- 1 AN ACT Relating to animal cruelty; amending RCW 16.52.205 and
- 2 16.52.207; adding a new section to chapter 77.12 RCW; and prescribing
- 3 penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 16.52.205 and 1994 c 261 s 8 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) A person is guilty of animal cruelty in the first degree when,
- 8 except as authorized in law, he or she intentionally (a) inflicts
- 9 substantial pain on, (b) causes physical injury to, or (c) kills an
- 10 animal by a means causing undue suffering, or forces a minor to inflict
- 11 unnecessary pain, injury, or death on an animal. Use of a hook in a
- 12 manner that the hook actually pierces the flesh of a bird or mammal
- 13 constitutes animal cruelty in the first degree.
- 14 (2) Animal cruelty in the first degree is a class C felony.
- 15 **Sec. 2.** RCW 16.52.207 and 1994 c 261 s 9 are each amended to read
- 16 as follows:
- 17 (1) A person is guilty of animal cruelty in the second degree if,
- 18 under circumstances not amounting to first degree animal cruelty, the

- person knowingly, recklessly, or with criminal negligence inflicts unnecessary suffering or pain upon an animal. A person is quilty of animal cruelty in the second degree if the person uses a hook in a manner that the hook could reasonably be foreseen to pierce the flesh of a bird or mammal.
 - (2) An owner of an animal is guilty of animal cruelty in the second degree if, under circumstances not amounting to first degree animal cruelty, the owner knowingly, recklessly, or with criminal negligence:
 - (a) Fails to provide the animal with necessary food, water, shelter, rest, sanitation, ventilation, space, or medical attention and the animal suffers unnecessary or unjustifiable physical pain as a result of the failure; or
- 12 result of the failure; or 13 (b) Abandons the animal.

- 14 (3) Animal cruelty in the second degree is a misdemeanor.
- 15 (4) In any prosecution of animal cruelty in the second degree, it 16 shall be an affirmative defense, if established by the defendant by a 17 preponderance of the evidence, that the defendant's failure was due to 18 economic distress beyond the defendant's control.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 77.12 RCW 20 to read as follows:
- 21 Fish and wildlife officers must enforce the provisions of RCW 22 16.52.205 and 16.52.207.
