- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28A.235 RCW to read as follows: 6
  - (1) Before any child in preschool through fifth grade is allowed to work or help in a school kitchen, a parental/quardian permission slip that details the duties and responsibilities, as well as the potential risks to the student, must be signed and returned to appropriate food service management.
  - (2) The superintendent of public instruction, in consultation with the Washington state school directors' association, parents, and representatives of food service employee groups, shall develop a policy to be implemented in all elementary schools for protecting children in preschool through fifth grade who assist in school kitchens. The policy must:

- (a) Regulate exposure to hazardous equipment that is no less 18

stringent than restrictions adopted by the department of labor and industries for minors;

- (b) Determine age-appropriate standards for physical activities including, but not limited to, lifting, pushing, or moving crates, carts, or other heavy equipment, consistent with federal occupational safety and health administration standards;
- (c) Require that any injury requiring medical attention to a preschool through fifth grade student who is injured while working in a school kitchen be reported to the office of the superintendent of public instruction; and
  - (d) Require age-appropriate training.

12 (3) By January 1, 2004, the superintendent of public instruction 13 shall verify that all districts are implementing the policy and report 14 to the legislature.
