10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 902.** Allotments for appropriations in this act
11 shall be provided in accordance with the capital project review
12 requirements adopted by the office of financial management. The office

14 capital budget committee and the senate ways and means committee of
15 allotment releases based on review by the office of financial
16 management. No expenditure may be incurred or obligation entered into

11 of funds. The intent of the requirement imposed by this section is to
12 eliminate duplication and reduce total office space requirements where
13 feasible, while ensuring proper service to the public.

14 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 915.** (1) The governor, through the office of
15 financial management, may authorize a transfer of appropriation
16 authority provided for a capital project that is in excess of the
17 amount required for the completion of such project to another capital
18 project for which the appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer
19 may be used to expand the capacity of any facility beyond that intended
20 by the legislature in making the appropriation. Such transfers may be
21 effected only between capital appropriations to a specific department,
22 commission, agency, or institution of higher education and only between
23 capital projects that are funded from the same fund or account. No
24 transfers may occur between projects to local government agencies
25 except where the grants are provided within a single omnibus
26 appropriation and where such transfers are specifically authorized by
27 the implementing statutes that govern the grants.

28 (2) For purposes of this section, the governor may find that an
29 amount is in excess of the amount required for the completion of a
30 project only if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget
31 document is substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or
32 (b) bids have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial
33 certainty that the project as defined in the notes to the budget
34 document can be completed within the biennium for less than the amount
35 appropriated in this act.

1 (3) For the purposes of this section, the legislature intends that
2 each project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the
3 governor's budget document, unless it clearly appears from the
4 legislative history that the legislature intended to define the scope
5 of a project in a different way.

6 (4) Transfers of funds to an agency's infrastructure savings
7 appropriation are subject to review and approval by the office of
8 financial management. Expenditures from an infrastructure savings
9 appropriation are limited to projects that have a primary purpose to
10 correct infrastructure deficiencies or conditions that: (a) Adversely
11 affect the ability to utilize the infrastructure for its current
12 programmatic use; (b) reduce the life expectancy of the infrastructure;
13 or (c) increase the operating costs of the infrastructure for its
14 current programmatic use. Eligible infrastructure projects may include
15 structures and surface improvements, site amenities, utility systems
16 outside building footprints and natural environmental changes or
17 requirements as part of an environmental regulation, a declaration of
18 emergency for an infrastructure issue in conformance with RCW
19 43.88.250, or infrastructure planning as part of a facility master
20 plan.

21 (5) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except
22 emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed with
23 the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of
24 representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty
25 days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of financial
26 management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers within
27 thirty days from the date of transfer.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 916.** NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS.

29 Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the
30 state building construction account may be transferred to the state
31 taxable building construction account as deemed necessary by the state
32 finance committee to comply with the federal internal revenue service
33 rules and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond
34 proceeds. The state treasurer shall submit written notification to the
35 director of financial management if it is determined that a shift of
36 appropriation authority from the state building construction account to
37 the state taxable building construction account is necessary.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 917.** The office of financial management, in
2 consultation with the department of general administration, shall
3 identify capital projects that may benefit from an energy analysis to
4 determine whether there are alternate, more economical, and energy
5 efficient means of completing the work. The office of financial
6 management shall hold appropriations in allotment reserve on the
7 following types of capital projects until this analysis can be
8 completed: Heating, ventilation, and air conditioning modifications,
9 chiller plants, steam plants, boilers, chilled water or steam lines,
10 building control systems, lighting improvements, or other major energy
11 using systems that may warrant additional analysis. Agencies receiving
12 appropriations for such projects are encouraged to utilize energy
13 performance contracts or alternative financing for equipment in lieu of
14 state appropriated funds. The office of financial management may
15 transfer funds remaining in allotment reserve to infrastructure savings
16 projects within the agency that has realized savings from energy
17 efficiency alternatives.

18 **Sec. 918.** RCW 43.135.045 and 2002 c 33 s 2 are each amended to
19 read as follows:

20 (1) The emergency reserve fund is established in the state
21 treasury. During each fiscal year, the state treasurer shall deposit
22 in the emergency reserve fund all general fund--state revenues in
23 excess of the state expenditure limit for that fiscal year. Deposits
24 shall be made at the end of each fiscal quarter based on projections of
25 state revenues and the state expenditure limit. The treasurer shall
26 make transfers between these accounts as necessary to reconcile actual
27 annual revenues and the expenditure limit for fiscal year 2000 and
28 thereafter.

29 (2) The legislature may appropriate moneys from the emergency
30 reserve fund only with approval of at least two-thirds of the members
31 of each house of the legislature, and then only if the appropriation
32 does not cause total expenditures to exceed the state expenditure limit
33 under this chapter. However, during the 2001-2003 biennium, the
34 legislature may transfer moneys from the emergency reserve fund to the
35 general fund only with approval of a majority of the members of each
36 house of the legislature, and then only if the appropriation does not

1 cause total expenditures to exceed the state expenditure limit under
2 this chapter.

3 (3) The emergency reserve fund balance shall not exceed five
4 percent of annual general fund--state revenues as projected by the
5 official state revenue forecast. Any balance in excess of five percent
6 shall be transferred on a quarterly basis by the state treasurer as
7 follows: Seventy-five percent to the student achievement fund hereby
8 created in the state treasury and twenty-five percent to the general
9 fund balance. The treasurer shall make transfers between these
10 accounts as necessary to reconcile actual annual revenues for fiscal
11 year 2000 and thereafter. When per-student state funding for the
12 maintenance and operation of K-12 education meets a level of no less
13 than ninety percent of the national average of total funding from all
14 sources per student as determined by the most recent published data
15 from the national center for education statistics of the United States

21 (4) The education construction fund is hereby created in the state
22 treasury.

23 (a) Funds may be appropriated from the education construction fund
24 exclusively for common school construction or higher education
25 construction. During the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2003, and
26 ending June 30, 2005, funds may also be used for higher education
27 facilities preservation and maintenance.

28 (b) Funds may be appropriated for any other purpose only if
29 approved by a two-thirds vote of each house of the legislature and if
30 approved by a vote of the people at the next general election. An
31 appropriation approved by the people under this subsection shall result
32 in an adjustment to the state expenditure limit only for the fiscal
33 period for which the appropriation is made and shall not affect any

35 (5) Funds from the student achievement fund shall be appropriated

6 thirty-five million dollars each fiscal year. Within thirty days
7 following any fiscal year in which earnings transferred to the
8 multimodal transportation account under this subsection did not total
9 thirty-five million dollars, the state treasurer shall transfer from
10 the emergency reserve fund an amount necessary to bring the total
11 deposited in the multimodal transportation account under this
12 subsection to thirty-five million dollars. The revenues to the

14 ongoing support for the transportation programs of the state. However,
15 it is the intent of the legislature that any new long-term financial

19 purposes to which they were previously dedicated.

20 **Sec. 919.** RCW 43.135.045 and 2001 c 3 s 9, 2000 2nd sp.s. c 5 s 1,
21 and 2000 2nd sp.s. c 2 s 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as
22 follows:

23 (1) The emergency reserve fund is established in the state
24 treasury. During each fiscal year, the state treasurer shall deposit
25 in the emergency reserve fund all general fund--state revenues in
26 excess of the state expenditure limit for that fiscal year. Deposits
27 shall be made at the end of each fiscal quarter based on projections of
28 state revenues and the state expenditure limit. The treasurer shall
29 make transfers between these accounts as necessary to reconcile actual
30 annual revenues and the expenditure limit for fiscal year 2000 and
31 thereafter.

32 (2) The legislature may appropriate moneys from the emergency
33 reserve fund only with approval of at least two-thirds of the members

18 **Sec. 920.** RCW 46.09.170 and 1995 c 166 s 9 are each amended to
19 read as follows:

20 (1) From time to time, but at least once each year, the state
21 treasurer shall refund from the motor vehicle fund one percent of the
22 motor vehicle fuel tax revenues collected under chapter 82.36 RCW,
23 based on the tax rate in effect January 1, 1990, less proper deductions
24 for refunds and costs of collection as provided in RCW 46.68.090. The
25 treasurer shall place these funds in the general fund as follows:

26 (a) Forty percent shall be credited to the ORV and nonhighway
27 vehicle account and administered by the department of natural resources
28 solely for planning, maintenance, and management of ORV recreation
29 facilities, nonhighway roads, and nonhighway road recreation
30 facilities. The funds under this subsection shall be expended in
31 accordance with the following limitations:

32 (i) Not more than five percent may be expended for information
33 programs under this chapter;

34 (ii) Not less than ten percent and not more than fifty percent may
35 be expended for ORV recreation facilities;

36 (iii) Not more than twenty-five percent may be expended for
37 maintenance of nonhighway roads;

1 (iv) Not more than fifty percent may be expended for nonhighway

3 (v) Ten percent shall be transferred to the interagency committee

9 (b) Three and one-half percent shall be credited to the ORV and
10 nonhighway vehicle account and administered by the department of fish
11 and wildlife solely for the acquisition, planning, development,
12 maintenance, and management of nonhighway roads and recreation
13 facilities;

14 (c) Two percent shall be credited to the ORV and nonhighway vehicle
15 account and administered by the parks and recreation commission solely
16 for the maintenance and management of ORV use areas and facilities; and

17 (d) Fifty-four and one-half percent, together with the funds
18 received by the interagency committee for outdoor recreation under RCW
19 46.09.110, shall be credited to the nonhighway and off-road vehicle

24 During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004, a portion of these funds

28 and upgrade trails and trail-related facilities for both motorized and
29 nonmotorized uses, and for other activities identified in this section.
30 The funds under this subsection shall be expended in accordance with
31 the following limitations, except that during the fiscal year ending
32 June 30, 2004, funds appropriated to the committee from motor vehicle
33 fuel tax revenues for the activities in (d)(ii) and (iii) of this
34 subsection shall be reduced by the amounts appropriated to the
35 department of natural resources and the state parks and recreation
36 commission as provided in this subsection:

37 (i) Not more than twenty percent may be expended for ORV education,
38 information, and law enforcement programs under this chapter;

1 (ii) Not less than an amount equal to the funds received by the
2 interagency committee for outdoor recreation under RCW 46.09.110 and
3 not more than sixty percent may be expended for ORV recreation
4 facilities;

5 (iii) Not more than twenty percent may be expended for nonhighway
6 road recreation facilities.

7 (2) On a yearly basis an agency may not, except as provided in RCW
8 46.09.110, expend more than ten percent of the funds it receives under
9 this chapter for general administration expenses incurred in carrying
10 out this chapter.

11 **Sec. 921.** RCW 43.88.032 and 1997 c 96 s 5 are each amended to read
12 as follows:

13 (1) Normal maintenance costs, except for funds appropriated for
14 facility preservation of state institutions of higher education, shall
15 be programmed in the operating budget rather than in the capital
16 budget.

17 (2) All debt-financed pass-through money to local governments shall
18 be programmed and separately identified in the budget document.

19 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 922.** The University of Washington shall develop
20 a ten year program for the eventual relocation of the residents of the
21 floating homes located at 1409 NE Boat street. After meeting and
22 negotiating with the affected residents, the University of Washington
23 shall develop a report to the legislature. The report, giving the
24 various options for achieving relocation, shall be submitted no later
25 than January 15, 2004, to the senate ways and means committee and the
26 house of representatives capital budget committee. Relocation may
27 include the purchase and rental back of existing homes through reverse
28 declining purchase agreements, the physical relocation of the floating
29 homes to other locations, the creation of a buy-back fund, the
30 relocation of residents in concert with the purchase of the existing
31 residences, or other creative real estate transactions that achieve the
32 relocation of the existing residents or floating homes.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 923.** (1) The joint legislative audit and review
34 committee shall conduct a performance audit of state capital planning,
35 design, and construction processes. In conducting this study, the

1 committee shall select a sample of major capital projects from the
2 1995-97 through the 2003-05 biennia in higher education, corrections,
3 social and health services, and other state agencies. Capital projects
4 selected for this sample shall accommodate regional differences within
5 the state. The committee shall consider the following topics in
6 conducting this performance audit:

7 (a) Agency development, evaluation, and justification of the cost
8 drivers and cost elements associated with each of the major phases of
9 a capital project: General or master planning, predesign, design,
10 construction, and postconstruction review;

11 (b) Evaluation of the management and fiscal controls surrounding
12 agency capital project decision making and implementation processes,
13 such as policy goals, planning procedures, budget limits, cost and
14 performance standards, criteria for selecting project priorities,
15 written instructions, review processes, as well as management,
16 oversight, reporting, and accountability systems;

17 (c) Processes and standards for cost-effective and efficient design
18 and construction contracting, management, oversight, and review;

19 (d) Assignment of agency staff and administrative costs to major
20 capital construction projects and the relationship of such agency costs
21 to project delivery;

22 (e) Extent of the practice of including equipment as part of the
23 basic capital project costs, and how equipment costs are estimated and
24 evaluated for inclusion in projects; and

25 (f) Comparison of costs to public and private sector benchmarks,
26 when available and where appropriate, in establishing cost parameters
27 for state capital construction projects.

28 (2) To the extent resources permit, the audit shall include a
29 review of public works projects utilizing the general
30 contractor/construction manager procedure. This may include: An
31 inventory of the state agencies and local jurisdictions that have used
32 the general contractor/construction manager procedure, including the
33 number, size, type, and cost of public works projects built or being
34 built using the procedure; an examination of the ways the general
35 contractor/construction manager procedure may affect public benefits
36 and costs associated with public works projects; and, if feasible,
37 based on a sample of public works projects built after June 9, 1994, an

1 analysis of the costs and benefits of using the general
2 contractor/construction manager procedure as opposed to other public
3 works contracting procedures.

4 (3) State agencies, including state public higher education
5 institutions, shall provide any requested information concerning the
6 planning, selection, design, contracting, implementation, management,
7 costs, performance, and outcomes of projects to the joint legislative
8 audit and review committee in a timely manner, including relevant
9 proprietary information that may be associated with individual firms.
10 However, any proprietary information provided to the committee for this
11 performance audit shall be deemed confidential and shall not be subject
12 to public disclosure.

13 (4) In conducting this performance audit, the committee shall work
14 closely with the appropriate legislative fiscal committees and shall
15 consult with the office of financial management, the department of
16 general administration, the department of corrections, the department
17 of social and health services, the higher education coordinating board,
18 the state board for community and technical colleges, individual higher
19 education institutions, and other agencies as appropriate. The
20 committee may contract for consulting services in conducting this
21 performance audit. In its final report, the committee shall make
22 recommendations as appropriate. The committee shall provide a progress
23 report to the appropriate legislative committees by January 9, 2004,
24 and a final report by January 8, 2005.

25 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 924.** The joint legislative audit and review
26 committee, in collaboration with the legislative evaluation and
27 accountability program, shall accomplish the following higher education
28 comparable framework tasks and projects during the 2003-05 biennium:

- 29 (1) Fill in comparable framework gaps related to infrastructure.
 - 30 (a) Develop inventory and condition protocols/standards;
 - 31 (b) Develop infrastructure cost factors;
 - 32 (c) Facilitate institution data collection and reporting;
 - 33 (d) Field-verify data on a sample basis;
 - 34 (e) Develop translation protocols;
 - 35 (f) Translate data and populate comparable framework.
- 36 (2) Explore the feasibility of including dates of renewal and
37 replacement of major building systems in the comparable framework.

- 1 (a) Develop protocols/standards;
- 2 (b) Facilitate institution data collection and reporting;
- 3 (c) Field-verify data on a sample basis;
- 4 (d) Develop translation protocols;
- 5 (e) Translate data and populate comparable framework.
- 6 (3) Explore how the comparable framework could be expanded to
- 7 facility modernization.
- 8 (a) Analyze the feasibility of and approaches to quantifying
- 9 modernization backlogs across institutions;
- 10 (b) Describe current modernization rating processes used by
- 11 individual institutions including how they fit into master plans,
- 12 program delivery choices, and other manifestations related to the
- 13 development of requests for capital support from the state;
- 14 (c) Explore models used in other government sectors;
- 15 (d) Assess benefits and costs of potential approaches.
- 16 (4) Explore how to integrate the comparable framework with
- 17 governmental accounting standards for accountability related to the
- 18 efficiency and effectiveness of managing public assets.
- 19 (5) Revise and update the comparable framework data base.
- 20 (a) Modify and/or develop, as needed, tables, queries, and reports;
- 21 (b) Develop reporting capabilities to share data with other
- 22 legislative agencies, the office of financial management, the higher
- 23 education coordinating board, the state board for community and
- 24 technical colleges, and state institutions of higher education.
- 25 In executing these tasks, the joint legislative audit and review
- 26 committee shall seek technical advice and input from stakeholder groups
- 27 including but not limited to the office of financial management, the
- 28 higher education coordinating board, the state board for community and
- 29 technical colleges, and the council of presidents.
- 30 As a general condition upon appropriations provided to higher
- 31 education institutions in part five of this act, higher education
- 32 institutions, the higher education coordinating board, the office of
- 33 financial management, and the state board for community and technical
- 34 colleges shall provide any requested information to the joint
- 35 legislative audit and review committee in a timely manner to enable its
- 36 completion of the above tasks and projects so assigned.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 925.** (1) In concert with a commitment to
2 increase higher education funding levels significantly above historic
3 levels in this biennium and the following two biennia for primarily
4 access-related projects, the legislature is directing a substantial
5 share of state capital resources to reduce the backlog in facility
6 preservation, focusing on the worst and most critical facilities first.
7 The first commitment is dependent on the latter. To that end and
8 through this act, the legislature begins to address findings and
9 recommendations from the higher education preservation study by the
10 joint legislative audit and review committee, report 03-1, by taking
11 the following actions:

12 (a) The 2003 legislature affirms that proactive and ongoing
13 facility maintenance, properly supported, can prevent and mitigate
14 preservation backlogs and maximize the useful life of physical assets
15 supported by, used by, and beneficial to state taxpayers. As a step
16 toward that end, the legislature appropriates in this act a portion of
17 the facilities operating and maintenance costs for building maintenance
18 traditionally appropriated in the omnibus operating budget. This is
19 done in "preventative facility maintenance and building system repairs"
20 sections for each four-year institution and the community and technical
21 college system.

22 (b) The 2003 legislature affirms the importance of reducing the
23 significant higher education preservation backlog, of instilling a
24 greater sense of stewardship regarding these important state assets,
25 and of preventing the current backlog from reoccurring. The
26 legislature recognizes that the preservation backlog took many years to
27 develop and will take several years to address. The legislature
28 intends that each higher education institution and the community and
29 technical college system stabilize and improve the average facility
30 condition index as compared to levels reported by the higher education
31 preservation study in January 2003.

32 (c) The 2003 legislature affirms the importance of continuing to
33 address these preservation issues, including developing a comparable
34 framework. Section 924 of this act (JLARC work) is intended to build
35 a foundation for capital budget policy and funding deliberations in the
36 2005-07 biennium, and beyond.

37 (2) The emphasis on higher education facility preservation
38 described in subsections (1)(a) and (b) of this section provide extra

1 resources for projects that traditionally fall into minor works
2 categories for "preservation" and "health/safety/code requirements" but
3 not to the exclusion of providing state capital funds for minor works
4 "program" and "infrastructure preservation" projects, separately
5 appropriated. The legislature intends to review infrastructure needs
6 for college and university campuses comprehensively, with the
7 assistance of the joint legislative audit and review committee, the
8 office of financial management, and stakeholder institutions and boards
9 during the interim leading up to the 2005-07 biennium. Until
10 comprehensive, comparable data is collected to inform deliberations,
11 higher education institutions may find it necessary to use local,
12 nonappropriated resources to augment 2003-05 biennial funds given the
13 legislature's intent and focus in this act on the deferred renewal
14 needs of aging college facilities. Nonappropriated resources should be
15 used to help meet preservation needs in the spirit of recommendation 3
16 from the joint legislative audit and review committee's report 03-1.

17 (3) For projects that address significant preservation needs
18 through major renovations or replacement facilities and that also
19 enhance access by maintaining or improving the usefulness of existing
20 space for important programs, the Gardner-Evans initiative may be
21 appropriate to help fund these projects.

22 (4) For the purposes of this section and sections that specifically
23 refer to this section by number, the following definitions apply unless
24 the context clearly requires otherwise:

25 (a) "Auxiliary programs" in the context of higher education means
26 those that are secondary to the missions of state institutions and,
27 being enterprise in character, draw supporting revenue from user fees
28 and charges. Examples include housing and dining; food services;
29 vehicular parking; infirmaries; hospitals; recreation and student-
30 activity centers; campus stores retailing textbooks, supplies,
31 clothing, and objects bearing institutional logos or emblems; and media
32 reproduction centers, among others.

33 (b) "Average facility condition index" means the index developed in
34 the joint legislative audit and review committee's report number 03-1.

35 (c) "Comparable framework" means methods and systems to collect,
36 crosswalk, calibrate, verify on a sample basis, and assemble facilities
37 information produced and maintained by institutions of higher education

1 and other state agencies into a data framework that can be used to
2 understand and budget for state and mixed facilities.

3 (d) "Educational and general programs" in the context of higher
4 education means those that support the primary missions of state
5 institutions: Student instruction, faculty research, and educational
6 public service.

7 (e) "Facility rating" is a score that reflects an individual
8 building's ability to support its current use as measured against one
9 out of five condition classes as follows:

10 (i) "One" or "superior" means a building with major systems that
11 are in extremely good condition and functioning well;

12 (ii) "Two" or "adequate" means a building with major systems in
13 good condition, functioning adequately, and within their expected life
14 cycles;

15 (iii) "Three" or "fair" means a building with some older major
16 systems that, though still functional, are approaching the end of their
17 expected life cycles;

18 (iv) "Four" or "limited functionality" means a building with some
19 major systems that are in poor condition, exceed expected life cycles,
20 and require immediate attention to prevent or mitigate impacts on
21 function;

22 (v) "Five" or "marginal functionality" means a building with some
23 major systems that are failing and significantly restrict continued use
24 of the building.

25 (f) "Gardner-Evans initiative" means the bonds authorized in
26 chapter . . . (Substitute Senate Bill No. 5908), Laws of 2003.

27 (g) "Major building system" refers to foundations, building
28 structure, roofs, interior construction and finishes, heating,
29 ventilation, and air conditioning systems, electrical systems,
30 plumbing, and other components necessary for safe and normal plant
31 operation.

32 (h) "Mixed facilities" in the context of higher education means a
33 state-owned building structure where education and general and
34 auxiliary programs are jointly housed, and includes infrastructure
35 necessary for safe and normal operations by its occupants.

36 (i) "Preservation" means routine and preventive inspection,
37 mechanical adjustments, and minor work to replace or repair systems,

1 surfaces, or materials undertaken to maintain a building and its
2 existing, internal infrastructure for current use by current occupants.

3 (j) "State facilities" in the context of higher education means a
4 state-owned building structure exclusively housing educational and
5 general programs, and includes infrastructure necessary for safe and
6 normal operation by its occupants.

7 (k) "Stewardship" means the collective action undertaken with
8 appropriated and nonappropriated funds by institutional authorities to
9 keep facilities in safe and functional condition for occupants, without
10 deterioration for lack of attention or resources, that optimize the
11 useful life of installed building systems and material construction,
12 given advancing age.

13 **Sec. 926.** RCW 42.17.310 and 2002 c 335 s 1, 2002 c 224 s 2, 2002
14 c 205 s 4, and 2002 c 172 s 1 are each reenacted and amended to read as
15 follows:

16 (1) The following are exempt from public inspection and copying:

17 (a) Personal information in any files maintained for students in
18 public schools, patients or clients of public institutions or public
19 health agencies, or welfare recipients.

20 (b) Personal information in files maintained for employees,
21 appointees, or elected officials of any public agency to the extent
22 that disclosure would violate their right to privacy.

23 (c) Information required of any taxpayer in connection with the
24 assessment or collection of any tax if the disclosure of the
25 information to other persons would (i) be prohibited to such persons by
26 RCW 84.08.210, 82.32.330, 84.40.020, or 84.40.340 or (ii) violate the
27 taxpayer's right to privacy or result in unfair competitive
28 disadvantage to the taxpayer.

29 (d) Specific intelligence information and specific investigative
30 records compiled by investigative, law enforcement, and penology
31 agencies, and state agencies vested with the responsibility to
32 discipline members of any profession, the nondisclosure of which is
33 essential to effective law enforcement or for the protection of any
34 person's right to privacy.

35 (e) Information revealing the identity of persons who are witnesses
36 to or victims of crime or who file complaints with investigative, law
37 enforcement, or penology agencies, other than the public disclosure

1 commission, if disclosure would endanger any person's life, physical
2 safety, or property. If at the time a complaint is filed the
3 complainant, victim or witness indicates a desire for disclosure or
4 nondisclosure, such desire shall govern. However, all complaints filed
5 with the public disclosure commission about any elected official or
6 candidate for public office must be made in writing and signed by the
7 complainant under oath.

8 (f) Test questions, scoring keys, and other examination data used
9 to administer a license, employment, or academic examination.

10 (g) Except as provided by chapter 8.26 RCW, the contents of real
11 estate appraisals, made for or by any agency relative to the
12 acquisition or sale of property, until the project or prospective sale
13 is abandoned or until such time as all of the property has been
14 acquired or the property to which the sale appraisal relates is sold,
15 but in no event shall disclosure be denied for more than three years
16 after the appraisal.

17 (h) Valuable formulae, designs, drawings, computer source code or
18 object code, and research data obtained by any agency within five years
19 of the request for disclosure when disclosure would produce private
20 gain and public loss.

21 (i) Preliminary drafts, notes, recommendations, and intra-agency
22 memorandums in which opinions are expressed or policies formulated or
23 recommended except that a specific record shall not be exempt when
24 publicly cited by an agency in connection with any agency action.

25 (j) Records which are relevant to a controversy to which an agency
26 is a party but which records would not be available to another party
27 under the rules of pretrial discovery for causes pending in the
28 superior courts.

29 (k) Records, maps, or other information identifying the location of
30 archaeological sites in order to avoid the looting or depredation of
31 such sites.

32 (l) Any library record, the primary purpose of which is to maintain
33 control of library materials, or to gain access to information, which
34 discloses or could be used to disclose the identity of a library user.

35 (m) Financial information supplied by or on behalf of a person,
36 firm, or corporation for the purpose of qualifying to submit a bid or
37 proposal for (i) a ferry system construction or repair contract as

1 required by RCW 47.60.680 through 47.60.750 or (ii) highway
2 construction or improvement as required by RCW 47.28.070.

3 (n) Railroad company contracts filed prior to July 28, 1991, with
4 the utilities and transportation commission under RCW 81.34.070, except
5 that the summaries of the contracts are open to public inspection and
6 copying as otherwise provided by this chapter.

7 (o) Financial and commercial information and records supplied by
8 private persons pertaining to export services provided pursuant to
9 chapter 43.163 RCW and chapter 53.31 RCW, and by persons pertaining to
10 export projects pursuant to RCW 43.23.035.

11 (p) Financial disclosures filed by private vocational schools under
12 chapters 28B.85 and 28C.10 RCW.

13 (q) Records filed with the utilities and transportation commission
14 or attorney general under RCW 80.04.095 that a court has determined are
15 confidential under RCW 80.04.095.

16 (r) Financial and commercial information and records supplied by
17 businesses or individuals during application for loans or program
18 services provided by chapters 43.163, 43.160, 43.330, and 43.168 RCW,
19 or during application for economic development loans or program
20 services provided by any local agency.

21 (s) Membership lists or lists of members or owners of interests of
22 units in timeshare projects, subdivisions, camping resorts,
23 condominiums, land developments, or common-interest communities
24 affiliated with such projects, regulated by the department of
25 licensing, in the files or possession of the department.

26 (t) All applications for public employment, including the names of
27 applicants, resumes, and other related materials submitted with respect
28 to an applicant.

29 (u) The residential addresses or residential telephone numbers of
30 employees or volunteers of a public agency which are held by any public
31 agency in personnel records, public employment related records, or
32 volunteer rosters, or are included in any mailing list of employees or
33 volunteers of any public agency.

34 (v) The residential addresses and residential telephone numbers of
35 the customers of a public utility contained in the records or lists
36 held by the public utility of which they are customers, except that
37 this information may be released to the division of child support or

1 the agency or firm providing child support enforcement for another
2 state under Title IV-D of the federal social security act, for the
3 establishment, enforcement, or modification of a support order.

4 (w)(i) The federal social security number of individuals governed
5 under chapter 18.130 RCW maintained in the files of the department of
6 health, except this exemption does not apply to requests made directly
7 to the department from federal, state, and local agencies of
8 government, and national and state licensing, credentialing,
9 investigatory, disciplinary, and examination organizations; (ii) the
10 current residential address and current residential telephone number of
11 a health care provider governed under chapter 18.130 RCW maintained in
12 the files of the department, if the provider requests that this
13 information be withheld from public inspection and copying, and
14 provides to the department an accurate alternate or business address
15 and business telephone number. On or after January 1, 1995, the
16 current residential address and residential telephone number of a
17 health care provider governed under RCW 18.130.040 maintained in the
18 files of the department shall automatically be withheld from public
19 inspection and copying unless the provider specifically requests the
20 information be released, and except as provided for under RCW
21 42.17.260(9).

22 (x) Information obtained by the board of pharmacy as provided in
23 RCW 69.45.090.

24 (y) Information obtained by the board of pharmacy or the department
25 of health and its representatives as provided in RCW 69.41.044,
26 69.41.280, and 18.64.420.

27 (z) Financial information, business plans, examination reports, and
28 any information produced or obtained in evaluating or examining a
29 business and industrial development corporation organized or seeking
30 certification under chapter 31.24 RCW.

31 (aa) Financial and commercial information supplied to the state
32 investment board by any person when the information relates to the
33 investment of public trust or retirement funds and when disclosure
34 would result in loss to such funds or in private loss to the providers
35 of this information.

36 (bb) Financial and valuable trade information under RCW 51.36.120.

37 (cc) Client records maintained by an agency that is a domestic

1 violence program as defined in RCW 70.123.020 or 70.123.075 or a rape
2 crisis center as defined in RCW 70.125.030.

3 (dd) Information that identifies a person who, while an agency
4 employee: (i) Seeks advice, under an informal process established by
5 the employing agency, in order to ascertain his or her rights in
6 connection with a possible unfair practice under chapter 49.60 RCW
7 against the person; and (ii) requests his or her identity or any
8 identifying information not be disclosed.

9 (ee) Investigative records compiled by an employing agency
10 conducting a current investigation of a possible unfair practice under
11 chapter 49.60 RCW or of a possible violation of other federal, state,
12 or local laws prohibiting discrimination in employment.

13 (ff) Business related information protected from public inspection
14 and copying under RCW 15.86.110.

15 (gg) Financial, commercial, operations, and technical and research
16 information and data submitted to or obtained by the clean Washington
17 center in applications for, or delivery of, program services under
18 chapter 70.95H RCW.

19 (hh) Information and documents created specifically for, and
20 collected and maintained by a quality improvement committee pursuant to
21 RCW 43.70.510 or 70.41.200, or by a peer review committee under RCW
22 4.24.250, regardless of which agency is in possession of the
23 information and documents.

24 (ii) Personal information in files maintained in a data base
25 created under RCW 43.07.360.

26 (jj) Financial and commercial information requested by the public
27 stadium authority from any person or organization that leases or uses
28 the stadium and exhibition center as defined in RCW 36.102.010.

29 (kk) Names of individuals residing in emergency or transitional
30 housing that are furnished to the department of revenue or a county
31 assessor in order to substantiate a claim for property tax exemption
32 under RCW 84.36.043.

33 (ll) The names, residential addresses, residential telephone
34 numbers, and other individually identifiable records held by an agency
35 in relation to a vanpool, carpool, or other ride-sharing program or
36 service. However, these records may be disclosed to other persons who
37 apply for ride-matching services and who need that information in order
38 to identify potential riders or drivers with whom to share rides.

1 (mm) The personally identifying information of current or former
2 participants or applicants in a paratransit or other transit service
3 operated for the benefit of persons with disabilities or elderly
4 persons.

5 (nn) The personally identifying information of persons who acquire
6 and use transit passes and other fare payment media including, but not
7 limited to, stored value smart cards and magnetic strip cards, except
8 that an agency may disclose this information to a person, employer,
9 educational institution, or other entity that is responsible, in whole
10 or in part, for payment of the cost of acquiring or using a transit
11 pass or other fare payment media, or to the news media when reporting
12 on public transportation or public safety. This information may also
13 be disclosed at the agency's discretion to governmental agencies or
14 groups concerned with public transportation or public safety.

15 (oo) Proprietary financial and commercial information that the
16 submitting entity, with review by the department of health,
17 specifically identifies at the time it is submitted and that is
18 provided to or obtained by the department of health in connection with
19 an application for, or the supervision of, an antitrust exemption
20 sought by the submitting entity under RCW 43.72.310. If a request for
21 such information is received, the submitting entity must be notified of
22 the request. Within ten business days of receipt of the notice, the
23 submitting entity shall provide a written statement of the continuing
24 need for confidentiality, which shall be provided to the requester.
25 Upon receipt of such notice, the department of health shall continue to
26 treat information designated under this section as exempt from
27 disclosure. If the requester initiates an action to compel disclosure
28 under this chapter, the submitting entity must be joined as a party to
29 demonstrate the continuing need for confidentiality.

30 (pp) Records maintained by the board of industrial insurance
31 appeals that are related to appeals of crime victims' compensation
32 claims filed with the board under RCW 7.68.110.

33 (qq) Financial and commercial information supplied by or on behalf
34 of a person, firm, corporation, or entity under chapter 28B.95 RCW
35 relating to the purchase or sale of tuition units and contracts for the
36 purchase of multiple tuition units.

37 (rr) Any records of investigative reports prepared by any state,
38 county, municipal, or other law enforcement agency pertaining to sex

1 offenses contained in chapter 9A.44 RCW or sexually violent offenses as
2 defined in RCW 71.09.020, which have been transferred to the Washington
3 association of sheriffs and police chiefs for permanent electronic
4 retention and retrieval pursuant to RCW 40.14.070(2)(b).

5 (ss) Credit card numbers, debit card numbers, electronic check
6 numbers, card expiration dates, or bank or other financial account
7 numbers supplied to an agency for the purpose of electronic transfer of
8 funds, except when disclosure is expressly required by law.

9 (tt) Financial information, including but not limited to account
10 numbers and values, and other identification numbers supplied by or on
11 behalf of a person, firm, corporation, limited liability company,
12 partnership, or other entity related to an application for a liquor
13 license, gambling license, or lottery retail license.

14 (uu) Records maintained by the employment security department and
15 subject to chapter 50.13 RCW if provided to another individual or
16 organization for operational, research, or evaluation purposes.

17 (vv) Individually identifiable information received by the work
18 force training and education coordinating board for research or
19 evaluation purposes.

20 (ww) Those portions of records assembled, prepared, or maintained
21 to prevent, mitigate, or respond to criminal terrorist acts, which are
22 acts that significantly disrupt the conduct of government or of the
23 general civilian population of the state or the United States and that
24 manifest an extreme indifference to human life, the public disclosure
25 of which would have a substantial likelihood of threatening public
26 safety, consisting of:

27 (i) Specific and unique vulnerability assessments or specific and
28 unique response or deployment plans, including compiled underlying data
29 collected in preparation of or essential to the assessments, or to the
30 response or deployment plans; and

31 (ii) Records not subject to public disclosure under federal law
32 that are shared by federal or international agencies, and information
33 prepared from national security briefings provided to state or local
34 government officials related to domestic preparedness for acts of
35 terrorism.

36 (xx) Commercial fishing catch data from logbooks required to be
37 provided to the department of fish and wildlife under RCW 77.12.047,
38 when the data identifies specific catch location, timing, or

1 methodology and the release of which would result in unfair competitive
2 disadvantage to the commercial fisher providing the catch data.
3 However, this information may be released to government agencies
4 concerned with the management of fish and wildlife resources.

5 (yy) Sensitive wildlife data obtained by the department of fish and
6 wildlife. However, sensitive wildlife data may be released to
7 government agencies concerned with the management of fish and wildlife
8 resources. Sensitive wildlife data includes:

9 (i) The nesting sites or specific locations of endangered species
10 designated under RCW 77.12.020, or threatened or sensitive species
11 classified by rule of the department of fish and wildlife;

12 (ii) Radio frequencies used in, or locational data generated by,
13 telemetry studies; or

14 (iii) Other location data that could compromise the viability of a
15 specific fish or wildlife population, and where at least one of the
16 following criteria are met:

- 17 (A) The species has a known commercial or black market value;
- 18 (B) There is a history of malicious take of that species; or
- 19 (C) There is a known demand to visit, take, or disturb, and the
20 species behavior or ecology renders it especially vulnerable or the
21 species has an extremely limited distribution and concentration.

22 (zz) The personally identifying information of persons who acquire
23 recreational licenses under RCW 77.32.010 or commercial licenses under
24 chapter 77.65 or 77.70 RCW, except name, address of contact used by the
25 department, and type of license, endorsement, or tag. However, the
26 department of fish and wildlife may disclose personally identifying
27 information to:

28 (i) Government agencies concerned with the management of fish and
29 wildlife resources;

30 (ii) The department of social and health services, child support
31 division, and to the department of licensing in order to implement RCW
32 77.32.014 and 46.20.291; and

33 (iii) Law enforcement agencies for the purpose of firearm
34 possession enforcement under RCW 9.41.040.

35 (aaa)(i) Discharge papers of a veteran of the armed forces of the
36 United States filed at the office of the county auditor before July 1,
37 2002, that have not been commingled with other recorded documents.
38 These records will be available only to the veteran, the veteran's next

1 of kin, a deceased veteran's properly appointed personal representative
2 or executor, a person holding that veteran's general power of attorney,
3 or to anyone else designated in writing by that veteran to receive the
4 records.

5 (ii) Discharge papers of a veteran of the armed forces of the
6 United States filed at the office of the county auditor before July 1,
7 2002, that have been commingled with other records, if the veteran has
8 recorded a "request for exemption from public disclosure of discharge
9 papers" with the county auditor. If such a request has been recorded,
10 these records may be released only to the veteran filing the papers,
11 the veteran's next of kin, a deceased veteran's properly appointed
12 personal representative or executor, a person holding the veteran's
13 general power of attorney, or anyone else designated in writing by the
14 veteran to receive the records.

15 (iii) Discharge papers of a veteran filed at the office of the
16 county auditor after June 30, 2002, are not public records, but will be
17 available only to the veteran, the veteran's next of kin, a deceased
18 veteran's properly appointed personal representative or executor, a
19 person holding the veteran's general power of attorney, or anyone else
20 designated in writing by the veteran to receive the records.

21 (iv) For the purposes of this subsection (1)(aaa), next of kin of
22 deceased veterans have the same rights to full access to the record.
23 Next of kin are the veteran's widow or widower who has not remarried,
24 son, daughter, father, mother, brother, and sister.

25 (bbb) Those portions of records containing specific and unique
26 vulnerability assessments or specific and unique emergency and escape
27 response plans at a city, county, or state adult or juvenile
28 correctional facility, the public disclosure of which would have a
29 substantial likelihood of threatening the security of a city, county,
30 or state adult or juvenile correctional facility or any individual's
31 safety.

32 (ccc) Information compiled by school districts or schools in the
33 development of their comprehensive safe school plans pursuant to RCW
34 28A.320.125, to the extent that they identify specific vulnerabilities
35 of school districts and each individual school.

36 (ddd) Information regarding the infrastructure and security of
37 computer and telecommunications networks, consisting of security
38 passwords, security access codes and programs, access codes for secure

1 software applications, security and service recovery plans, security
2 risk assessments, and security test results to the extent that they
3 identify specific system vulnerabilities.

4 (eee) Proprietary information deemed confidential for the purposes
5 of section 923 of this act.

6 (2) Except for information described in subsection (1)(c)(i) of
7 this section and confidential income data exempted from public
8 inspection pursuant to RCW 84.40.020, the exemptions of this section
9 are inapplicable to the extent that information, the disclosure of
10 which would violate personal privacy or vital governmental interests,
11 can be deleted from the specific records sought. No exemption may be
12 construed to permit the nondisclosure of statistical information not
13 descriptive of any readily identifiable person or persons.

14 (3) Inspection or copying of any specific records exempt under the
15 provisions of this section may be permitted if the superior court in
16 the county in which the record is maintained finds, after a hearing
17 with notice thereof to every person in interest and the agency, that
18 the exemption of such records is clearly unnecessary to protect any
19 individual's right of privacy or any vital governmental function.

20 (4) Agency responses refusing, in whole or in part, inspection of
21 any public record shall include a statement of the specific exemption
22 authorizing the withholding of the record (or part) and a brief
23 explanation of how the exemption applies to the record withheld.

24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 927. Sections 918 through 921, 926, and 929 of
25 this act expire June 30, 2005.

26 NEW SECTION. Sec. 928. A new section is added to chapter 43.63A
27 RCW to read as follows:

28 (1) The airport impact mitigation account is created in the custody
29 of the state treasury. Moneys deposited in the account, including
30 moneys received from the port of Seattle for purposes of this section,
31 may be used only for airport mitigation purposes as provided in this
32 section. Only the director of the department of community, trade, and
33 economic development or the director's designee may authorize
34 expenditures from the account. The account is subject to allotment
35 procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not
36 required for expenditures.

1 (2) The department of community, trade, and economic development
2 shall establish a competitive process to prioritize applications for
3 airport impact mitigation assistance through the account created in
4 subsection (1) of this section. The department shall conduct a
5 solicitation of project applications in the airport impact area as
6 defined in subsection (4) of this section. Eligible applicants include
7 public entities such as cities, counties, schools, parks, fire
8 districts, and shall include organizations eligible to apply for grants
9 under RCW 43.63A.125. The department of community, trade, and economic
10 development shall evaluate and rank applications in conjunction with
11 the airport impact mitigation advisory board established in subsection
12 (3) of this section using objective criteria developed by the
13 department in conjunction with the airport impact mitigation advisory
14 board. At a minimum, the criteria must consider: The extent to which
15 the applicant is impacted by the airport; and the other resources
16 available to the applicant to mitigate the impact, including other
17 mitigation funds. The director of the department of community, trade,
18 and economic development shall award grants annually to the extent
19 funds are available in the account created in subsection (1) of this
20 section.

21 (3) The director of the department of community, trade, and
22 economic development shall establish the airport impact mitigation
23 advisory board comprised of persons in the airport impact area to
24 assist the director in developing criteria and ranking applications
25 under this section. The advisory board shall include representation of
26 local governments, the public in general, businesses, schools,
27 community services organizations, parks and recreational activities,
28 and others at the discretion of the director. The advisory board shall
29 be weighted toward those communities closest to the airport that are
30 more adversely impacted by airport activities.

31 (4) The airport impact area includes the incorporated areas of
32 Burien, Normandy Park, Des Moines, SeaTac, Tukwilla, Kent, and Federal
33 Way, and the unincorporated portion of west King county.

34 (5) The department of community, trade, and economic development
35 shall report on its activities related to the account created in this
36 section by January 1, 2004, and each January 1st thereafter.

1 **Sec. 929.** RCW 79A.05.630 and 2000 c 11 s 50 are each amended to
2 read as follows:

3 (1) Lands within the Seashore Conservation Area shall not be sold,
4 leased, or otherwise disposed of, except as (~~herein~~) provided in this
5 section. The commission may, under authority granted in RCW 79A.05.175
6 and 79A.05.180, exchange state park lands in the Seashore Conservation
7 Area for lands of equal value to be managed by the commission
8 consistent with this chapter. Only state park lands lying east of the
9 Seashore Conservation Line, as it is located at the time of exchange,
10 may be so exchanged. The department of natural resources may lease the
11 lands within the Washington State Seashore Conservation Area as well as
12 the accreted lands along the ocean in state ownership for the
13 exploration and production of oil and gas(~~(~~PROVIDED, That~~)~~).
14 However, oil drilling rigs and equipment will not be placed on the
15 Seashore Conservation Area or state-owned accreted lands.

16 (2) Sale of sand from accretions shall be made to supply the needs
17 of cranberry growers for cranberry bogs in the vicinity and shall not
18 be prohibited if found by the commission to be reasonable, and not
19 generally harmful or destructive to the character of the land(~~(~~PROVIDED, That~~)~~).
20 However, the commission may grant leases and permits
21 for the removal of sands for construction purposes from any lands
22 within the Seashore Conservation Area if found by the commission to be
23 reasonable and not generally harmful or destructive to the character of

25 shall be deposited in the state parks renewal and stewardship account.

26 (3) For the 2003-05 fiscal biennium, at the request of the city of
27 Long Beach, the state parks and recreation commission shall convey to
28 the city of Long Beach all commission-owned lands lying between 5th
29 street southwest and 4th street northwest, and lying between 8th street
30 northwest and 14th street northwest, all lying between the 1889
31 ordinary high tide line (also known as the western boundary of upland
32 ownership) and the line of ordinary high tide of the Pacific ocean, and
33 all lying within sections 8 and 17, township 10 north, range 11, west,
34 W.M., Pacific county, Washington. The city of Long Beach must maintain
35 these lands for city park purposes, including open space, parks,
36 interpretive centers, or museums. The title, and any other documents
37 necessary for the transfer of these lands, will include covenants
38 ensuring that the city of Long Beach will maintain all conveyed land as

1 a city park and that if the city of Long Beach breaches these
2 covenants, ownership of all park lands conveyed under this subsection
3 reverts to the state parks and recreation commission.

4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 930. If any provision of this act or its
5 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
6 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
7 persons or circumstances is not affected.

8 NEW SECTION. Sec. 931. This act is necessary for the immediate
9 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
10 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
11 immediately, except for section 919 of this act which takes effect June
12 30, 2003.
