1 AN ACT Relating to traffic control signal preemption devices;
2 amending RCW 46.37.190 and 46.63.020; reenacting and amending RCW
3 9.94A.515; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; adding a new
4 section to chapter 46.61 RCW; prescribing penalties; and providing an
5 effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW
8 to read as follows:

9 "Signal preemption device" means a device that is capable of
10 altering the normal operation of a traffic control signal.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.61 RCW
12 to read as follows:

13 (1) Signal preemption devices shall not be installed or used on or
14 with any vehicle other than an emergency vehicle authorized by the
15 state patrol, a publicly owned law enforcement or emergency vehicle, a
16 department of transportation, city, or county maintenance vehicle, or
17 a public transit vehicle.

18 (2) It is unlawful to do any of the following:

1 (a) Possess a signal preemption device except as authorized in
2 subsection (4) of this section;

3 (b) Use a signal preemption device except as authorized in
4 subsection (4) of this section;

5 (c) Sell a signal preemption device to a person other than a person
6 described in subsection (4) of this section;

7 (d) Purchase a signal preemption device for use other than a duty
8 as described in subsection (4) of this section.

9 (3)(a) A person who violates subsection (2)(a) of this section is
10 guilty of a misdemeanor unless (c) of this subsection applies.

11 (b) A person who violates subsection (2)(b), (c), or (d) of this
12 section is guilty of a gross misdemeanor unless (c) of this subsection
13 applies.

14 (c)(i) A person who violates subsection (2) of this section, which
15 violation results in a traffic accident, is guilty of a class C felony.

16 (ii) A person who violates subsection (2) of this section, which
17 violation results in substantial bodily harm, is guilty of a class B
18 felony.

19 (iii) A person who violates subsection (2) of this section, which
20 violation results in the death of another, is guilty of a class B
21 felony.

22 (4) This section does not apply to any of the following:

23 (a) A law enforcement agency and law enforcement personnel in the
24 course of providing law enforcement services;

25 (b) A fire station or a fire fighter in the course of providing
26 fire prevention or fire extinguishing services;

27 (c) An emergency medical service or ambulance in the course of
28 providing emergency medical transportation or ambulance services;

29 (d) An operator, passenger, or owner of an authorized emergency
30 vehicle in the course of his or her emergency duties;

31 (e) Department of transportation, city, or county maintenance
32 personnel while performing maintenance;

33 (f) Public transit personnel in the performance of their duties;

34 (g) A mail or package delivery service or employee or agent of a
35 mail or package delivery service in the course of shipping or
36 delivering a signal preemption device;

37 (h) An employee or agent of a signal preemption device manufacturer

1 or retailer in the course of his or her employment in providing,
2 selling, manufacturing, or transporting a signal preemption device to
3 an individual or agency described in this subsection.

4 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.37.190 and 1993 c 401 s 2 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) Every authorized emergency vehicle shall, in addition to any
7 other equipment and distinctive marking required by this chapter, be
8 equipped with at least one lamp capable of displaying a red light
9 visible from at least five hundred feet in normal sunlight and a siren
10 capable of giving an audible signal.

11 (2) Every school bus and private carrier bus shall, in addition to
12 any other equipment and distinctive markings required by this chapter,
13 be equipped with a "stop" signal upon a background not less than
14 fourteen by eighteen inches displaying the word "stop" in letters of
15 distinctly contrasting colors not less than eight inches high, and
16 shall further be equipped with signal lamps mounted as high and as
17 widely spaced laterally as practicable, which shall be capable of
18 displaying to the front two alternately flashing red lights located at
19 the same level and to the rear two alternately flashing red lights
20 located at the same level and these lights shall have sufficient
21 intensity to be visible at five hundred feet in normal sunlight.

22 (3) Vehicles operated by public agencies whose law enforcement
23 duties include the authority to stop and detain motor vehicles on the
24 public highways of the state may be equipped with a siren and lights of
25 a color and type designated by the state patrol for that purpose. The
26 state patrol may prohibit the use of these sirens and lights on
27 vehicles other than the vehicles described in this subsection.

28 (4) The lights described in this section shall not be mounted nor
29 used on any vehicle other than a school bus, a private carrier bus, or
30 an authorized emergency or law enforcement vehicle. ~~((Optical strobe
31 light devices shall not be installed or used on any vehicle other than
32 an emergency vehicle authorized by the state patrol, a publicly owned
33 law enforcement or emergency vehicle, a department of transportation,
34 city, or county maintenance vehicle, or a public transit vehicle.~~

35 ~~(a) An "optical strobe light device" used by emergency vehicles
36 means a strobe light device which emits an optical signal at a specific~~

1 ~~frequency to a traffic control light enabling the emergency vehicle in~~
2 ~~which the strobe light device is used to obtain the right of way at~~
3 ~~intersections.~~

4 ~~(b) An "optical strobe light device" used by department of~~
5 ~~transportation, city, or county maintenance vehicles means a strobe~~
6 ~~light device that emits an optical signal at a specific frequency to a~~
7 ~~traffic control light enabling the department of transportation~~
8 ~~maintenance vehicle in which the strobe light device is used to perform~~
9 ~~maintenance tests.~~

10 ~~(c) An "optical strobe light device" used by public transit~~
11 ~~vehicles means a strobe light device that emits an optical signal at a~~
12 ~~specific frequency to a traffic control light enabling the public~~
13 ~~transit vehicle in which the strobe light device is used to accelerate~~
14 ~~the cycle of the traffic control light. For the purposes of this~~
15 ~~section, "public transit vehicle" means vehicles, owned by a~~
16 ~~governmental entity, with a seating capacity for twenty five or more~~
17 ~~persons and used to provide mass transportation. Public transit~~
18 ~~vehicles operating an optical strobe light will have second degree~~
19 ~~priority to emergency vehicles when simultaneously approaching the same~~
20 ~~traffic control light.))~~

21 (5) The use of the signal equipment described ((herein)) in this
22 section and section 2 of this act, except the ((optical strobe light))
23 signal preemption devices used by public transit vehicles and
24 department of transportation, city, or county maintenance vehicles that
25 are not used in conjunction with emergency equipment, shall impose upon
26 drivers of other vehicles the obligation to yield right of way and stop
27 as prescribed in RCW 46.61.210, 46.61.370, and 46.61.350.
