a fee of thirty dollars.
The department shall deduct an amount not to exceed two dollars of each

- 2 expenses incurred by it. The department shall remit the remaining
- 3 proceeds to the custody of the state treasurer, who shall credit the
- 4 remaining funds to the snowmobile account.

- 5 Sec. 5. RCW 46.16.233 and 2000 c 37 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
  - (1) Except for those license plates issued under RCW 46.16.305(1) before January 1, 1987, under RCW 46.16.305(3), and to commercial vehicles with a gross weight in excess of twenty-six thousand pounds, effective with vehicle registrations due or to become due on January 1, 2001, the appearance of the background of all vehicle license plates may vary in color and design but must be ((issued on a standard background)) legible and clearly identifiable as a snowmobile plate, as designated by the department.
  - (2) Additionally, to ensure maximum legibility and reflectivity, the department shall periodically provide for the replacement of license plates, except for commercial vehicles with a gross weight in excess of twenty-six thousand pounds. Frequency of replacement shall be established in accordance with empirical studies documenting the longevity of the reflective materials used to make license plates.
- **Sec. 6.** RCW 46.16.316 and 1997 c 291 s 10 are each amended to read 22 as follows:

Except as provided in RCW 46.16.305:

(1) When a person who has been issued a special license plate or plates under section 2 of this act or RCW 46.16.301 as it existed before amendment by section 5, chapter 291, Laws of 1997, sells, trades, or otherwise transfers or releases ownership of the vehicle upon which the special license plate or plates have been displayed, he or she shall immediately report the transfer of such plate or plates to an acquired vehicle or vehicle eligible for such plates pursuant to departmental rule, or he or she shall surrender such plates to the department immediately if such surrender is required by departmental rule. If a person applies for a transfer of the plate or plates to another eligible vehicle, a transfer fee of five dollars shall be charged in addition to all other applicable fees. Such transfer fees

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shall be deposited in the motor vehicle fund. Failure to surrender the plates when required is a traffic infraction.

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5 6 (2) If the special license plate or plates issued by the department become lost, defaced, damaged, or destroyed, application for a replacement special license plate or plates shall be made and fees paid as provided by law for the replacement of regular license plates.

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
