- 1 AN ACT Relating to drivers' licenses issued to those serving in the 2 armed forces; and amending RCW 46.20.027.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.027 and 2002 c 292 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 5 as follows: 6 A Washington state motor vehicle driver's license issued to any

service member if valid and in force and effect while such person is

- 8 serving in the armed forces, shall remain in full force and effect so
- 9 long as such service continues unless the same is sooner suspended,
- 10 canceled, or revoked for cause as provided by law and for not to exceed
- 11 ninety days following the date on which the holder of such driver's
- 12 license is honorably separated from service in the armed forces of the
- 13 United States. A Washington state driver's license issued to the
- 14 spouse or dependent child of such service member likewise remains in
- 15 full force and effect if the person is residing with the service
- 16 member.

- For purposes of this section, "service member" means every person
- 18 serving in the armed forces ((whose branch of service as of the date of
- 19 application for the driver's license is included in the definition of

- 1 veteran pursuant to RCW 41.04.007 or the person will meet the
- 2 definition of veteran at the time of discharge)), including those
- 3 serving in the armed forces reserves, National Guard, or Coast Guard
- 4 regardless of whether or not they have been called into federal service
- 5 <u>by a presidential select reserve call up</u>.
