- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 34.05 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- After January 1, 2004, no agency may adopt a rule that exceeds a federal standard without specific legislative authority. The legislature may grant such authority pursuant to a request by an agency. A requesting agency shall present to the appropriate standing
- 11 committees of the house of representatives and the senate:
- 12 (1) A written justification detailing the unique reasons why 13 Washington state policy must exceed federal policy; and
- 14 (2) A cost-benefit analysis that clearly outlines the economic 15 impacts for Washington's business or other regulated entities.
