1 AN ACT Relating to proof of financial responsibility or motor
2 vehicle liability insurance; and amending RCW 46.16.212, 46.16.210, and
3 46.30.040.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.16.212 and 1989 c 353 s 10 are each amended to read
6 as follows:

7 (1) The department of licensing shall notify the public of the
8 requirements of RCW 46.30.020 through 46.30.040 at the time of new
9 vehicle registration and when the department sends a registration
10 renewal notice.

11 (2) When the department sends a vehicle license renewal notice, it
12 shall also provide notice of the requirement for written proof of
13 meeting the financial responsibility requirements in order to renew the
14 license.

15 (3) The department shall not renew a vehicle license due for
16 renewal January 1, 2005, or after unless the applicant provides written
17 proof of meeting the financial responsibility requirements for
18 operating a motor vehicle as provided in RCW 46.30.020.

1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.16.210 and 2001 c 206 s 1 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 (1) Upon receipt of the application and proper fee for original
4 vehicle license, the director shall make a recheck of the application
5 and in the event that there is any error in the application it may be
6 returned to the county auditor or other agent to effectively secure the
7 correction of such error, who shall return the same corrected to the
8 director.

9 (2) Application for the renewal of a vehicle license shall be made
10 to the director or his agents, including county auditors, by the
11 registered owner on a form prescribed by the director. The application
12 must be accompanied by the payment of such license fees and excise tax
13 as may be required by law. Such application shall be handled in the
14 same manner and the fees transmitted to the state treasurer in the same
15 manner as in the case of an original application. Any such application
16 which upon validation becomes a renewal certificate need not have
17 entered upon it the name of the lien holder, if any, of the vehicle
18 concerned.

19 (3) Persons expecting to be out of the state during the normal
20 renewal period of a vehicle license may secure renewal of such vehicle
21 license and have license plates or tabs preissued by making application
22 to the director or his agents upon forms prescribed by the director.
23 The application must be accompanied by such license fees, and excise
24 tax as may be required by law.

25 (4) Every applicant for renewal of a vehicle license due for
26 renewal January 1, 2005, or after shall provide current proof of
27 financial responsibility to operate a vehicle as required in RCW
28 46.30.020. The department may adopt rules regarding valid proof of
29 financial responsibility for persons renewing a vehicle license. The
30 department shall reimburse its agents, including county auditors, for
31 the mailing costs of returning license renewal applications that are
32 submitted without proof of financial responsibility.

33 (5) Application for the annual renewal of a vehicle license number
34 plate to the director or the director's agents shall not be required
35 for those vehicles owned, rented, or leased by the state of Washington,
36 or by any county, city, town, school district, or other political
37 subdivision of the state of Washington or a governing body of an Indian

1 tribe located within this state and recognized as a governmental entity
2 by the United States department of the interior.

3 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.30.040 and 1991 sp.s. c 25 s 2 are each amended to
4 read as follows:

5 Any person who knowingly provides false evidence of financial
6 responsibility to a law enforcement officer (~~(or)~~) to a court, or to
7 the department of licensing on an application for renewal of a vehicle
8 license, including an expired or canceled insurance policy, bond, or
9 certificate of deposit is guilty of a misdemeanor.

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
