1 AN ACT Relating to transportation funding and appropriations;
2 creating new sections; making appropriations and authorizing
3 expenditures for capital improvements; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **2003-05 BIENNIUM**

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The transportation budget of the state
7 is hereby adopted and, subject to the provisions set forth, the several
8 amounts specified, or as much thereof as may be necessary to accomplish
9 the purposes designated, are hereby appropriated from the several
10 accounts and funds named to the designated state agencies and offices
11 for employee compensation and other expenses, for capital projects, and
12 for other specified purposes, including the payment of any final
13 judgments arising out of such activities, for the period ending June
14 30, 2005.

15 (2) Legislation with fiscal impacts enacted in the 2003 legislative
16 session not assumed in this act are not funded in the 2003-05
17 transportation budget.

1 (3) Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions
2 in this subsection apply throughout this act.

3 (a) "Fiscal year 2004" or "FY 2004" means the fiscal year ending
4 June 30, 2004.

5 (b) "Fiscal year 2005" or "FY 2005" means the fiscal year ending
6 June 30, 2005.

7 (c) "FTE" means full-time equivalent.

8 (d) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
9 unappropriated status.

10 (e) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only
11 for the specified purpose.

3 budget.

26 **AND INTEREST, AND ONGOING BOND REGISTRATION AND TRANSFER CHARGES: FOR**
27 **MVFT BONDS AND TRANSFERS**

28 Motor Vehicle Account--State Appropriation:
29 For transfer to the Tacoma Narrows toll bridge
30 account \$800,000,000

31 The department of transportation is authorized to sell up to
32 \$800,000,000 in bonds authorized by RCW 47.10.843 for the Tacoma
33 Narrows bridge project. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds shall be

7 The appropriation in this section shall be expended solely for the
8 purposes designated in this section and is subject to the following
9 conditions and limitations: Funding is provided solely for legislative

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 408. FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF RETIREMENT SYSTEMS--**
12 **TRANSFERS**

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 409. FOR THE OFFICE OF FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT--**
18 **CONTRIBUTIONS TO RETIREMENT SYSTEMS**

19 Motor Vehicle Account--State Appropriation \$5,000

20 The appropriation in this section is provided solely to fund
21 pension contributions to the public employees' retirement system and
22 teachers' retirement systems for judicial and legislative employees,
23 effective July 1, 2003.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 410. STATUTORY APPROPRIATIONS.** In addition to
25 the amounts appropriated in this act for revenue for distribution,
26 state contributions to the law enforcement officers' and fire fighters'
27 retirement system, and bond retirement and interest including ongoing
28 bond registration and transfer charges, transfers, interest on
29 registered warrants, and certificates of indebtedness, there is also
30 appropriated such further amounts as may be required or available for
31 these purposes under any statutory formula or under any proper bond
32 covenant made under law.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 411.** The department of transportation is
2 authorized to undertake federal advance construction projects under the
3 provisions of 23 U.S.C. Sec. 115 in order to maintain progress in
4 meeting approved highway construction and preservation objectives. The
5 legislature recognizes that the use of state funds may be required to
6 temporarily fund expenditures of the federal appropriations for the
7 highway construction and preservation programs for federal advance
8 construction projects prior to conversion to federal funding.

9 **PROVISIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT APPROPRIATIONS**

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 501.** The director of financial management may
11 authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a capital
12 project that is in excess of the amount required for such project to
13 another capital project for which the appropriation is insufficient.
14 No such transfer may be used to expand or limit the scope of the
15 project beyond that intended by the legislature in making the
16 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
17 appropriations to a specific department or agency.

18 For purposes of this section, the director of financial management
19 may find that an amount is in excess of the amount required for a
20 project only if: (1) The project defined in the notes to the budget
21 document is substantially complete and there are funds remaining; (2)
22 bids have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial
23 certainty that the project as defined in the notes to the budget
24 document can be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
25 appropriated in this act; or (3) the secretary of transportation
26 determines that the project is sufficiently delayed so that the
27 appropriation provided for the project is in excess of the amount
28 projected to be spent during the current biennium.

29 For the purposes of this section, the legislature intends that each
30 project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's
31 budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative history
32 that the legislature intended to define the scope of a project in a
33 different way.

34 A report of any transfer in excess of five million dollars effected

1 under this section shall be filed with the transportation committees of
2 the senate and the house of representatives by the office of financial
3 management within thirty days from the date of transfer.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 502.** The department of transportation shall
5 maximize the use of state, federal, and local funds to implement the
6 provisions of this act. Appropriations shall initially be allotted as
7 appropriated by this act. Notwithstanding section 501 of this act,
8 subsequent allotment modifications shall not permit moneys that are
9 provided solely for a specified purpose to be used for other than that
10 specified purpose. After approval by the director of the office of
11 financial management and unless specifically prohibited by this act,
12 the department may transfer appropriations between the motor vehicle
13 account--state, motor vehicle account--federal, and motor vehicle
14 account--private/local appropriations and between the multimodal
15 transportation account--state, multimodal transportation account--
16 federal, and multimodal account--local appropriations. However, the
17 department shall not expend more than the total amount appropriated for
18 both these accounts.

19 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 503.** If any provision of this act or its
20 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
21 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
22 persons or circumstances is not affected.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 504.** This act is necessary for the immediate
24 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
25 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
26 immediately.

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
