- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.150.220 and 1993 c 371 s 2 are each amended to read as follows:
 - (1) Satisfaction of the basic education program requirements identified in RCW 28A.150.210 shall be considered to be implemented by the following program:
 - (a) Each school district shall make available to students enrolled in kindergarten at least a total instructional offering of four hundred fifty hours. The program shall include instruction in the essential academic learning requirements under RCW ((28A.630.885)) 28A.655.060 and such other subjects and such activities as the school district shall determine to be appropriate for the education of the school district's students enrolled in such program;
- 16 (b) Each school district shall make available to students enrolled 17 in grades one through twelve, at least a district-wide annual average 18 total instructional hour offering of one thousand hours. The state 19 board of education may define alternatives to classroom instructional

- time for students in grades nine through twelve enrolled in alternative 1 2 learning experiences. The state board of education shall establish rules to determine annual average instructional hours for districts 3 including fewer than twelve grades. The program shall include the 4 essential academic learning requirements under RCW ((28A.630.885)) 5 28A.655.060 and such other subjects and such activities as the school 6 7 district shall determine to be appropriate for the education of the school district's students enrolled in such group; 8
 - (c) If the essential academic learning requirements include a requirement of languages other than English, the requirement may be met by students receiving instruction in one or more American Indian languages.
 - (2) Nothing contained in subsection (1) of this section shall be construed to require individual students to attend school for any particular number of hours per day or to take any particular courses.
 - (3)(a) Each school district's kindergarten through twelfth grade basic educational program shall be accessible to all students who are five years of age, as provided by RCW 28A.225.160, and less than twenty-one years of age and shall consist of a minimum of one hundred eighty school days per school year in such grades as are conducted by a school district, and one hundred eighty half-days of instruction, or equivalent, in kindergarten((: PROVIDED, That effective May 1, 1979,)). A school district may schedule the last five school days of the one hundred and eighty day school year for noninstructional purposes in the case of students who are graduating from high school, including, but not limited to, the observance of graduation and early release from school upon the request of a student, and all such students may be claimed as a full time equivalent student to the extent they could otherwise have been so claimed for the purposes of RCW 28A.150.250 and 28A.150.260. Up to five additional days may be forgone for graduating seniors in the event of school days canceled due to district-wide or school emergency closures.
 - (b) The definitions in this subsection (3)(b) apply throughout this subsection (3).
- (i) "District-wide emergency closure" means that all school buildings in the school district are unsafe, unhealthy, inaccessible, or inoperative due to one or more unforeseen natural events, mechanical failures, or actions or inactions by one or more persons.
