HB 1936-S.E - DIGEST

(AS OF HOUSE 2ND READING 3/17/03)

Requires the house criminal justice and corrections committee
and the senate judiciary committee to study: (1) The jurisdiction
of tribal, state, and local law enforcement officers over tribal
and nontribal persons on tribal lands; and

(2) The extension of general authority peace officer powers to
tribal law enforcement officers and the effect that the extension
would have on tribal and nontribal persons, including nontribal
persons occupying land held in fee simple within the boundaries of
tribal lands.

Requires the house criminal justice and corrections committee
and the senate judiciary committee to report their findings and
recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
governor and the legislature no later than December 1, 2003.
