9 **REBUILDING FAMILIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 301.** By July 1, 2003, the secretary of the
11 department of corrections shall abolish the rebuilding families
12 advisory committee.

13 **PART 4**

14 **INDEPENDENT LIVING ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 401.** By July 1, 2003, the director of the
16 department of services for the blind shall abolish the independent
17 living advisory committee.

19 **OCEAN SPOT SHRIMP EMERGING FISHERY ADVISORY BOARD**

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 501.** By July 1, 2003, the director of the
21 department of fish and wildlife shall abolish the ocean spot shrimp
22 emerging fishery advisory board.

23 **PART 6**

24 **WATER TRAIL ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

25 **Sec. 601.** RCW 79A.05.385 and 1993 c 182 s 2 are each amended to
26 read as follows:

27 In addition to its other powers, duties, and functions, the
28 commission may:

- 29 (1) Plan, construct, and maintain suitable facilities for water

1 trail activities on lands administered or acquired by the commission or
2 as authorized on lands administered by tribes or other public agencies
3 or private landowners by agreement.

4 (2) Provide and issue, upon payment of the proper fee, with the
5 assistance of those authorized agents as may be necessary for the
6 convenience of the public, water trail permits to utilize designated
7 water trail facilities. The commission may(~~(, after consultation with~~
8 ~~the water trail advisory committee,~~) adopt rules authorizing
9 reciprocity of water trail permits provided by another state or
10 Canadian province, but only to the extent that a similar exemption or
11 provision for water trail permits is issued by that state or province.

12 (3) Compile, publish, distribute, and charge a fee for maps or
13 other forms of public information indicating areas and facilities
14 suitable for water trail activities.

15 (4) Contract with a public agency, private entity, or person for
16 the actual conduct of these duties.

17 (5) Work with individuals or organizations who wish to volunteer
18 their time to support the water trail recreation program.

19 **Sec. 602.** RCW 79A.05.400 and 1993 c 182 s 5 are each amended to
20 read as follows:

21 A person may not participate as a user of the water trail
22 recreation program without first obtaining a water trail permit. A
23 person must renew this permit on an annual basis in order to continue
24 to participate as a user of the program. The fee for the issuance of
25 the statewide water trail permit for each year shall be determined by
26 the commission (~~(after consultation with the water trail advisory~~
27 ~~committee)). All statewide water trail permits shall expire on the
28 last day of December of the year for which the permit is issued.~~

29 **Sec. 603.** RCW 79A.05.410 and 1993 c 182 s 7 are each amended to
30 read as follows:

31 The commission may(~~(, after consultation with the water trail~~
32 ~~advisory committee,~~) adopt rules to administer the water trail program
33 and facilities on areas owned or administered by the commission. Where
34 water trail facilities administered by other public or private entities
35 are incorporated into the water trail system, the rules adopted by

1 those entities shall prevail. The commission is not responsible or
2 liable for enforcement of these alternative rules.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 604.** RCW 79A.05.420 (Water trail advisory
4 committee) and 2000 c 11 s 41, 1994 c 264 s 21, & 1993 c 182 s 9 are
5 each repealed.

6 **PART 7**
7 **COMMUNITY OUTDOOR ATHLETIC FIELDS ADVISORY COUNCIL**

8 **Sec. 701.** RCW 79A.25.800 and 2000 c 11 s 80 are each amended to
9 read as follows:

10 (1) The legislature recognizes that coordinated funding efforts are
11 needed to maintain, develop, and improve the state's community outdoor
12 athletic fields. Rapid population growth and increased urbanization
13 have caused a decline in suitable outdoor fields for community athletic
14 activities and has resulted in overcrowding and deterioration of
15 existing surfaces. Lack of adequate community outdoor athletic fields
16 directly affects the health and well-being of all citizens of the
17 state, reduces the state's economic viability, and prevents Washington
18 from maintaining and achieving the quality of life that it deserves.
19 Therefore, it is the policy of the state and its agencies to maintain,
20 develop, fund, and improve youth or community athletic facilities,
21 including but not limited to community outdoor athletic fields.

22 (2) In carrying out this policy, the legislature intends to promote
23 the building of new community outdoor athletic fields, the upgrading of
24 existing community outdoor athletic fields, and the maintenance of
25 existing community outdoor athletic fields across the state of
26 Washington. (~~The purpose of RCW 79A.25.800 through 79A.25.830 is to~~
27 ~~create an advisory council to provide information and advice to the~~
28 ~~interagency committee for outdoor recreation in the distribution of the~~
29 ~~funds in the youth athletic facility grant account established in RCW~~
30 ~~43.99N.060(4).)~~)

31 **Sec. 702.** RCW 79A.25.820 and 2000 c 11 s 81 are each amended to
32 read as follows:

33 Subject to available resources, the interagency committee for

1 outdoor recreation(~~(, in consultation with the community outdoor~~
2 ~~athletic fields advisory council)) may:~~

3 (1) Prepare and update a strategic plan for the development,
4 maintenance, and improvement of community outdoor athletic fields in
5 the state. In the preparation of such plan, the interagency committee
6 for outdoor recreation may use available data from federal, state, and
7 local agencies having community outdoor athletic responsibilities, user
8 groups, private sector interests, and the general public. The plan may
9 include, but is not limited to:

- 10 (a) An inventory of current community outdoor athletic fields;
- 11 (b) A forecast of demand for these fields;
- 12 (c) An identification and analysis of actual and potential funding
13 sources; and
- 14 (d) Other information the interagency committee for outdoor
15 recreation deems appropriate to carry out the purposes of RCW
16 79A.25.800 through 79A.25.830;

17 (2) Determine the eligibility requirements for cities, counties,
18 and qualified nonprofit organizations to access funding from the youth
19 athletic facility (~~grant~~) account created in RCW 43.99N.060(4);

20 (3) Encourage and provide opportunities for interagency and
21 regional coordination and cooperative efforts between public agencies
22 and between public entities and nonprofit organizations involved in the
23 maintenance, development, and improvement of community outdoor athletic
24 fields; and

25 (4) Create and maintain data, studies, research, and other
26 information relating to community outdoor athletic fields in the state,
27 and to encourage the exchange of this information.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 703.** RCW 79A.25.810 (Community outdoor athletic
29 fields advisory council) and 2001 c 245 s 1 & 1998 c 264 s 2 are each
30 repealed.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 801.** By July 1, 2003, the secretary of the
34 department of health shall abolish the arthritis advisory group.
