- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 51.28 RCW 7 to read as follows:
- - 8 Physician assistants practicing with physician supervision as
- 9 required by chapters 18.57A and 18.71A RCW may assist workers who
- 10 suffer simple industrial injuries in making application for
- 11 compensation under this title as specified in RCW 51.28.020. Physician
- 12 assistants may not rate a worker's permanent partial disability under
- 13 RCW 51.32.055, or determine a worker's entitlement to benefits under
- 14 chapter 51.32 RCW. The department shall adopt rules necessary to
- 15 implement this section, including rules identifying simple industrial
- 16 injuries using diagnosis codes and other relevant criteria.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. By December 1, 2006, the department of labor
