1 AN ACT Relating to school districts' property; and amending RCW
2 28A.335.060.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.335.060 and 1989 c 86 s 2 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 Each school district's board of directors shall deposit moneys
7 derived from the lease, rental, or occasional use of surplus school
8 property as follows:

9 (1) Moneys derived from real property shall be deposited into the
10 district's debt service fund and/or capital projects fund, except for:

11 (a) Moneys required to be expended for general maintenance,
12 utility, insurance costs, and any other costs associated with the lease
13 or rental of such property, which moneys shall be deposited in the
14 district's general fund; or

15 (b) At the option of the board of directors, after evaluating the
16 sufficiency of the school district's capital projects fund for purposes
17 of meeting demands for new construction and improvements, moneys
18 derived from the lease or rental of real property may be deposited into

1 the district's general fund to be used exclusively for nonrecurring
2 costs related to operating school facilities, including but not limited
3 to expenses for maintenance;

4 (2) Moneys derived from pupil transportation vehicles shall be
5 deposited in the district's transportation vehicle fund;

6 (3) Moneys derived from other personal property shall be deposited
7 in the district's general fund.
